It doesn't happen just on television, The very newspaper you are holding in your hands will self-destruct not in five seconds but in about Now the average newspaper reader may

consider this to be an admirable thing, depending upon his opinion of the newspaper or of the news it prints. But it is distressing to scholars researching historical documents dating from around World War I and before to have those documents crumble before their eyes. It seems that the nation had another in-

formation explosion about 100 years ago and the 1880s that a new process for making paper from chemically processed wood pulp was introduced on a commercial scale.

Unfortunately the life expectancy of this wood-based paper was and is 50 years. By comparison, the rag paper in existing copies of the Butenberg Bible, printed more than 500 years ago, is in nearly perfect condition. 
