



Clay Says Reds **Have Big Police** Force In East

General Says Berlin Can Be Supplied Without Question

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21, (AP)-General Lucius Clay said today the Russians have a "Communist indoctrinated police force' of 200,000 to 300,000 in the Eastern zone of

The American commander in Germany told a news conference the force "is being enlarged every day." On the other hand, he said, there are only "very small" police forces in the American, British and French zones of Germany.

Clay made the statement in reply to questions involving a situation which both Russian and the Western Powers might withdraw from Germany. leaving control in the hands of Germans.

There has been speculation that the Russians might pull out of Eastern Germany in view of announced plans to withdraw from their occupation zone in North Korea.

In answer to another question, Clay said he had "no avidence" of troop movements in Eastern Germany that might indicate Rus-

aian preparation for war.

Clay reemphasized his faith in the political effect of the Berlin airlift and the ability of the United States Air Force and the British RAF to keep it operating. "The attempt to blockade Berlin is only an attempt," Clay asserted.






