MEANS WAR WITH MEXICO IS ANSWER

UNITED STATES HAS STOOD GREASER INSULTS LONG ENOUGH

Washington, June 20.—That war will result with Mexico is certain according to the authorities that have been keeping in touch with international affairs. The insolent notes conveyed to the American commanders of the punitive expeditions into Mexico mean nothing less than a declaration of war upon the United States and the United States will undoubtedly take it at the face value and invade Mexico. Virtually the entire mobile strength of the National Guard of all the states and the District of Columbia was ordered mobilized under the Federal service last night by President Wilson. About 100,000 men are expected to respond to the call. They will be mobilized immediately for such service on the Mexican border as may later be assigned to them.
