ADVERTISING FLORIDA

Good Work of Commission to be Continued

Orlando, Fla., June 17.—The "Florida First" Commission in session at the San Juan Hotel, Friday afternoon decided to close on July 15th the solicitation of funds for the first of the two advertising campaigns it will conduct during the fall and winter.

The first campaign will be for the purpose of attracting to Florida a greater number of permanent residents and the advertising will be chiefly done in farm papers. The initial announcements will appear late in July and the campaign concluded in November.

Immediately thereafter the Commission will put on another campaign, designed to influence tourist travel and winter home seekers in favor of Florida. It was along this line that the Commission last winter did the most successful advertising in the history of Florida. The second, or tourists campaign this season will continue through December and January, the raising of funds to be concluded about November 1st.

Any community may be represented in either of the two campaigns through a local commercial organization, for ten cents per capita of population in 1910, the minimum assessment to be \$250.00. Regardless of the amount of its proportion for one campaign only a community that is represented in both need pay only \$250.00 additional for the second. Last season twenty-two places stood in the advertising and reports at yesterday's meeting show that there will be a larger number this year.

In the absence of the chairman, George A. McClellan of Jacksonville, who is at present out of the state, vice-chairman Frank W. Lloyd of Quincy presided. The other members present were secretary, Vance W. Helm of Miami and treasurer, W. P. Franklin of Ft. Myers. The meeting also was attended by Jefferson Thomas, of Jacksonville, the advertising counselor of the commission. A number of routine matters were acted upon and plans made for completing an active canvass of the entire state. The Commission will convene here again on July 12th, at the time of the joint meeting of the East, North and South Florida Chambers of Commerce.

There were presented the resignations of Chairman McClellan, and of B. L. Hammer, formerly the Tampa member. Appropriate resolutions were adopted expressing regret that these gentlemen could no longer serve the body. Their places were not filled but the Jacksonville Chamber of Commerce was asked to select a successor to Col. McClellan and the Tampa Board of Trade to choose a member to fill Mr. Hammer's place. This action appealed to the other members as eminently proper in view of the fact that the retiring gentlemen had been chosen originally to represent respectively Jacksonville and Tampa and as these two cities together contributed about two thirds of last year's funds, thereby making possible the advertising which so greatly benefitted the entire state.


