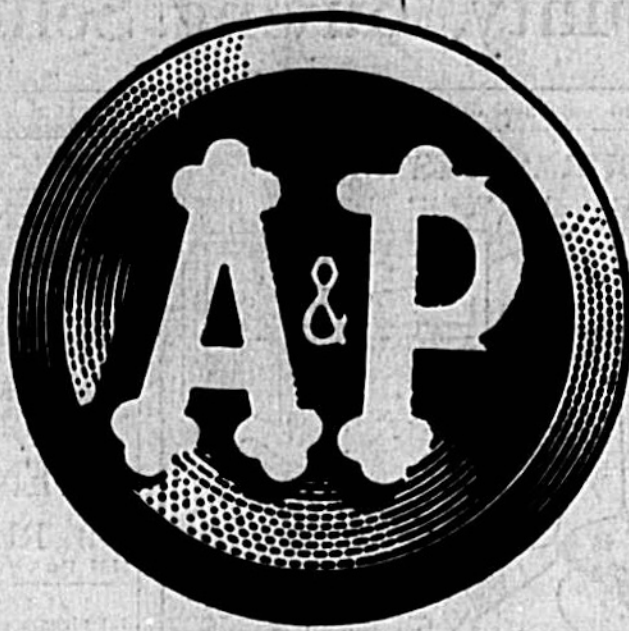

A baby girl weighing four pounds, 14 ounces was born prematurely at Greenview Hospital, received a blood transfusion for an Rh blood factor problem within one hour of birth, and was discharged 18 days later, alert and well. The remarkable thing about this "preemie" is that she had also received a blood transfusion before birth; when she was a 2 1/2 week-old fetus inside her mother's uterus. This infant is among the very few human beings ever treated in utero, an astonishing medical feat first accomplished in 1963 by the New Zealand physician, Dr. A. W. Liley. This breakthrough has already saved more than 100 babies.

Homemakers

Had a call from a reader who had misplaced her recipe for Strawberry Jello Cake. I found the one she wanted and let's use it this week to start off.

STRAWBERRY JELLO CAKE
1 pkg. white cake mix
1 pkg. strawberry jello
4 eggs
1/2 cup Wesson Oil
1 cup well drained strawberries

Line three cake tins with waxed paper, pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all ingredients in mixing bowl and mix thoroughly, beating about two minutes. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes. Frost with strawberry cream frosting.

STRAWBERRY CREAM FROSTING
1/2 cup butter
1 box powdered sugar
1/2 cup drained strawberries
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup whipping cream

1/2 cup water
3 tbs. butter
1/2 cup white or pecans
1 cup flour
3 tbs. baking powder
1/2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1/2 tsp. salt
1 tbs. butter
1/2 cup milk

Simmer brown sugar, water, 3 tbs. butter and raisins for 15 minutes, add nuts and pour into 9 by 13 glass baking dish, let cool. Mix flour, baking powder, cinnamon, sugar and salt into a mixing bowl, add melted butter and milk. Pour batter over sauce. Bake 40 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve warm with whipped cream or ice cream.

PRUNE CUP CAKES
1/2 cup margarine
1 cup sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
2 eggs
1 cup pitted prunes
1/2 cup sifted flour
1/2 tsp. baking powder
1/4 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. cloves
1/2 cup milk
1/4 cup chopped nuts

Cream butter, gradually add sugar and cream until light. Add vanilla and eggs, one at a time, beating well after each. Fold in prunes, add sifted dry ingredients alternately with milk, beating well after each. Fill greased 9x9-inch muffin pans, bake in 375 degree oven 30 minutes.

PEANUT BLOSSOM COOKIES
1/2 cup peanut butter
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 egg
1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. soda
1/2 cup flour
1/2 cup. chocolate kisses

Cream first four ingredients. Add egg and vanilla. Mix flour, soda and salt. Combine with other mixture. Shape into balls and dip in white sugar. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 minutes. Press in candy kisses. Return to bake 2 to 3 minutes more.

FLORIDIAN STEAK
1 lb. round steak cut 1/4 inch thick

BAKED CHICKEN LOAF
4 cups ground cooked or canned chicken
1 cup chicken stock
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 tsp. pepper
1/2 cup onion, minced
2 eggs, beaten
2 cups soft bread crumbs
2 medium tomatoes

Mix all ingredients except tomatoes and parsley. Blend well and pour into greased loaf pan. Bake at 375 degrees for 1 hour or until firm and slightly browned. Unmold and serve hot or cold on platter garnished with sliced tomatoes and parsley.

HAM AND GREEN BEAN SOUP
1 lb. ground smoked ham
1 lb. ground pork
1 jar (3/4 oz.) sliced mushrooms
milk
1/2 cups soft bread crumbs
2 tbs. chopped onion
2 tbs. chopped parsley
1 tsp. prepared mustard
2 eggs, beaten

1 qt. (or 2) frozen green beans, cooked
Drain mushrooms, reserving liquid. Add enough milk to the mushroom liquid to make 1/2 cup. Pour over bread crumbs. Add ham, pork, onion, parsley, mustard and eggs. Mix thoroughly. Place meat mixture on waxed paper and shape into a 10-inch square. Toss mushrooms and green beans together lightly.

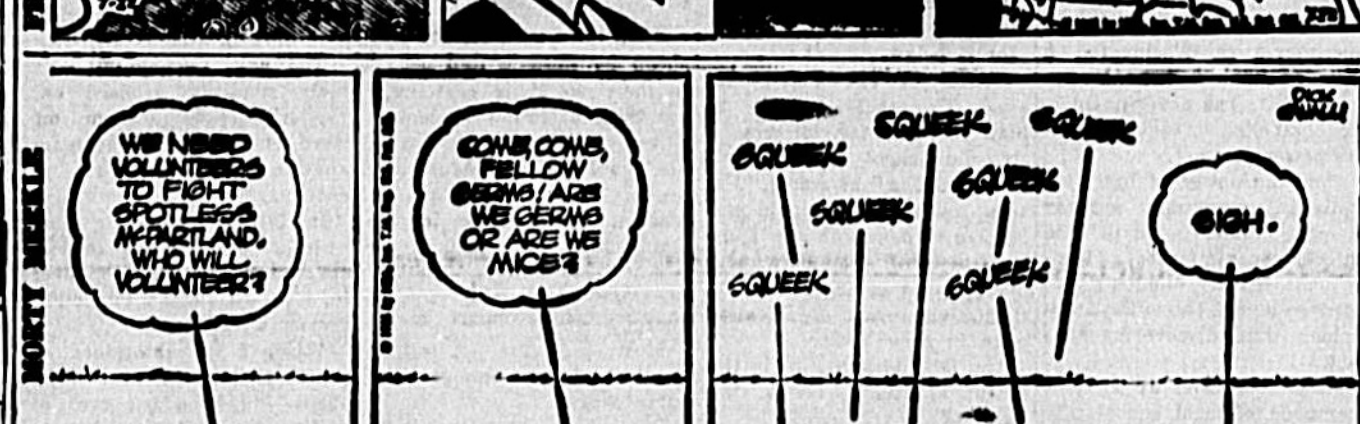
