



hat capacity for eight years. Layer received 21,466 votes. ighes appeared a clear winner in the hard-fought battle tly after midnight Wednesday. Although only 40 of 67 inole County precincts had been counted, Hughes was leading 17,152 to 10,027. Hughes said he would not claim victory, but remained "cautously optimistic" about the election outcome.

At the same time Layer would not concede the race, but said he did not expect a turnaround. When earlier returns from south Seminole showed the incumbent trailing, Layer said he thought returns from Sanford precincts might turn the tide. But it didn't happen. Hughes continued to pull out ahead.

At 1:30 a.m. today Hughes claimed victory with 55 out of 67 precincts tallied and showing him leading by about 10,000 "I am thrilled and deeply honored to have been chosen by the voters as their new superintendent of Seminole schools,"

"I consider this opportunity a tremendous challenge and responsibility and I pledge all my energies and enthusiasm to developing an outstanding school system," he added. The full-time superintendent's position pays \$38,350 an-

Hughes attributes part of his success to two issues he emphasized in his campaign: the need for school safety programs or students and employees and the need to update and improve school maintenance programs. He also emphasized the need for better communication between the school administration and the school board, employees and the community. He called lack of such communication a major failing of Layer's administration.

Homemade Jalapeno Pepper Jelly ... an appetizer jelly with a zesty flavor designed to wake up even the most jaded of taste buds. It's served atop cream cheese spread on wheat bisquits, toasted bread squares, or any variety of crackers. Almost as good as its taste is the fact that it is so quick and easy to make in your microwave oven - only 17 minutes to make four 8 oz. jars. The sparkling, light green jelly, put up in clear jelly jars and topped with a bright red bow looks so festive it doesn't even need to be wrapped. Or, if you'd like, you might even want to add a small package of wheat bisquits and cream cheese to go along with the jelly so that the receiver can sample it right away. JALAPENO PEPPER JELLY

3 large green peppers, pureed to make 12 cups
2-3 tsp. fresh or canned Jalapeno peppers, pureed 4 dashes hot sauce 3 counces of liquid pectin 6 drops green food-coloring In blender, puree green peppers. Strain liquid reserving 112 cups of pureed green peppers. Puree seeded Jalapeno peppers, using 2 or 3 teaspoons depending on how hot jelly is desired Mix sugar, vinegar, green pepper and Jalapeno pepper. Cover with waxed paper and microwave at HIGH for 10-12 minutes or until mixture comes to a rolling boil, stirring twice. Remove waxed paper, reduce power setting to MEDIUM HIGH and boil vigorously for 3 minutes. Add pectin; bring to a rolling boil at HIGH for 1-2 minutes. Reduce power to MEDIUM HIGH and boil 2 minutes. Add food coloring, skim and pour into four 8-oz. jelly jars; seal. If clear jelly is desired, strain before pouringinto jelly jars. Cool at room temperature and then refrigerate

SPICED APPLE RINGS 7 pounds Delicious apples (about 16 medium Soaking solution: 8 cups water, 2 tablespoons salt 2 tablespoons vinegar cups sugar teaspoons red food coloring 11/2 teaspoons ground cloves

Slice into 14-inch rings and place in soaking solution to prevent discoloration. Combine water, sugar-and food coloring in a large (6 to 8 quart) sauce pot. Remove syrup from heat and add drained apple rings. Letthe apples remain in the syrup for 10 minutes. Add spices to apples and return to heat. Bring to a boil, then simmer until apple rings are just tender, about 30 minutes. Remove from heat and let cool. Pack apple rings in hot jars, leaving 1/2-inch head space. Return the syrup to heat and bring to a boil. Carefully pour hot syrup over apple rings, leaving 12inch space. Remove air bubbles with a non-metallic kitchen utensil. As each jar is filled, wipe jar rim clean, place lid on and screw band down evenly and firmly. Place closed jar in
