

Consumers take note

TALLAHASSEE - Florida Agr. iculture Commissioner Bob Crawford today advised consumers to be alert to the cleanliness of mobile food carts, the sanitation practices of food handlers, and to the temperatures used to store food sold from lunch trucks.

"Today, we all want convenience. Sometimes, the fastest, most convenient way to buy lunch is from a mobile vendor or lunch truck close to work," Crawford said. "Many lunch trucks are sanitary and store foods at temperatures that will keep them safe. However, some

disregard safe practices.".

Consumers should always be observant to make sure that hot foods are maintained hot (at least 140 degrees F) and cold foods cold (at or below 41 degrees F). Food temperatures between 41 degrees P and 140 degrees P are in the danger sone for harmful bacteria to rapidly multiply. The number of bacteria that can cause illness (called pathogens) and the inci-dence of foodborne disease increase with temperature abuse of the food, unsanitary conditions of the facilities, and the practices of the food handler.

Workshop to aid exceptional students

SANFORD - Students in exceptional education programs do not follow the same sorts of career or academic tracks as most other students. Because of their special needs, mentally challenged teems do not always make plans for what they will do after high school.

Often, however, the students and their parents are not aware of the direction they should take

To that end, the Seminole County Public Schools are offering a post-high school planning workshop for those exceptional education students who are completing the 12th grade.

The workshop is scheduled to take place at the Educational Support Center, 400 E. Lake Mary

Bivd. in Sanford on Wednesday, April 16.

The schools will be offering students and their parents the opportunity to find out about what options are available to them for making the transition from the relatively-sheltered world of high school into the community of work and social survival.

Information will be provided at the seminar about the variety of options which are available for students as they move from high school into the community as well as how to make the necessary connections to find work conditions.

Many young people and their families see graduation as the end of the support system which has helped the students with disabilities be successful in high school and in life.

In truth, district officials said, there are a number of organisations and agencies which can

continue to provide the kind of assistance that will smooth the transition into life after high

That, they noted, is what the workshop is all

At the workshop, representatives from area colleges and post-secondary training facilities will be available to address their entrance procedures and requirements. There will also be participa-tion by community support agencies, including Florida Jobs and Benefits, the Social Security Administration, Vocational Rehabilitation and the Departement of Children and Families.

two days in what is a sluggishly slow jury selection.

A middle-aged woman looked over at McViegh Tuesday and commented. "He looks like a nice kid." She said, however, that she could still recommend death for whomever was sible for the April 19, 1995 blast that tore apart the Oklahomna City federal building and killed 168 people.

Looking toward McViegh at the defense table, she said, "If he

has done this, you pay for your crime."

Another of the prospects was dismissed Tuesday when she

cried in court while discribing her problems with stress. When asked by the judge if she could serve, she replied."I think it would be best if I didn't."

WASHINGTON - The Washington Post reported today that the Clintons knew of plans to help their longtime friend. Webster Hubbell, who was about to be investigated for fraud.

Hubbell left the Justice Department in March, 1994 after coming under investigation for defrauding his former law firm of nearly \$500,000. He later served an 18-month prison term

Two of President Clinton's top political advisers - Erakine Bowles and Thomas McLarty, called busienss friends to line help financial help for Hubbell when he was under fire. McLarty said he told the president and Mrs. Clinton he intended to be "supportive" and "try to help" Hubbell.

Suicide cult had weapons

SAN DIEGO - Detectives have found five handguns, three rifles and ammunition belonging to the Heaven's Gate cult that carried out a 39-member mass suicide last week. The collection was found in two rented storage sheds. Another handgun was found earlier in a cult member's baggage.

There was no evidence that the cult members used the weapons for hunting or criminal activities.

Meanwhile, the process of returning bodies to families continues with mortuaries claiming 21 bodies. Relatives have been found for each of the 39 dead.

HUNSTSVILLE, Texas - Inmate David Lee Herman, 39, tried suicide on the eve of his execution here. Herman, 39, tried to slash his throat and wrist 36 hours before being put to death by injection. He was treated at the hospital, returned to prison and is scheduled for execution tonight.

Herman was sentenced to death fir a 1989 robbery-slaying at an Arlington. Texas topicus club. In an effort to cheat the executioner, Herman broke a prison-issue disposable rasor and used the blade to slah himself in his death-row cell.





Having students shot before 7th grade

OVIEDO — A new state law requires students entering the seventh grade to be immunised against the Hepatitis B virus and to receive booster shots for both Tetanus-Diphtheria and Messles.

The law requires the students to provide the school guidance office with proof of immunization in exchange for their schedule of classes for the seventh grade.

Immunizations are always available, of course, through private physicians or for free at the Seminole County Public Health Department offices in Sanford and in Casselberry.

District officials said they are aware that getting a student to the doctor or clinic is not always easy so they are doing what they can to make the immunisation process easier for families.

In order to facilitate the immunisation effort, the school district has offered weekend immunization times for parents who can not bring their child to other facilities for their shots.

Students need to have the three shots series for Hepatitis B. a booster for their Tetanus-Dichtheria immunization funiess they have proof they have had such a booster within the last five years) and an additional shot for their measles bdoster.

All of the shots must be completed before the students will be allowed to enter the seventh grade."

The next scheduled time for weekend immunizations at a school will be at Tuskawilla Middle School from 9 a.m. until

noon on Saturday, April 12. Another session will take place at the school from 9 a.m. until noon on Saturday, Sept. 13.

Studenta who will be attending Tuskawills. Jackson Heights, Indian Trails and South Seminole middle schools will be served at that time.

Other immunisation opportunities will be presented at schools in other areas of the county as well.

A parent or guardian must accompany the child for the immunizations and must sign a permission form at that time. An immunization record must also be brought at that time.



Taking responsibility for children who commit crimes

What's a poor mother to do?

It would seem, according to the statistics on juvenile crime, that most of the hardened criminals among our young people come from homes where the father is sometimes or rarely present.

Certainly, in a perfect world, a family where both parents are present is ideal. Parents can share responsibility for raising the children in the proper way.

But this is not a perfect world. In more and more homes there is only one parent, usually the mother, taking full re-

sponeibility of parenting.

Why can't a woman be more assertive about what she and her children deserve?

No, it's not her fault that the man has left, but the mother of a child (or children) whose father (or fathers) have shirked their duty to their offspring has to stand up and demand that the men take financial and emotional. responsibility for the children they helped create.

A man need not be a resident in the home to serve as a role model for his children. He need not be a resident in the home to show them the love they deserve.

If he takes responsibility for his children by paying child support and by doing things for and with his children he is doing more to serve as a role model and a loving parent than some fathers living at home.

But if a woman allows the father of her

children to shirk his responsibility by not fighting for what rightfully belongs to her children and herself, she is contributing to the never-ending cycle of irresponsibility by

It is not her fault that the man is not doing his part, but it is her fault for allowing him to get away with.

A father, regardless of where he lives, is a man who shows his children that he knows what is right and that he chooses to act responsibly.

A father, regardless of where he lives, can not choose to abandon his children either emotionally or financially. A mother, similarly, can not allow a man the freedom to do

Society also does the children a disservice by placing the blame for their misbehavior on the presense or absense of a father in the home. A responsible father can influence the moral growth of his children no matter where he lives.

We can not blame all of society's ills on the situations of an imperfect world. We have to make the best of a bad situation and join forces to make sure all our children grow up properly.

Rather than trying to make it more difficult for parents to divorce, our legislators should be concentrating on making it more difficult for "deadbeat dads" to shirk their moral and financial responsibilities.

FBI probes new arms scandal

Iran never ceases to menace the careers of American officials. Jimmy Carter lost the presidency partly because of the Iran hostage

presidency partly because of the Iran hostage crisis. Ronald Reagan's second term was blighted by the Iran-contra scandal, Tony Lake Isn't CIA director partly because of Iran. And now, FBI agents are interviewing staff members of the 1996 House select committee that investigated the U.S. role in Iran's transfer of arms to Boania in an effort to determine who leaked the committee's highly classified report to the Los Angeles Times last December.

A Clinton administration official charged that the Times story 'contained very sensitive intelligence material whose compromise could cause harm to American servicemen in Boania'

by warning Iran that U.S. intelligence had penetrated its embassy in Croatia. The Times story, by James Risen, reported that in April 1994, "the CIA obtained intelligence about (Muslim cleric Sevko) Omerbasic's conversation with the Iranian ambassador, in which the Zagreb cleric talked of getting U.S. encouragement for arms amuseling to Bosnia."

smuggling to Bosnia."

A Republican staffer told me he informed the FBI in January that as many as 100 to 150 House and Senate employees and executive branch officials had access to the 700-page

A Democratic staffer, however, said the number was much smaller -- no more than 25 people at the time of the leak -- and said those with the most to gain from leaking it were Republicans and CIA officials.

Rep. Lee Hamilton, D-Ind., ranking member of the select committee, said that "it was obvious to (him) that what was leaked to the Times was the (GOP) majority report*

containing material damaging to the Clinton administration, especially Lake, who at the time of the leak had just been nominated to head the CIA.

An administration official said he had learned from an LA Times source, not Risen, that the leak came from "Republicans."

During and after the committee inquiry, headed by Rep. Henry Hyde, R-III., Republicans on the panel charged that Lake had lied when he denied giving a go-ahead for Iran to give arms to the Bosnian Muslims.

The committee's other Republicans were Reps. Dan Burton (Ind.), Cass Ballenger (N.C.). Sam Brownback (Kan.) and Doug Bereuter

An administration official suggested that Burton, the most aggressive Republican on the panel and now head of a committee investigating Clinton campaign abuses, might be the leaker, but Burton was not in Washington at the time the voluminous report was leaked. Bereuter, also aggressive, was in town when the leak happened, his office said. Bereuter was unavailable for comment last

Woman's cause: Giving up female genital mutilation

The human sights activity from Santo Clare

The human rights activist from Santa Clara goes about her daily work this way, cajoling and persuading new immigrants from countries like Somalia or Sierra Leone, Nigeria or Sidan to put aside one horrific customer of their homeland. She wants them to give up the tradition that some call female circumcision and other call, more accurately, female genital

Sometimes in her quest to save one more girl from the ritual maining that she experienced in her notive Ethiopia, Ramsay succeeds in changing minds. Sometime she doesn't.

But beginning this Saturday she and other activists will have something new on their side:

After years of ignorance about FGM, years of denial that it could happen in America, years of pure squeamishness about the whole subject, the bill that Pat Schroeder shepherded through Congress is finally going into effect. With one hand, the bill will reach out to new immigrants and communities where girls are at risk. With the other, it will criminalise the practice, making it punishable with up to five . years in prison.

So these days Ramsay carries warnings along with her usual arguments as she meets with parents and grandparents. Some react with shock, Ramsay says, "They say, 'Wow, a law for FGM? Why? Isn't this our tradition, our culture?" Others react with uncertainty. And still others react with relief.

A Nigerian father living in North Carolina tells Ramsay that now he has an argument to protect his young daughters. Her own sister law's nightly demands that her little daughter "needs to be cut. needs to be clean." They can

"What the law can do," insists this activist, "is make people think once, think twice, think a hundred times before they do this thing."

But not everyone has as much faith in the

law as a tool for cultural change. There are some who are concerned that this law could drive the practice further underground and target parents as criminals.

"I can imagine a situation," says Hope Lewis. a law professor at Northeastern University and opponent of FGM, In which a parent believes he or she is doing the right thing for the child and then is essentially thrown in jail."

Asma Abdel Halim, a Sudanese lawyer

studying in Ohio, approves of the law as "a preventive measure," but nevertheless she echoes that worry about criminalizing parents. "We have to ask, are we talking about a blatantly cruel act that is malicious? Is there intent to hurt?"

These women raise questions that resound uneasily in a world where one culture's tradition may be another's cruelty. How do you navigate the currents of change, avoiding both backlash and backsliding? Recognizing other values, but upholding our own?

In November an Iraqi family who found refuge in Nebraska innocently illegally married 13 and 14-year-old daughters to older men in the community. Not long after the wedding, the authorities put the underage girls in foster care, charged the astonished father with child abuse and the bewildered bridegrooms with

prepackaged perishable foods, such as sandwiches and meat ples, from lunch trucks and the food processors that prepare the foods for the lunch trucks. Some foods were found to

monocytogenes, which can cause severe filness in certain individuals. The very young. very old, pregnant women, and immunosuppressed are at risk from this disease-causing bacteria. Symptoms may be limited to fever, fatigue, nausea, vomiting and diarrhes. However, these sym-ptoms can proceed to a more serious illness. No illnesses have been reported from the consumption of these foods.

Listeria monocytogenes is found in ready-to-eat foods, the firms that produced the con-taminated products are required to stop all production and conduct a thorough cleaning and sanitizing procedure under the oversight of food and meat inspection per-sonnel from the Florida De-partment of Agriculture and Consumer Services. After the cleaning and sanitation procedures are completed. products may not be sold until they have been tested and found to be free of pathogenic bacteria.

"It is much more difficult to oversee compliance of mobile lunch trucks than establishments. fined locations," Crawford said. He urged concumers who have concerns regarding the safety of food on a particular lunch truck to ask questions and

CORN TAMALES WITH ROASTED RED PEPPERS 1 S-ounce package dried corn

hueks (see note)

2 tablespoons unsalted butter
1/2 cup dried hominy grits
1 tenspoon paprika
1/2 cup diced, reasted red bell

pepper
3 cups frozen corn, thawed (see note)
1/2 teaspoon coarse salt
1/4 teaspoon white pepper
Pinch of sugar (optional)
1/2 cup heavy cream
1/3 teaspoon baking powder
Salsa and sour cream, for serving

Place the corn busks in a bowl with enough water to cover.

Submerge them by placing a plate on top. Soak two hours or overnight. Cut 12 thin stripe of husks with which to tie the tamales.

Melt the butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Saute the grits with the paprika I to 2 minutes. Add the red pepper, the corn kernels, the salt, pepper, sugar (if using) and cream, and simmer until mixture thickens, 5 to 8 minutes. Bet soide to cool. Stir in baking powder and refrigerate.





Treatment options for asthma

DR. GOTT: For 10 years, I have had asthma that I can control only by taking prednisone pills. Because of the side effects of the drug, I would like to discontinue it but have been unable to do so. Are there any vitamins or herbs that I might substitute?

DEAR READER: Unfortunately.

Prednisone and similar steroid medicines basically shut off the immune system. Hence, they are useful in treating hyper-immune disorders (such as lupus and acute allergies) and asthma, a breathing abnormality marked by overreactivity and spasm of the bronchial tubes.

Even so, steroid-dependent asthma is a challenging dis-ease: On one hand, doctors want to reduce airway reactivity, but on the other hand, they want to avoid complications of the treatment itself.

As you know, prednisone therapy (in pill form) carries with it substantial risk of diabetes. bones. brittle cataracts. bruising, susceptibility to infection, and many other consequences.

In my practice, I've found a way around this problem. Inhaled steroids (Azmacort and others) will help asthmatics but are generally not absorbed into the body in appreciable amounts. Thus, side effects are minimal.

Run this by your doctor, but here is what I suggest: Use a standard inhaler (Proventil. Atrovent and so forth) about four times a day to open the bronchial passages. Follow this immediately with an inhaled steroid.

Of course, there are other treatment options, too, with newer drugs, such as Accolate. Also, you must slowly taper your doses of prednisone, if you decide to discontinue it. because suddenly stopping it after more than a week of use could lead to serious complications, including low blood

To my knowledge, no herbs or vitamins are effective in treating asthma.


