## **Exchange Suspends Auto-Train Stock**

The American Stock Exchange suspended trading in Auto-Train stock Monday due to the firm's precarious debt situation and the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) reported today it will go to court to enforce an earlier order for Auto-Train to establish an escrow account to cover advance bookings should the company go bankrupt.

Daniel Linhardt, senior trial attorney with the ICC Office of Consumer Protection, said today the suit would be NICKELS iled no later than 3 p.m. in the U.S. District Court for the District of ADD UP

Linhardt said the suit is a joint one with the U.S. Justice Department and is a result of Auto-Train's failure to comply with a Dec. 7, 1979 order requiring it to, among other things, place \$500,000 in an escrow account by March 15, 1980.

## WORLD IN BRIEF

#### Sadat To End Dialogue Via Mail With Begin

Egyptian President Anwar Sadat says he will break off his mail dialogue with Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin because Egypt has stated "clearly" its position on the deadlocked Middle East peace issues of Jerusalem and Jewish settlements in occupied Arab

He said the pen-pal diplomatic dialogue would cease after he receives Begin's latest letter, described by Israeli officials as 15 pages long and "very good and

"I will not reply to any new letters from Prime Minister Begin because Egypt has explained its position very clearly on all important issues, such as Jerusalem and Jewish settlements in occupied lands," Sadat told Egyptian newspaper editors Monday.

Sadat met Monday with U.S. Ambassador Alfred Atherton and the Middle east News Agency quoted the president as saying: "Egypt believes a resumption of the negotiations at the present time would be futile."

#### Israel Raids Lebañon Camps

TEL AVIV, Israel (UPI) - Israeli infantry, crack mechanized troops and fighter-bombers raided five Palestinian guerrilla bases in southern Lebanon today in the second surprise nighttime strike in five days, the military command said.

An Iśraeli military spokesman said "quite a few guerrillas" were killed, but made no mention of Israeli casualties or the number of men sent on the raid. In Beirut, Palestinian, officials said much of the fighting was at close range and there were casualties

#### Polish Troops Assemble

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) - Crack troops massed today on the outskirts of Gdansk, the center of a spreading wave of strikes that has crippled Poland's industrial north and brought demands for radical changes in the nation's communist system, dissident

"We will not tolerate strikes," Poland's Communist Party leader Edward Gierek warned in a 25-minute TV address to the nation. He ordered the more than 100,000 strikers back to work and declared political changes demanded by the workers were out of the question.

"We will not tolerate attempts at political changes," said Gierek, who canceled a two-day visit to West Germany to deal with the crisis. "Poland's political freedom and independence is based on socialism. Certain boundaries cannot be crossed."

#### Dozens Die In Train Crash

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) -A passenger train crowded with vacationers returning home from Baltic Coast resorts collided head-on with a freight train in central Poland today, and official reports indicated dozens of people were killed.

A Ministry of Transportation spokesman said "maybe 20, maybe 30" people died in the wreck.

#### 80 Die In Iran Explosion

By United Press International A blast ripped through an explosives warehouse in Iran's oil-rich Khuzestan province, killing at least 80 people and wounding 32 others, Tehran Radio reported

Earlier, Iran's Prime Minister Mohammed Ali Rajai announced the selection of a Cabinet made up largely of Islamic revolutionaries in another step leading to the formation of a government and the long-awaited debate in parliament on the fate of the U.S. hostages.

#### Mother Crushes Baby Panda

MEXICO CITY (UPI) - Ying-Ying, for eight days the proud and tenacious mother of the world's first panda conceived and born naturally in captivity, accidentally suffocated her 5-ounce offspring by rolling on it in her sleep, zoo officials said.

The minute baby panda, unnamed because keepers had been unable to take it away from its mother to determine the sex, was found dead cradled in its mother's arms Monday morning.

Herald Staff Writer Seminole County School Board Attorney Ned Julian Jr. and Sanford architect Eoghan Kelley were scheduled to confer this morning on Kelley's dispute with the school board over the amount due him for the design and construction supervision of Rock Lake Middle School.

Kelley says the school board owes him about \$55,000. School officials seem to think the correct figure is about \$1,500. The school board will consider the matter at the regularly scheduled meeting Wednesday.


Kelley appeared before the board July 23 to explain his claim and present supporting documents, but the board voted to postpone a decision on the matter until Julian could review the material and issue an opinion. Kelly asked at that time that he be allowed time to meet with Julian before the attorney makes his recommendation to the board. But although the meeting between Kelley and Julian has

been scheduled, a letter sent by Julian to school board members indicates that Julian may have already made up his mind on the matter. School Board member Pat Telson said Monday Julian's letter states that he is of the opinion the relationship between

the parties is governed by owner (the school board) - architect agreement entered into in 1975. Mrs. Telson said Julian's conclusion after studying that

document is that "the total fee due the architect is 6 percent of the ultimate construction cost" of the school. According to School Board Assistant Superintendent of Business and Finance Roger L. Harris the final cost of the school was \$3,813,589. Kelley has been paid \$227,349.52 he said. leaving a balance owed of \$1,465.82.

But Kelley contends only 20 percent of the original plans he drew up for the school could be used after the school was delayed and had to be redrawn. And there were alternates and options school officials requested be designed but that were never built. Both eventualities incurred added costs, he said. Kelley said the owner-architect agreement, which Julian points to, shows "in black and white" that the architect gets paid for schematic designs, design development, working drawings and specifications and bidding and negotiations with he contractor even if the alternates or options are not built. such work "They (the school board) are saying 'if we didn't build it, you don't get paid for it.' That's not the agreement," Kelley said.

Julian wrote: "Since the owner ultimately moved forward to the construction document phase, the bidding or negotiation phase and the construction phase without an amendment to the

Kelley said Julian's letter does not reflect a detailed study of the audit of the Rock Lake Middle School job. He said had the original plans of the school been sent in ort time by the administration, the school would not have come under new state Department of Education regulations and would not have had to be replanned.

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The nation's housing industry appears to have started down the long road to recovery. But analysts warn the healing process could be cut short if mortgage interest rates continue to

The Commerce Department reported Monday housing starts rose 4.8 percent in July to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 1.267 million units, the highest point since the recession began in February. However, July's increase was slow next to June's 33.3 percent upswing and still left housing starts 28.2 percent behind last July's pace.

"Basically, this is evidence of a very weak recovery that is built on a very shaky foundation," said Ken Thygerson, chief economist for the U.S. League of Savings Associations. "We view the whole situation as very suspect," he



The doctrine known as Mutual Assured Destruction or MAD, assumed that neither the Soviet Union nor the United States would ever be tempted to launch a nuclear attack so long as the cities and key industries of both nations remained wholly vulnerable to

·The 1972 Anti-Ballistic Missile Treaty supposedly signalled formal acceptance of the MAD doctrine by Washington and Moscow. The treaty limited the deployment of Soviet and American missiles capable of intercepting and destroying incoming nuclear warheads,. In effect, the populations of both countries were to be made hostage in the interests of forestalling nuclear

The trouble with MAD was that it remained a fixation only in American minds. The objective evidence of Soviet actions since 1972 leaves no doubt that the Russians have discarded the Mutual Assured Destruction doctrine, if indeed they ever accepted it in the first place.

For at least the last 10 years, the Soviets have been spending an estimated \$2 billion per year to develop the world's most extensive civil defense system. They have deployed 12,000 surface-to-air missile launchers and 2,600 fighter interceptors to counter the threat of 300 U.S. bombers. And, despite the Anti-Ballistic Missile Treaty, they have retained a residual ABM infrastructure that many U: S. experts believe could be rapidly converted to operational status, perhaps in a



occurred which changed the history of the world, and everyone knew at the time that we were living through days of world-historic importance. As it happens, that summer weekend on which Hitler launched his Panzers across the Polish plain and into the Soviet Union is quite literally seared on my

I was a 10-year-old child, spending the summer with my parents at an unusual beach resport called Ocean Grove on the Jersey

On that weekend in the summer of 1941, I overdid it on the beach. My mother bought me it out beyond the breakers and spent the day on it, under a blazing sun, the sky blue and cloudless, the sun bleaching the beach, the minutes passing slowly into hours. By the evening, I was cooked. Practically hospitalizable. Back at the hotel, a physician wrapped me in wet compresses, and they must have drugged me since I remember ar

enormous grogginess. The next day I remember reading the headlines on the Sunday New York Times. The Germans had gone into Russia. The familiar military map showed the advancing Panzers as multiple arrows. Even at that age, I knew that this was it, the big show. From what little I knew, I hated and despised Stalin and the Soviets.

As an eight-year-old, two years earlier, I had rooted for the Finns, so outnumbered and yet so flashy and brilliant with their ski troops against the Muscovite hordes. The architecture of the Soviet pavilion at

the New York World's Fair made the point visually. It was a massive building, ugly proletarian heroic in style, full of photographs of dams and people driving tractors, and it was topped by a huge statue, some musclebound lut of a worker holding up a big Red Star. The Finnish pavilion, which had to close after the defeat, was a gem of modern architectures, and when it closed a band played "Finlandia" and adults wept. After I recovered from my sunburn, I

Ocean Grove was an island of Victorian calm amid the storms of the 20th century. The town was run by strict Methodists, who banned booze and even put chains across the streets on Sundays to exclude automobiles. May Be Rampant SAN DIEGO (UPI) - Players, coaches and executives in the NBA are worried that cocaine use has reached epidemic proportions in the league, estimating 40 to 75 percent of all players use the drug and its potent derivative, free base,

the Los Angeles Times reported today. Michael Gearon, president of the Atlanta Hawks, estimated as many as half the players in the league use cocaine and 10 percent may use free base. Atlanta General Manager Stan Kasten put player use at 75 percent.

"I believe we are on the verge of an epidemic of free base," Gearon said. "It is time we identified the problem. Free base is as dangerous as heroin and it's a ... serious problem.'

Utah Jazz forward Bernard King was arrested in January on charges of sodomy and possession of cocaine. Jazz guard Terry Furlow, who died in a car accident in May, had traces of valium and

cocaine in his bloodstream. Cocaine and free base are expensive drugs; ranging from \$90 to \$125 a gram for cocaine and more for freebase. The average salary in the NBA

One player who asked not to be identified said of cocaine use: "It's really scary. Some of the best players in the league, players who don't even drink, are into free base, and they are spending some very big sums of money.

"I'm afraid it could get out of hand," he said. Something crazy is going to happen in an airport or a hotel, and the whole thing could come turnoling down. 

ORLANDO, Fla. (UPI) - A defective heart valve caused the death of a 10-year-old Venezuelan girl who collapsed last week after riding the Space Mountain Roller Coaster at Disney World, medical examiners

Dr. G.V. Ruiz, deputy chief medical examiner for Orange, Seminole and Osceola counties, said Monday Maria Cruz Cancino suffered from acute ischimia, a disease that sometimes exhibits no symptoms and affects its victims suddenly.

Ruiz could not say whether the roller-coaster type ride contributed to the girl's death, but indicated she could have been struck down just as easily if she had been sitting at home. "Sometimes it causes sudden death, at any time this

can happen," Ruiz said. The doctor said a defective heart valve which impeded the flow of blood into her heart, causing her to collapse and die last Tuesday shortly after she got off


