Swimming, fishing banned after water leak

SANFORD — Swimming and fishing have been banned along posted areas of Lake Monroe after treated reclaimed water leaked into the lake Friday.

City workers placed signs along the river front Friday afternoon, according to Bill Marcous, reclaimed water coordinator.

"This is similar to last year's event," Marcous said Friday. The water leaked out of a storage pond between the treatment plant and Central Florida Regional Hospital. The state has been notified and a health alert issued as a precaution.

The signs give people a number to call explaining why water activities are banned. The number is 407-330-5678.

Marcous said the water had been treated, but needed to be dechlorinated.

The posted area is north of the treatment facility and north of the boat ramp.

"We have been experiencing record or near record rainfall," Marcous said. "If we stop getting those excessive amounts it will be a much more manageable situation."

He didn't know how much went into the lake, but if more than 1,000 gallons are released, the city is required to notify officials in Tallahassee, which Marcous said took place Friday.

"This is not a normal occurrence and we regret the inconvenience," Marcous said. The city will continue to test the water to determine when the ban can be lifted, he added.

"The plant is not designed for record events," he said, adding that rainfall here was just shy of a record for June.

Deli owner faces battle with cancer

SANFORD — Downtown Divine Deli owner Drew Fischer, 42, is facing a divine obstacle from God.

Two weeks ago, Fischer and his wife, Jayne, found out he has stage two squamous cell carcinoma. A cancer of the epidermal cells, which may have started on his tongue and has now spread to his lymph nodes and his vocal chords.

His doctors are not sure how the seemingly healthy Fischer could have developed the cancer.

"I don't fit the mold," Fischer said.

He said most people who get this type of cancer are excessive drinkers and smokers.

"I've never smoked," he said.

His doctor said he wants Fischer to go to a study group at Duke University since he doesn't fit any of the criteria of this form of skin cancer.

In light of the medical problem Fischer and his wife are facing, they closed their downtown deli Thursday. The couple said that because of all the medical treatments, such as chemotherapy and radiation almost five days a week, they won't be able to continue running the restaurant.

City hopes SolarBee can impact midge population

SANFORD — While stinging mosquitoes can produce a pain in the neck, their non-biting relatives, or midges, can create havoc of their own when they hatch and swarm in huge numbers.

This weekend a contraption called a SolarBee will churn to life about eight-tenths of a mile straight out from the marina. The experiment is the latest in the battle to eradicate midge flies.

"We've been sampling about 10 months out of the year," said Tom George, director of public works in Sanford. When large levels of midge larvae are detected, the city normally uses larvicide to kill the pests before they hatch.

The SolarBee, produced by a company based in North Dakota, will hopefully be a safer method for limiting the midge population.

Because of the weather, midges did not

A perfect setting for Dalli's RiverWalk Pizza

SANFORD — If someone wanted to pick the perfect spot to open a pizza restaurant in Sanford, that person would probably pick the location of Dalli's RiverWalk Pizzeria on East Seminole Boulevard.

Owner Joe Dalli has worked hard to fulfill his dream of opening an Italian restaurant. Local people know Dalli's Pizzeria and Restaurant located on Country Club Road in Lake Mary.

Dalli hails from the pizza capital of Brooklyn and has brought recipes from his mom to the business. He has come a long way in a short time.

"I was shaving ice in front of the Wal-Mart," Dalli recalled. His mother-in-law told him about a spot open in Lake Mary and he started his first restaurant. Later he moved to

its current location.

"I guess I've gotten lucky," he said.

Dalli said he never intended to open a Sanford location.

"It's a struggle," he said at the new restaurant Wednesday. "I swore I'd never open another."

Still the location with a view of the marina in the middle of the \$11 million Sanford RiverWalk was too good to pass up.

"I like the atmosphere of the marina, and they are fixing up Sanford. It's up and coming," Dalli said.

His wife, Julie, helps at the restaurants, and they have two children, Joshua, 8, and Jenna, 4. Owning a business can be difficult with a family, Dalli admitted.

"It's tough with kids," he said, "but I make the best of it."

opened for slices a few weeks ago. Dalli had to wait for permits and some other challenges of opening a new business.

The menu is a bit smaller than the big store in Lake Mary, but Dalli's is known for calzones and stromboli, available at both locations. The

Sanford restaurant also serves appetizers like wings and garlic knots as well as pizza in 14-inch and 18-inch sizes.

The menu offers 22 different pizza toppings as well as seven varieties of salad and nine sub sandwiches. Pizza can be ordered by the slice as well, and in Sicilian style. Guests can top off their meal with a cannoli or tiramisu for dessert.

Dalli said he has Sanford customers who would drive all the way to Lake Mary for pizza. Now the new location offers them a convenience.

"Everything here is made fresh," Dalli said. The sauce is slow cooked over six hours, and they make their own dough.

"I just brought Brooklyn here," he said. "We're a mom and pop store, even though we're looking to grow."

Wekiva Players to present rock opera

SANFORD — The Wekiva River Players will present "Jesus Christ Superstar" July 15 through 24 in the Walt Griffin Auditorium at Millennium Middle School in Sanford.

The show times are Fridays and Saturdays at 7:30 p.m. and Sundays at 2 p.m.

Andrew Lloyd Webber's rock opera "Jesus Christ Superstar" is about Jesus' final seven days, but the musical never answers whether Jesus truly is the Messiah. Instead, it appeals to a wide audience by not trying to prove a point either way.

The production is full of challenging roles for a talented cast. Eddy Coppens plays Jesus in his 13th production with the Wekiva River Players. Coppens was most recently seen as Che in "Evita" with the Players and Pirelli in "Sweeney Todd" at the Icehouse Theatre.

Like other cast members, Coppens was inspired by the 1973 movie version and is energized by Director Amy Avallone's vision for this production.

Avallone is setting up the actors to tell the story as actors, a play within a play. Michael Salzano, Pontius Pilate in the production, says Avallone's angle portrays the characters in the play as puppets, all manipulated by God's master plan. Only Jesus is free to act of his own volition.

As in the movie version, the story is told through the eyes of Judas Iscariot, the disciple who betrays Jesus in the Bible. Judas serves as narrator and is responsible for most of the exposition in the production, without ever directly speaking to the audience.

Judas will be played by Daniel Kemper, a recent graduate of Lake Mary High School who will attend the Tisch School at New York University in the fall.

Kemper has been a fan of "Jesus Christ Superstar" for many years, according to a news release. At 8 years old, the musical was Kemper's first Broadway show as an audience member. After the show, Kemper had the chance to meet Carl Anderson — the original Judas Iscariot on Broadway and in the movie version. Ever since then, Judas has been a dream role for Kemper.

"Judas is a complex role because of the transformation he goes through on stage. He goes from thinking that Jesus is just a man that has lost control of the people to realizing that he himself is the pawn in God's ultimate plan," Kemper said.

Tickets are \$15 each plus a box office transaction fee. Group discounts are available for groups of 10 or more. Call 407-262-1801 for more information. The theatre is located at 21 Lakeview Ave. in Sanford. A portion of the proceeds will go to benefit CARE, a wild animal rescue group.

Students receive \$1,000 Wal-Mart scholarships

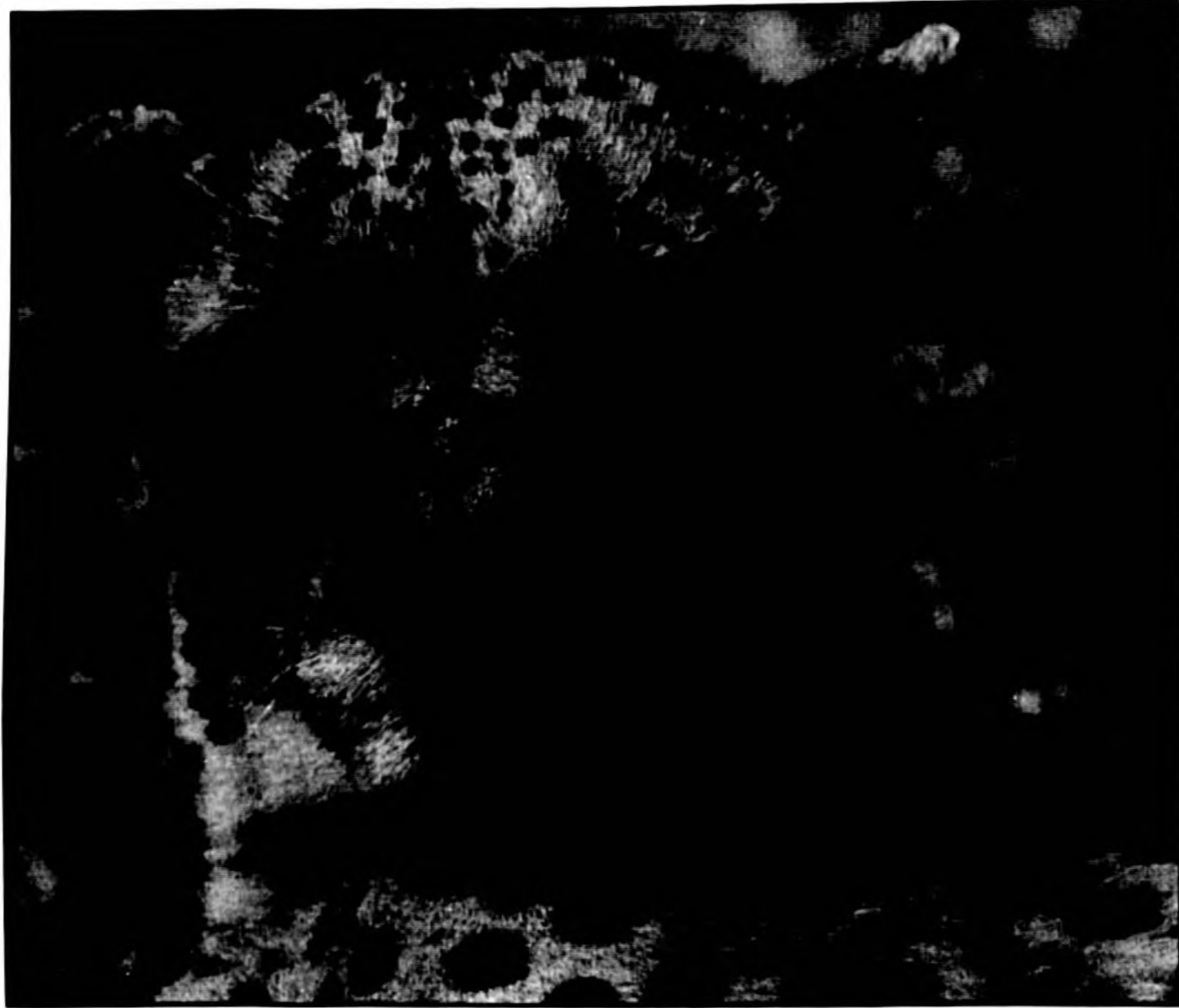

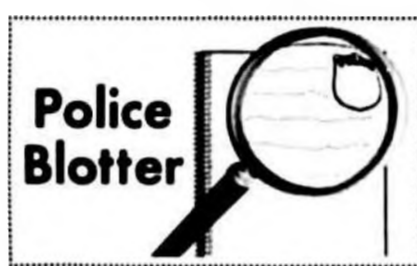

create much of a nuisance in 2004. Many who have lived in Sanford for a longer period, however, will remember the problems they can cause.

In great numbers, the flies have clogged air conditioners and radiators. They can make roads slick if there are enough of them. Decaying midges can smell unpleasant as well, and with an \$11 million RiverWalk meant to attract people to Sanford, that can't happen.

George said the current location for the experiment was chosen based on last year's data.

"We'll probably move it a little closer," he said Wednesday.

The SolarBee is a solar powered water circulator. Company representative Michael Lipparelli is based in Eustis. He said the device started as a reservoir circulator to quell algae blooms, weeds, odors, and fish kills.

"The original goal in 1997 was to provide better water quality in wastewater treatment ponds," Lipparelli said Wednesday.

After some success customers with similar problems in freshwater lakes assumed it would clean that water too. After some experimentation, that proved true, Lipparelli said.

About a year and a half ago, he said, the company began looking in Florida for another test area. Several experts said midges are a big economic problem.

The company contacted University of Florida professor and world renowned midge expert Arshot Ali. He did the first studies of the midge problems in Lake Monroe. Recently, the SolarBee company had an extra unit and the time was right to deploy in the river.

All wants to study the effectiveness of the SolarBee. Until now, there have only been manufacturer's claims about what the machine can do.

"They claim that it should improve water quality, but

really there is no independent data," Ali said. He wants to generate that data, and has sent a proposal to the city of Sanford, but so far it has not been funded.

Lake Monroe, part of the St. Johns River, is prone to midges because they thrive in shallow bodies of water.

"Historical data shows that whenever the water volume increases in the spring, you will have a smaller midge population in the summer," Ali said from his office in Apopka. "It is the opposite of biting mosquitoes."

Biting mosquitoes thrive in stagnant water that pools during heavy rain. When the volume of the lake increases, however, midge numbers decrease because their food — phytoplankton — dilutes in the extra water, Ali explained.

He said the water quality of Lake Monroe has increased since 1981 when larvae samples found 8,000 to 10,000 in a single square meter. Now, that number has reduced in recent years to 1,000 to 2,000, but still above what Ali called the nuisance stage.

He said methodical experiments would have to be done before determining if the SolarBee can help in Lake Monroe.

The manufacturer said the unit deployed in the lake right now can circulate

10,000 gallons of water per minute. That equals more than 14 million gallons per day.

"Each of these units will influence 50 surface acres," Lipparelli said. Lake Monroe is roughly 10,000 acres.

Lipparelli said the SolarBee will probably have to be in the lake for a year to determine if results were positive. The \$36,000 unit is deployed in the lake without cost to the city.

It is equipped with a U.S. Coast Guard approved beacon to light up the unit for boaters at night. There are also reflectors on it to make the unit more visible in the daytime.

The machine has a five-year life span, Lipparelli said, and virtually no maintenance.

"City workers will have to float by every once in a while to see if the propeller is running," he explained.

The city's George said Sanford is trying to find some environmentally safe ways to control midges.

Some studies, George said, have found that the best answer may be to put bright lights out on the lake. The midges are attracted by light.

Starting next week, he said, the city will install shields on some of the lights along the RiverWalk. Sticky pads will be used to see what the affect on midges will be.

"We're looking into more natural answers," George said. "Midges are very tied to weather and wind directions. We've gotten better at determining where the hot spots are in the lake."

If the SolarBee is affected, then they could be deployed in these areas. George said a couple of known spots for midge breeding is at Stone Island across the lake and in front of Central Florida Regional Hospital.

"Lake Monroe is a flowing river and that creates some challenges too," he said.

Independence Day

I don't believe any national holiday attracts more people outdoors than July 4th observances. There will be fireworks, parades, barbecues and other events all across the nation.

Of course it is in commemoration of the creation of the Declaration of Independence. I almost wrote the "signing" of the Declaration, but that would be a misnomer. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress had unanimously voted (New York abstained), to be free and independent from Britain. On July 4th, the body officially adopted the Declaration, but the adoption required signatures.

New York finally voted in favor of the document on July 15. After the document was prepared on parchment, members of congress began signing it on August 2nd. The last signer was Thomas McKean of Delaware, whose name wasn't even put on the document until the last of the year.

The President of the Continental Congress, John Hancock, was the first to sign. This is where the old phrase "Put your John Hancock on it" came from - to indicate that some document was official.

If you have the time, get out some reference book and read the actual words of the declaration. You'll find much of it contains complaints about how our 13 original colonies were treated by the British monarchy. But possibly half of it explains the freedoms our nation should have - and should have had since the document became official.

Just so you know who agreed to and subsequently approved this document, of the 56 signatures, 14 were listed as lawyer/judges, 11 as just judges and 10 as lawyers. Thus, 35 (62.5%) of the 56 were in the legal profession. Ten were listed as merchants.

Where the tradition of having fireworks came from, I have been unable to determine, but fireworks are usually used to commemorate some outstanding event in history. As fireworks are presented outdoors, the additional traditions of barbecues and family outings are naturally expected.

Unfortunately the police also are generally busy on the 4th of July. Over indulgence is becoming more and more prominent, and it is one of the holidays known for unusually high rates of DUI (driving under the influence) arrests, and a myriad of accidents caused by these people who celebrated the 4th with a bottle rather than fireworks.

As you may have already found out, AAA estimates over two million people will be on our highways at sometime during this holiday weekend. Another 188 thousand will be arriving by plane and 163 thousand by bus or train.

Regarding the motorists, AAA is offering a Tow To Go program. Anyone who believes he or she is incapable of driving home after a party or outing, may call 1-800-AAA-HELP and AAA will dispatch a tow truck to take the motorist and the vehicle home - at no charge. Naturally, is it hoped most folks will have already obtained a designated driver and the call won't be necessary.

You can bet, however, that next week, we'll have several stories of motorists stopped by law enforcement officers and charged with driving under the influence (DUI). Hopefully they won't be given an additional charge of "DUI with Property Damage" or DUI with death, as in the case quite often.

It should also be stressed that during the 2004 July 4th weekend, 42 people lost their lives on Florida's highways, with 34 percent involving impaired drivers.

In addition to avoiding drinking and driving - here's another word of warning. Governor Jeb Bush, has signed a package of highway safety measures, including a provision that allows officers to issue tickets if a driver or any passenger under 18 is not wearing a seat belt. He has called on this to begin as of midnight Thursday, June 30, and be heavily stressed during the Fourth of July weekend. "Beginning July 1st, it's the law and it will be enforced," Bush said.

Regardless of when the Declaration of Independence was signed or became official, July 4th is designated as the celebration for this independence - but remember, back in 1776, it was the independence from Great Britain, not an independence to do whatever folks want whenever they want to.

New residents cause problems so here's a plan

To the Editor:

To Governor Jeb Bush. As one with almost 60 years of experience in the real estate development, building and consulting business in Central Florida, I have experienced the population increase from approximately one million people when I was born to approximately 17 million people in Florida today. I have witnessed first hand the problems that growth has imposed on the state, particularly with schools, transportation, parks and the environment. Whether in the business, personal or political arena, I learned early on to recognize the problem, analyze the problem and solve the problem. Unfortunately, in today's society much time is being spent recognizing the problem but very little time and vision has come forth with analyzing and solving the problem.

I speak particularly of the tremendous influx of new residents into the State, not only from other parts of the United States, but from all over the world. People worldwide are beginning to realize what Ponce de Leon said many years ago about Florida being the "Land of Flowers". A thousand people or more moved to Florida daily. This increase in population should be considered an asset rather than the liability that it is causing in many sectors. To date I have not witnessed any positive solutions coming from our elected officials, whose responsibility it is to address these pressing issues. With all due respect to our present Senator Mel Martinez, he only recognized the problem with schools, but

never came up with a solution. His philosophy was if the schools could not accommodate new residents, we basically had to stop building homes. As a result, disproportionate impact fees up to almost \$10,000 per home were incorporated, whether the home was \$100,000 or \$1,000,000. My plan would lessen or eliminate the burden of fees on lower priced homes.

New residents add to the problems with traffic and the need for additional schools. If they are the problem, they should provide the solution. My proposal would be for the State to impose a transfer fee when an out-of-state resident purchases a home - a house, town home, condominium or mobile home - to be paid by the BUYER. (Florida residents would not be charged a transfer fee since they are already here and participating "cost-wise". This fee would be adjusted periodically based on what is needed to support growth that is a direct result of the vast influx of new residents into our wonderful State. This is the same system the homeowners associations use when one purchases a home in their development. This fee ranges from \$500 to \$2000 or more. In all my years in the development/real estate profession, I have never heard of any sale being lost in any price range because of this homeowner's association transfer fee.

My plan will alleviate any tax increase on existing residences and will have a tendency to lower the price of all homes that are being purchased in Florida. The reason home prices have accelerated is not only supply and demand but the lack of available land close to the metropolitan area and the disproportionate impact fees that are being levied today on new construction.

The above is a very simple solution to a complex problem. It places the cost of solving our problems directly on the shoulders of the ones that are causing it. I urge those in authority to act on this plan without delay.

"Drew's the main man here," his wife Jayne said.

Fischer makes all of the desserts, soups and comes up with the lunch specials. The two owned the deli for almost three years and were recently considering opening up a larger restaurant.

Fischer said that something kept telling him, back in May, to close the deli, and he couldn't figure out why.

In hindsight, he said, it all makes sense now. He said he knows God has given him cancer for a reason, and eventually they will figure out why.

The two have always been spiritual people, Jayne said.

Fischer said he told his wife that his ultimate goal is to have people see him go through this and see how God is a cornerstone through this obstacle.

"I hope to bring God to someone," he said.

Thursday, Fischer went back to the doctor for more tests to make sure the cancer had not spread anywhere else. His doctor said he is not a candidate for surgery because of the location of the cancer. He would lose his vocal chords.

Fischer said the only symptom he had was fatigue, but in

September of 2004 he noticed a lump on the side of his throat.

"The EMT misdiagnosed it as a cyst," he said.

Recently, Fischer noticed a lump forming on the other side of his throat and went to a different doctor for tests. He found out two weeks ago that it was stage two cancer.

Fischer begins chemotherapy on the tenth or twelfth of July. He said there will be four or five weeks where he will not be able to talk and he will be sick in bed.

The doctors have given him a 75 percent chance of survival, but that is before getting the results back on whether or not the cancer has spread anywhere else.

The Fischers said they have made a lot of great friends and neighbors in Sanford, but right now they are concentrating on their three boys and getting Fischer healthy.

"God has given me this cancer, so I'm going with it," Fischer said Friday.

Jayne said that their customers and friends have blessed their family and that everyone was praying for Fischer.

"It's been a good town," Fischer said.

Some of those good friends and neighbors are currently planning fundraisers for Fischer, but no immediate details are available.

The Way We Were: Before there was TV, there were assemblies

At Sanford High School on Palmetto Avenue and later at Seminole High on French Avenue, students attended weekly assembly programs in the auditorium. There were announcements, singing of the school song, and some sort of a program. The programs presented in the 1920s, which I will report on here, may seem quaint to you young people, but you must remember that there was little radio or movies then, and certainly no television. Therefore any sort of entertainment was welcomed.

Even during the early 1950s when I was a student at SHS, we enjoyed speakers, plays, musical programs, etc. each week. We had grown up with radio, but television didn't come to this area until 1954 with WDBO, Channel-6 in Orlando. Before that, those few with TVs got snowy reception from Jacksonville. My parents didn't get a set until the fall of 1954 while I was in college. And while I was in college, the dorm had only one set in the parlor.

Back to auditorium programs in the 1920's. In several of these early Salmagundis there is a report on programs presented that year. Here are some that were enjoyed in 1922.

The victrola was the source of much pleasure as the students enjoyed great artists plus some jazzy records now and then.

The freshman class entertained on morning by singing "Giddy, Glory, Hallelujah" in Latin.

The ministers of the city gave many splendid talks during the year. Out of town speakers that the students benefited from included Mr. Shuler of moody Bible Institute, Mr. Hudson, a missionary from China, and Mr. Dendy, a C.E. Worker. Supt. T.W. Lawton was always a welcome speaker.

During the year, they heard Gayle Marshall's prize winning oration, beautiful solos by Lillie Ruth Spencer and Mildred Holly, and piano solos by Velma Shipp and Charlotte Smith. A memorable debate was on the topic "Resolved" that George Washington was a greater American than Abraham Lincoln." The judges decided in favor of the negative.

Miss Williams' Expression pupils presented several programs which consisted of tableau, plays, dialogues and monologues.

In 1923, a noteworthy speaker was Senator Flether.

There was also Dr. VanKirck who spoke on "Americanism" and Mr. Badford, Chataqua lecturer, who gave the students the inspiring motto "Almost right is always wrong".

Miss Isabella Goodhue gave an interesting lecture on birds and entertained with her imitations of bird songs and calls. Major Wilson of the State Board of health talked on the harm done by the mosquito and how the Board was campaigning against it.

There were inspirational talks by the local ministers, Rev. Brownlee, Rev. Walker, Rev. King, Rev. Burhans and Rev. carpenter. There were also missionaries to China and Korea.

The students were pleased to now have song books, and they continued to enjoy records on the victrola.

Mr. Woolslagle delighted the students with his songs and slight-of-hand tricks.

Lee McLain and Addie Muller, representatives to the Bachelor oratorical Contest in Winter park, gave their orations one morning. Lee's topic was "Florida's Future among the States", while Addie spoke on "The Evil of Intolerance in America."

According to Charlotte Smith, author of these 1923 notes, "An account of our chapel services would not be complete without mention of Byron Stephens; occasional remarks and Mr. R.F. Cooper's inevitable announcements about athletics. Men may come and Men may go, but Mr. Cooper goes on forever.

Stetson's Corner Man and beast — crossing paths

Geneva is a paradise for nature lovers whether vegetarians, hunters, or weekend enthusiasts. Often I love wildlife, flora, and fauna as a spectator, from a safe distance. Sometimes this..... confuses my husband — like the time he wanted to show me a Florida Scarlet snake, up close and personal.

That being said, I'm in awe everyday of the wondrous cycles of nature that surround us. Florida transplants say they miss the change of seasons, but I've learned to look for the subtle signs. Like watching where the sun rises on the lake, spotting tiny green buds on the oak branches when the temperature warms, and noticing that almost overnight my newly cut grass has grown another inch.

A favorite sign of spring is watching wildlife moms bring their babies through our pastures. I see it year after year and still feel a thrill as if my nose is pressed against the nursery window for the first time. A mother turkey usually comes first, even before her young are born, walking regally but a little slowly as if scouting out the area. Soon we see her again, the grass ruffles around her and a dozen or so frantic fluff balls scoot and scurry about their mother. Next we see the calves in the roadside pastures, various shades of black, red, and brown all legs as they run beside mom within the herd. And finally the baby deer arrive. The doe gracefully enters the pasture, ears alert, tail twitching aware of every noise and motion around her. Then the baby scampers into view, and if we're lucky, maybe two, mimicking Mom as best they can on wobbly legs.

The relationship between man and beast is not without its ups and downs. I regularly declare war on patio spiders, palmetto bugs and the thousands of no-see-ums and mosquitos that annoy me during an evening stroll. My nerves stayed tense last fall wading through knee-deep water during hurricanes Frances and Jeanne, praying that I would not cross paths with an alligator or water snake.

Over the years we've collected favorite stories of animals that have crossed our path. Like the wounded owl we found trapped in a fallen pine tree. We transferred it to the cat carrier, transported it to the Birds of Prey center in Maitland, and after its sprained wings healed, it was released back in its home area. Then there was that stray sheep covered in thick dirty wool that literally spent two days resting on our doorstep one hot August. Have you ever seen a sheep's face up close — its pale pink lips, nose and gentle eyes?

I could go on about the beautiful hawks, the noisy ospreys, and the majestic eagle family that lost its nest during the hurricanes. Or about the summer evening when we were sitting outside and my husband said, "Don't say anything, but turn around very slowly...." we watched wide eyed as a family of raccoons paraded across our pool deck.

It is a delicate balance for man and beast to share our precious corner of Seminole County. Which brings me to a sad and serious place. Two weeks ago, here in Geneva, someone murdered a pregnant miniature donkey and her unborn colt. Georgette was shot a dozen times with a pellet gun at close range while confined to her pen. What could possess someone to commit such an act of animal cruelty? I didn't know Georgette but I grieve for her and also for the wild turkey that was run down by a four wheeler last year. I arrived on the scene too late to help and found a second frantic turkey pacing beside its dead companion. 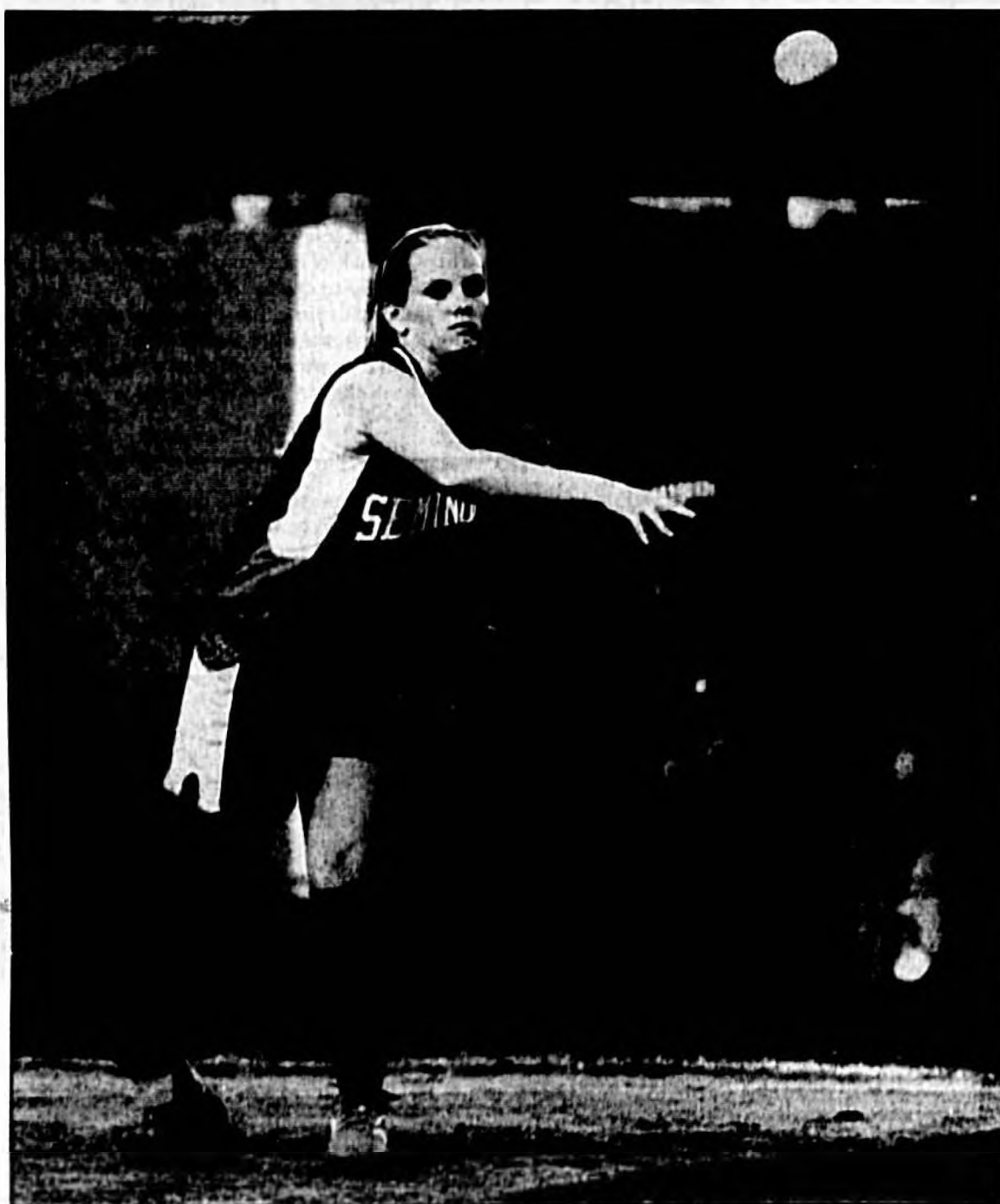

Florida alligator harvest permits available

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) is offering hunters a great opportunity to take part in its annual statewide alligator harvest, which runs Sept. 1 through Oct. 8. Since 1968, Florida has offered these alligator hunts, which provide a thrilling, hands-on, face-to-face hunting adventure that is unlike any other hunting experience imaginable.

This season, more than 4,000 Alligator Harvest Permits will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Permit holders are authorized to take two alligators from designated areas during specific harvest periods.

Sale of these permits begins at 10 a.m. (EDT) July 6. Applicants have their preference of applying at any county tax collector's office, license agent (retail outlet that sells hunting and fishing licenses), online at MyFWC.com/license or by calling toll-free 1-888-HUNT-FLORIDA (486-8356) from anywhere in the United States or Canada.

To reserve a permit, applicants must submit payment for an Alligator Trapping License and two alligator-hide validation tags, or provide proof of a valid Alligator Trapping License (must be valid through Oct. 8) plus pay the fee for the two hide validation tags. No other hunting licenses are required.

The cost for a Resident Alligator Trapping License and hide validation tags is \$272, and non-residents pay \$1,022. Any hunter who takes an alligator must complete and send in an Alligator Harvest Report Form. The information gathered from these forms enables FWC biologists to monitor population trends and impacts of the annual harvest.

An Alligator Trapping Agent License is also available for \$52, which allows the license holder to assist a trapper in taking alligators, but only in the presence of the permitted trapper. All persons seeking a harvest permit must be at least

Permit recipients are not required to attend, but first-time participants are strongly encouraged to do so. Courses will be offered in July and August, and permit holders will receive, by mail, permit packages listing exact dates and locations.

SOME HOLIDAY ADVICE FOR BOATERS: KEEP AN EYE ON THE WEATHER

Here's a tip for boaters this 4th of July Weekend: keep an eye on the weather. Perfect conditions or not, many boaters will take to the waters of central Florida this holiday weekend and law enforcement officers urge them to pay close attention to weather reports and approaching storms. Experts in the Boating and Waterways section of the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) remind boaters that summer storms in Florida can pop up quickly anytime and anywhere, and without too much notice.

"Most areas in the FWC's 12-county Northeast Region have experienced nearly non-stop rain for the past month and it looks like the stormy weather is going to continue through the holiday weekend," said Joy M. Hill, public information coordinator for the FWC's Northeast Region.

Here are a few important things to remember while boating:

• If you are on the water, head to shore at the first sign of an approaching storm.

• If you are not already wearing a life-jacket, put one on as soon as you see a storm approaching. You may not be able to outrun the storm and once it hits, it might be too late.

• Avoid boating in thunderstorms or other nasty weather. Visibility is reduced and it can be difficult to see other boats,

channel markers, and other fixed or floating objects.

• If you must be out in bad weather, be sure your navigational lights are on, unnecessary lights are off (which promotes better night vision), and use a spotlight so you can see and be seen.

• Though most people fear the lightning produced by summer thunderstorms, and rightly so, the wind and torrential rain are far more likely to cause a boater serious problems, like swamping and instability.

There are nearly one million registered boats in Florida and it is likely many of them will be under way in celebration of Independence Day. If you are one of those, boating officials want you to have a safe trip.

Remember, safe boating is no accident.

While the spring boating season may have started off slow due to inclement weather, BoatU.S., the nation's largest recreational boat owners association, says several factors are leading it to predict a significant spike in July 4th weekend waterway traffic.

Requests for on-the-water assistance to the BoatU.S. 24-hour dispatch centers on the East and West Coasts have traditionally been a reliable indicator of recreational boating volume on the nation's waterways.

"To date we've seen lower than usual numbers for Monday to Friday call volume, with higher than usual volume on the weekends. The Memorial Day holiday surpassed our previous estimates of a modest increase. This trend of strong weekend 'spikes' in boating traffic will likely continue during the July 4th holidays, with boaters trying to make up for bad weather and lost time," says Jerry Cardarelli, Vice President of BoatU.S. Towing Services.

In addition, Cardarelli notes that while fuel prices may have had an impact on weekday boating patterns, they won't be a factor on boating's traditionally busiest weekend of the year.

Cardarelli says that the top two reasons for calls for assistance are for tangled props and dead batteries. Crowded

anchorage leave little wiggle room to maneuver and it's difficult to see another boat's anchor line in the dark.

"The highest towing call volume — and when boaters should have the greatest concern — is expected after fireworks displays end on the evening of July 4. If you can, it may be better to anchor for the night rather than joining the mad rush back to the dock," he said.

That advice is echoed by Ruth Wood, BoatU.S. Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water President.

"Boating stress factors such as fatigue and long exposure to the sun will increase alcohol's effect on the body, so if you want to have a post fireworks drink, wait until you and your crew get home," she recommends. "A lot of boats are traveling fast, in different directions, in the dark and in close proximity to each other. Accidents happen very quickly — it's often too late to put on a life jacket after a mishap, so we recommend everyone wear one while heading home."

To prevent becoming a statistic, Cardarelli and Wood have these additional tips:

• For some boaters this is the one time a year they will operate at night, so ensure all navigation lights work before you go. Also make sure everyone aboard can use the VHF radio and that safety gear is readily available.

• Many boaters will go out early and raft up all day long running fans, sound systems or other appliances. Be sure to monitor battery condition to ensure there's plenty of juice left to start the engine.

• For trailer boaters, the surge in 24-hour dispatch center call volume for roadside BoatU.S. Trailer Assist & Tow assistance is expected to be on Friday, July 1 as trailer boaters head down the highway to their vacation spots. The two biggest causes for trailer breakdowns are flat tires and locked bearings so check both before you go, and have a complete spare tire — inflated on the rim — available. Also stop along the way periodically to check your rig.

• Take your time, have patience and don't rush home after the fireworks show. Don't take shortcuts and post a lookout with a spotlight.

"Conference USA is also geographically attractive to our fan base and that is a very important factor."

UCF will join Marshall, Rice, SMU, Tulsa and UTEP as the six new members of C-USA. The returning schools in the league are East Carolina, Houston, Memphis, Southern Miss, Tulane and UAB.

All of the C-USA institutions sponsor football. The conference will continue to sponsor 19 sports - nine for men and 10 on the women's side.

"I am pleased that UCF will be affiliated with similar institutions athletically," commented Orsini. "All schools will be playing the same sports. Similarly, UCF will be aligned with programs that put an emphasis on academics."

League members have enjoyed great success in recent years, making C-USA one of the top conferences in the nation. This past season, five league football squads participated in bowl games. The conference has ties-in with the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, the GMAC Bowl, the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl, the Wyndham New Orleans Bowl and the PlainsCapital Fort Worth Bowl.

Also in 2004-05, the conference sent four squads to both the men's and women's basketball NCAA Tournaments. Additionally, league teams advanced to both the 2005 baseball and softball college world series.

"This is an exciting step, but challenging as well," said UCF men's basketball head coach Kirk Speraw. "We are going to play a better caliber of opponent on a nightly basis. The level of intensity and competitiveness will be a huge change."

In January, C-USA announced a six-year television agreement with ESPN and CSTV. Through 2011, 10 regular season football, six regular season men's basketball and three regular season women's basketball games will appear on ESPN or ESPN2. The networks will also air the championship final for each sport.

CSTV will broadcast regular season football and men's and women's basketball games. The network will also air the championship games in volleyball, baseball, softball and men's and women's soccer.

Additionally, CSTV is scheduled to broadcast early round coverage of the men's and women's basketball tournaments.

"Moving to Conference USA will give us the opportunity to play more competitive schedules," said UCF softball head coach Renee Lauer-Gallagher. "There is the added bonus of playing on national television, which will only help in the recruiting process."

Led by Commissioner Barton Barkowicz, C-USA is one of several conferences showing significant representation in the

NCAA governance structure. The league celebrated its 10th anniversary during the 2004-05 academic year.

UCF will move to the league after annually dominating the

competition in the A-Sun. During 2004-05, the Golden Knights swept the men's and women's all-sports trophies for the third straight time. UCF claimed conference titles in five

sports (men's basketball, men's soccer, men's tennis, softball and track & field). Overall, the Golden Knights won 13 all-sports trophies in the A-Sun - seven women's and six men's.
