

#### Killing The Deer

At last Florida sportsmen are beginning to do something about the plan of the State Livestock Board to annihilate all the deer in South Florida as part of a program for eradicating the cattle tick. Beginning September 10 it is proposed to lift all game laws in the State protecting deer, and actually to organize bands of cattlemen, march them through the woods of South Florida, and killvery deer that can be found.

According to members of the State Livestock Board, this is the only way the cattle tick can be handled. They ontend it doesn't do any good to dip the cattle as long as the ticks continue to thrive and multiply on the deer. Insisting that it is impossible to dip the deer and that the ticks transfer from the deer to the cattle as fast as they can be de-ticked in the dipping vats, the Board declares that the only way to rid the state of the ticks is to kill

We have been wondering for some time why the sportsmen of Florida didn't band together in an effort to combat this wholesale destruction of one of our most interesting assets. There are not many places in the country any longer where deer can be found, and Florida is one of the few states in the union with sufficient wilderness nd game life to attract hunters from other states.

For years stricter and stricter game laws have been enacted to protect our wildlife. Most of the native hunters, as well as those who come here from other states, have proved themselves to be good sportsmen, and have observed the laws of the State and the rules of the woods, sufficiently well so that during the past few years there has been an actual increase in many kinds of wildlife. Deer particularly have been well protected for a number of

According to the State Veterinarian, after the cattle tick has been eradicated, the woods will be restocked with deer, and the damage will not be felt. We fear, however, that this is easier said than done. It would take a good many years to replace all the deer that will be slaughtered under the present plans of wholesale destruction. And furthermore, even if it could be done, there is grave likeli-tood, politics being what it is, that it never will be.

We believe there must be some other way of meeting


