A. Although there are some brokerage houses which will probably not allow you to open an account in spite of the 18year-old majority rule, you will find many firms that will. In addition to the general in formation on the account form, such as your Social Se curity number, bank and employment information, you will most probably need a birth certificate or a driver's license as proof of your age. Several houses will require a signed statement stating your permanent address, and that the office where you are opening an account are in the same state. Last, but not least, especially in the eyes of the brokerage house, your parents or guardian will be required to sign an account gaurantee, even if you are entirely self-supporting. Most brokerage houses will look forward to your business and take the time to help you not only purchase securities, but also to become reliable and

Q. Do you have any predictions as to how the stock market will perform over the next few months? - A.R.J., Long

Q. I have been looking at Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITS) as a possible investment since generally the return is very high. Do you have any comments as to the pros and cons of such an investment? - R.G.M., St.

A. Probably the major potential drawback of a REIT investment is that the prices of their shares are particularly sensitive to the prime rate. Most REITS are lenders of money rather than investors and find that as lenders their earnings grow as the prime rate grows. Conversely, if the prime rate is frozen or declines, their earnings also decline. Notwithstanding that risk of fluctuation, REITS are gaining a larger share of new construction financing each year. The figure last year of REITS' share of construction in the U.S. was \$4.8 billion. Yet REITS did not even finance 12 per cent of the total lending required by the construction industry. Thus as an investment, the REIT industry has merit. The return of a

Committee Chairman James Redman said about 25 articles of impeachment against Adams, 56, will be presented to the House within the next month.

Two-thirds of the House must vote to bring the charges to send them to the Senate for trial.

If the House concurred with the committee, it would mark only the fifth impeachment in Florida history. No official has ever been convicted in the Senate where a two-thirds vote also

is required. "On the basis of our findings and the action we took," Askew said in a statement, "together with reports I've received on the select committee's hearings. I strongly disagree with the degree of the action by the majority.

Holy Week Observance

Immediately preceding Easter, Holy Week was from the first observed as an intensive commemoration of the sufferings of our Lord. "It is," wrote Staley, "a mirror reflecting in orderly sequence and detail the Passion of our Savior." in connection with this week. The week beginning with Palm Sunday is Holy Week-or, in the Greek Church, Great Week. Each day of this week is especially designated to the use suggested by the events recorded in Scripture. Through the week, the final intensive preparation of repentence is accomplished in anticipation of Easter Day

Holy Week is referred to in the Apostolic Constitution in the third century. A little later the Easter motif ruled from Palm Sunday to Pentecost (50 days after Easter). Athanasius, Bishop of Alexandria, Egypt (328 A.D.), on a trip to Europe found not only Lent, but also Holy Week, in full devotional use, and upon his return to Egypt he urged stricter "fast" upon his people "lest they become a laughingstock". This week is the week of the very depth of personal repentance. Each day of this great week has special significance assigned in the Gospel accounts, as Christ moves with the dignity of divinity from the triumph of Palm Sunday to the humiliation of Good Friday.

Reliving that last week with Jesus of Nazareth is difficult. Reading the account will help.



Price Controls Needed Why Voluntary Compliance May Work

When President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the bill creating the Office of Price Administration in 1941, he recalled the statement made by Woodrow Wilson as he urged the American people during World War I to use selfrestraint in consuming scarce commodities such

But in 1941, Americans found it necessary to institute tight controls on themselves to make sure there was enough guns and butter. By the end of the war, the OPA had blossomed into a massive bureaucracy of 63,274 workers augmented by roughly 150,000 volunteers manning local rationing, rent and price boards.

There were nine regional OPA offices with 4,535 workers, and 15,000 district offices with 54,941 employes serving individual communities or counties. During its four-year existence, the OPA instituted over 280,000 enforcement orders against violators of price, rent and rationing regulations, winning 95 per cent of its court

Five years later, in November, 1950, the Truman administration was forced by rampant inflation to create the Office of Price Stabilization, a modest 12,500-man bureaucracy which went out of business in April, 1953. Rent controls and rationing were not instituted.

In its effort to control the price of food, the OPA began with a freeze on all prices and quickly followed up with regulations on individual commodities. The OPS began with a general price ceiling followed by general regulations for some broad food categories. There were parity adjustments for some foods, and profit margins were frozen.

Widening Horizons

The recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling that states must be allowed a wider latitude in choosing members of their legislatures under the one man, one vote principle, based on a Virginia problem, is a recognition of reality.

Since 1962 when the Supreme Court first ruled that state legislatures also come under the one man, one vote formula, the trend across the United States of Ameirca has been toward the utmost mathematical precision regardless of the local equities.

The Viriginia ruling is particularly significant because it is the first of this nature by the Supreme Court since the 1970 census. It would portend the mood of the current court as well as the trend for the coming decade. It appears the trend will be to weigh fairness as well as mathematics.

Black marketeering never was a significant problem during World War II, says one old OPA hand, and wouldn't be today if controls were instituted. There was not then and is not today, enough serious shortage of essentials to make a black market worthwhile, it is argued.

This, then, is how the United States approached the task of controlling food prices during times of recent national economic stress. Today, with food prices soaring to the point of mocking wage increases, some talk is heard in supermarkets and at cocktail parties about bringing back an OPA or OPS.

But President Nixon, in announcing the imposition of temporary wage-price controls in August, 1971, stated:

"Let me emphasize two characteristics of



When you tap politicians from many places in both parties these days, you quickly discover they aren't eager to talk much about the 1976 presidential race. They seem to sense that the American voter wants a respite from constant political clamor.

People got the idea, and they weren't far wrong, that there was almost no break between the 1968 and 1972

Almost exactly four years ago, in mid-April 1969, a sizable bunch of us political reporters went trouping after Sen. Edward Kennedy on a 4,000-mile, three-day swing through Alaska. The announced purpose was a Senate subcommittee inquiry into Eskimo and Indian poverty but the real thing was, it was Kennedy's first major pub lic outing since the assassination of his brother Robert the previous June.

The trip was one of the funniest adventures in recent political history, and yielded up a considerable tonnage of "Kennedy color." Later we trailed him to the South o some eastern college campuses and other spots, all in the name of gauging him for the 1972 nomination.

Meantime, Sen. Edward Muskie for 1969's first six months dutifully pounded the Democratic banquet circuit. trying to capitalize on his popularity as Hubert Humphrey's 1968 running mate. It did him little good, and he declared at mid-year he was bowing out to Kennedy. Then, in late July, came the tragedy on the bridge at Chappaquiddick, which took Kennedy out and brought Muskie back in. Thereafter, things just went on and on. It isn't like that this time. Kennedy will have some peo- q ple traipsing after him when he goes to see Alabama's

Gov. George Wallace July 4, but we won't need a 747 to carry the entourage. The word meantime is to lie low. Sen. Walter Mondale of Minnesota, one of the regular mentionables for 1976, is keeping quietly active. Friends of Sen. Henry Jackson of Washington say he's serious about another try, but they're just about the only ones

discussing it. On the Republican side, the steady political bloodhounds have all written their "whither Agnew" and "whither Connally" pieces, and there really isn't anything more to say until one of them does something visible and decisive. The only twist has been a little early surprise interest in the venerably vigorous Gov. Nelson Rockefeller.

It isn't only the boredom of the electorate that's holding things back. In 1974, big governorships are at stake in Massachusetts, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Michigan and California. Nobody wants today to anger some needed party faction by plumping for a presidential candidate who may turn out to be divisive. That job is on the line this year in New Jersey, and those fellows never heard
