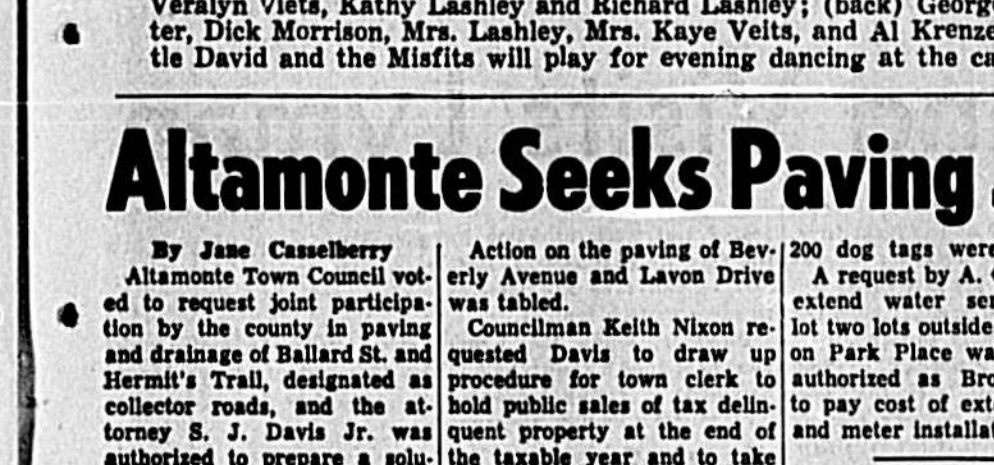

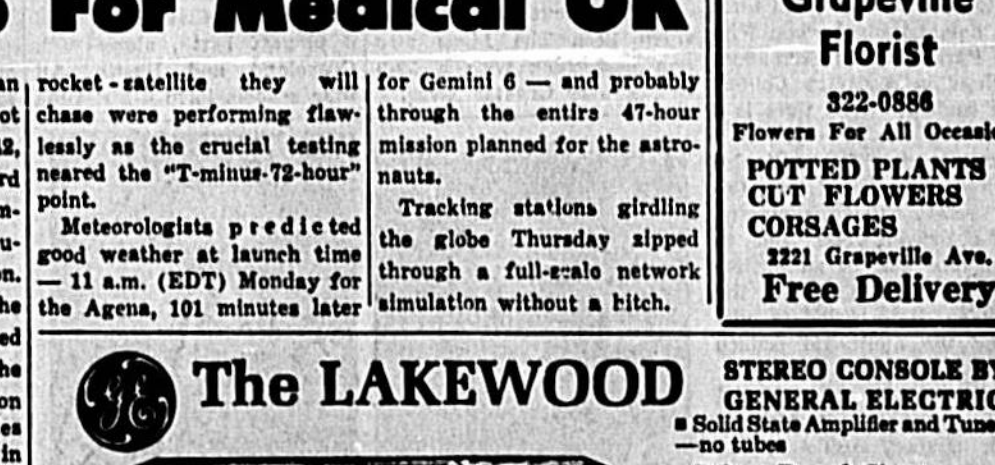

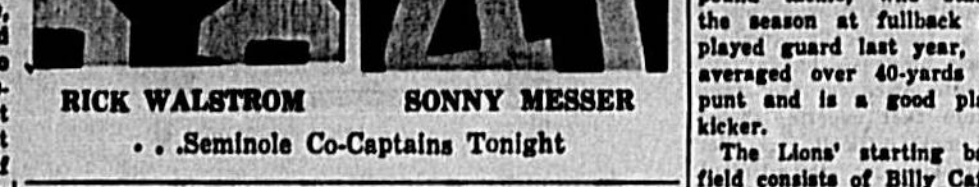
The Lions and the Highlanders have equal records of four wins and one loss with each team losing to Umatilla.

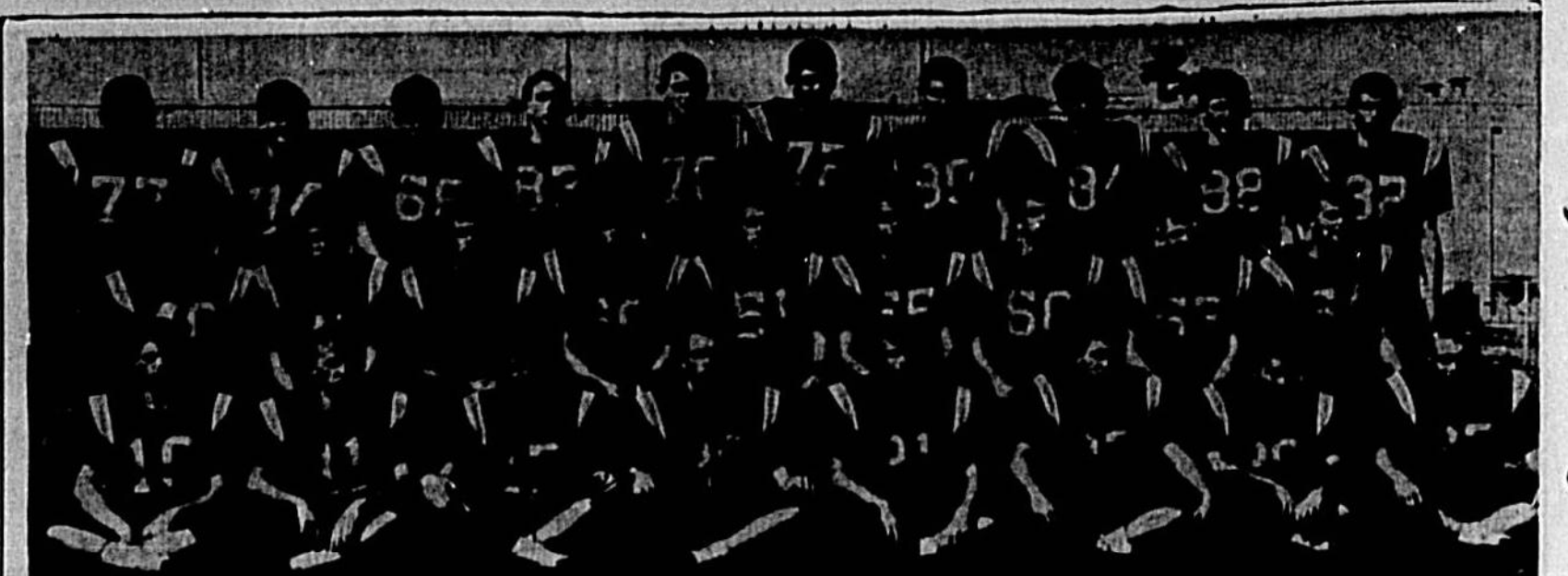

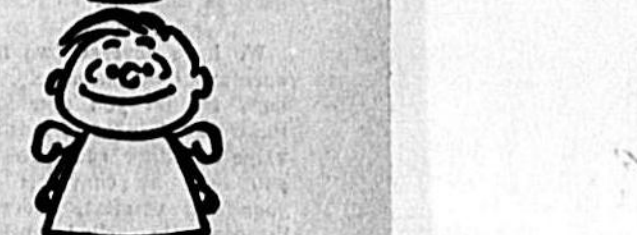

# Word Power Way To Success

Written for NEA Special Services Between this and that, you find you're stuck. Find a word of power. And suddenly it's a breeze. By this time it should be clear, at least to regular readers, that these articles have attempted to simplify the so-called problem areas in spelling. There is tremendous common sense in spelling the English language, despite all the digressions by those who profess the desire to help in such spelling problems.

It does not give much help, though it may give confidence to be told that most of us cannot do it, for example, between these two words: "control" and "control". CAPE KENNEDY (UPI) — History's first attempt to complete two spacecraft in orbit failed today when the target rocket, 36-foot Agena, failed to go into orbit.

The Agena rose in what looked like a perfect launch at four seconds after the planned lift-off time at 10 a. m.

Pleased to soar in pursuit 11 minutes later were astronauts Walter M. Schirra and Thomas Stafford aboard the Gemini 6 spacecraft.

First indication that anything had gone wrong came at 10:08 a. m. when contact was lost with Agena's main radio transmitter.

When the Carravon, Australia, tracking station reported failure to contact the rocket at 10:24 a. m., officials canceled the mission.
