1,500 REFUGEES OF MOORE HAVEN ARE AT SEBRING

Orlando Newspaperman Returns From Scene of Disaster on Lake Okechobee; 100 Known To Be Dead

ORLANDO, Fla., Sept. 22.—(AP)—First hand news of the horrors of the situation at Moore Haven following the hurricane of last Monday were brought to Orlando by the Reporter Staff, who has just returned from three days and nights in that district.

According to Mr. Lewis Story, Moore Haven is no more. Where once stood a thriving community of about 1,000 persons now is covered with one to five feet of the waters of Lake Okechobee. Sixty of the inhabitants of the little town in the heart of the treacherous Everglades were buried last night.

NO LIVES LOST IN HURRICANE AT PENSACOLA

Property Damage Will Total Approximately Two Million Dollars; Damage At U. S. Air Station Will Be Heavy

MOBILE, Sept. 22.—(AP)—Confirmation of earlier newspaper reports that Pensacola had escaped the hurricane without loss of life was made this morning when over a wire of the American Telephone and Telegraph company from Pensacola into Mobile, a representative of the Associated Press at Pensacola stated that no lives were lost but property damage would reach \$2,000,000.

Local Relief Committee Makes Plans To Provide For Refugees Coming Here

A committee of Sanford citizens moved today to care for all refugees of the hurricane and flood areas who may come to the city for work, food or shelter.

The first refugees to arrive here included 22 negroes, workers on the truck farms of the Moore Haven district, who came in late last night. The men were taken to the Goldsboro section of Sanford, where many negroes live, and through the work of two ministers, shelter and food were obtained for them. The refugees are staying in the Colored Growers' Association warehouse.

Negro Section Of Miami Has Little Damage In Storm

MIAMI, Sept. 22.—(AP)—The negro population of Miami, which occupies a segregated part of the city, was almost unscathed by Saturday's hurricane.

There were a few cases of injuries and some property was destroyed but practically every home was still tenable after the storm had passed. The negroes refused to believe that the danger was over, however, and hundreds remained indoors until today.

List Of Injured

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., Sept. 22.—(AP)—An official list containing more than 1,000 names of persons in hospitals, both permanent and temporary, in Miami, was made public today by authorities. The list contains the name of every person in the hospitals and includes children lost from their parents and a number of homeless persons and the names of hundreds of persons not considered seriously hurt.

MIAMI Dead Expected To Be More Than 250; 3,000 Injured Receive Treatment

MIAMI, Sept. 22.—A search for additional dead and care for the injured and homeless went on today among Florida's storm-devastated lower east coast, late reports from all sections of the hurricane area showed a death toll of more than 400; a missing list of 150; more than 600 injured and 50,000 homeless. Varying estimates from the mile coastal area in the path of the gale placed the property damage between \$50,000,000 and \$100,000,000. Rescue workers believed a complete search of the tangled wreckage in the score or more stricken towns and cities and counts of the bodies cast up by the waters of Biscayne Bay, will swell the death toll to more than 700.

Seventy Missing At Hollywood

A missing list of 70 in Hollywood was expected to increase 40 known dead, as the bodies were being recovered. Many have been found at the approach of the storm, is thoroughly searched for possible casualties. Two hundred and fifty injured persons have been given medical attention.

Twelve Killed at Fort Myers

Twelve persons lost their lives at Fort Myers, on the west coast, were killed at Lake Park, virtually in a score of small cities in the territory between West Palm Beach and Miami, the east coast report scattered casualties ranging from one to seven.

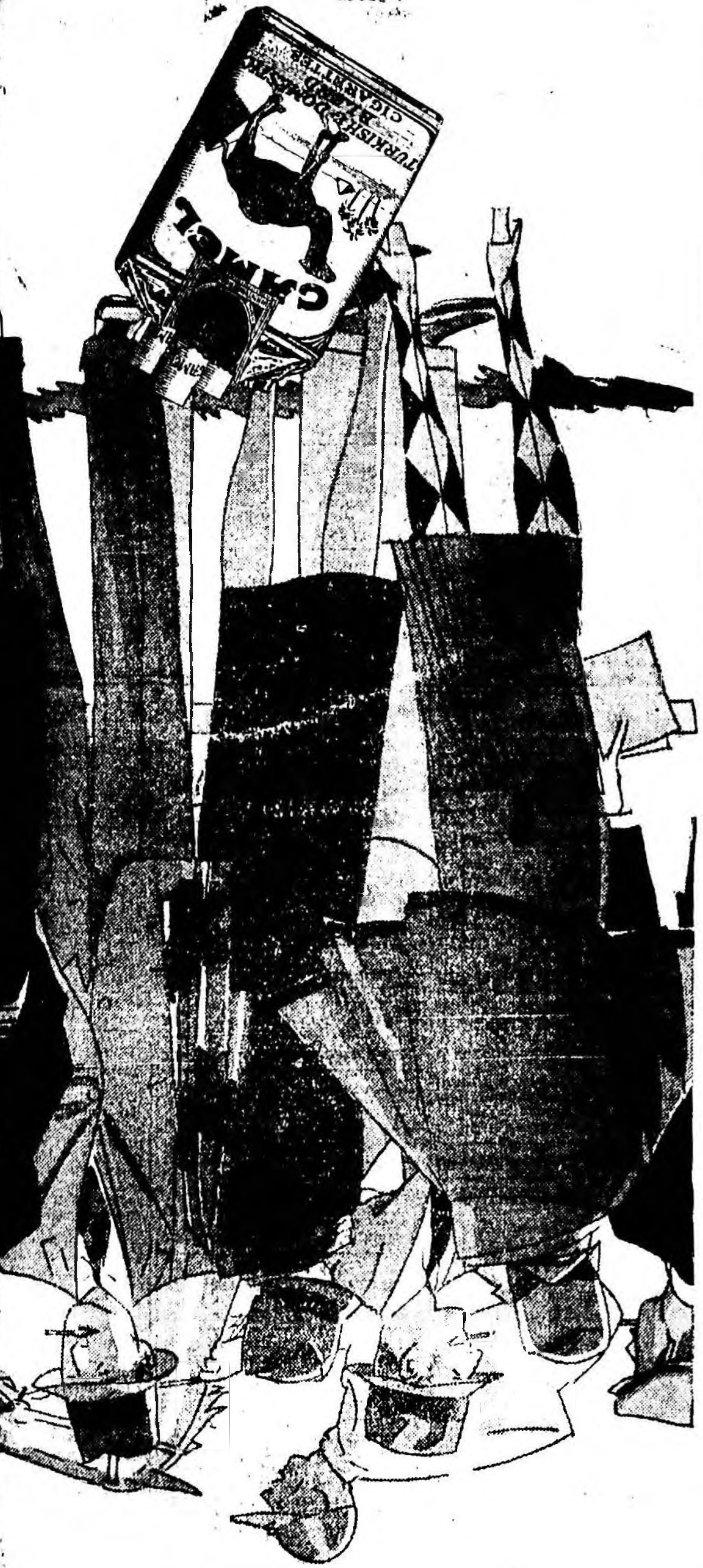

IS BLAMED FOR REDUCED CROPS

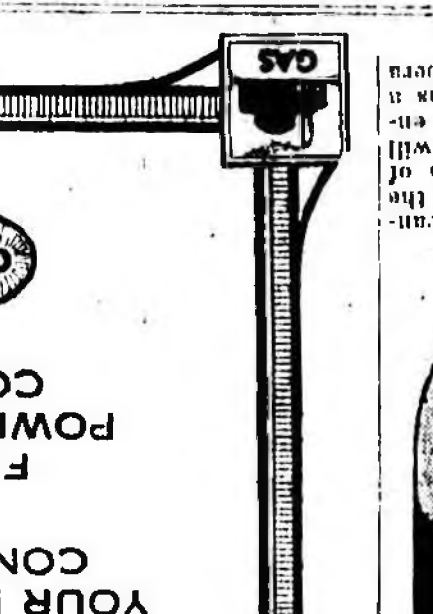

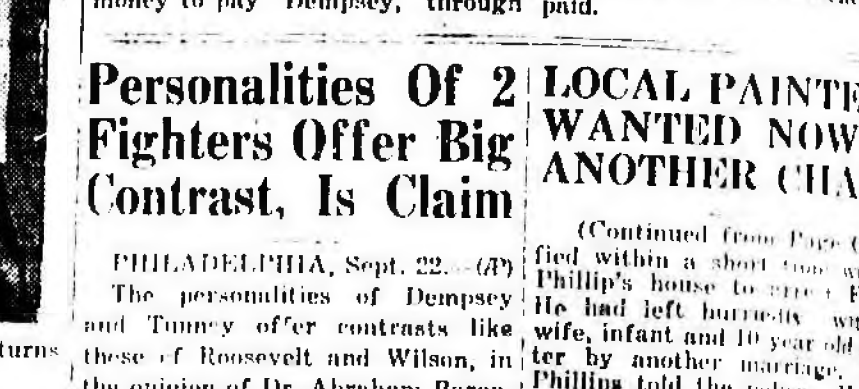
