Federal Money Sought To Improve Country Life

WASHINGTON (AP) - A new national activist group called Rural America Inc. is opening a four-day conference here cailing for more attention and federal money to help improve country living.

An estimated 1,500 participants gathered here today for the opening session of the meeting, billed as "the first national conference on rural America." They planned workshops and discussions on a wide range of social and economic topics from rural health care to farm policy. Sen. James Abourezk, D-S.D., told the gathering that American cities have become too big while "our rural areas and small towns have been depleted and deprived of

"Most of the nation's poor housing is in rural areas, yet most of the money goes to cities," Abourezk said in a prepared statement. "The same is true for aid to poor people, manpower training programs, education aid, elderly assistance programs and innumerable other areas."

Change Of Venue Sought

WASHINGTON, N.C. (AP) - Defense lawyers for Joanne Little, charged with killing a jail guard she said tried to rape her, begin arguing pretrial motions today. Attorneys Jerry Paul and Karen Galloway will ask Judge Henry McKinnon in Beaufort County Superior Curt to move Miss Little's first degree murder trial away from the county. Miss Little, a 20-year-old black, is charged with the ice pick slaying of Clarence Alligood, a 62-year-old white jailer. Alligood was found nude from the waist down in Miss Little's cell. The case has attracted the attention of women's groups interested in establishing a woman's right to defend herself in rape cases.



No matter what the situation may be - good, bad or indifferent - some people will try to take advantage of others by hook or by crook.

Just as this great nation of ours is about to celebrate its Bicentennial, some folks are trying to turn it into a Buy Centennial.

This is evidenced by the numbers, which are growing daily, of 'junk' items turning up everywhere as souvenirs to be purchased com-memorating our 200th birthday as a free and independent nation.

Steve Nostrand is executive director of Third Century, one of about 20 firms which has been licensed by the American Revolution Bicentennial Association in Washington, D. C., to sell sanctioned products.

Nostrand said from his Miami headquarters that the retail market is "being inundated with junk that is reflecting on the Bicentennial itself." He said he is supported in his thoughts by many retailers throughout the state who are balking at selling some Bicentennial merchandise for fear of

being accused of exploiting the event.

Here in Seminole County lately we've even had
an Orlando firm — Merchants and Consumers Discount Association— soliciting area merchants for advertisements to be placed in an unsanctioned Bicentennial publication.

Jack Horner, Seminole County's Bicentennial Committee chairman, has let it be known there is no magazine published that has the sanction of the

Horner said his office has been deluged lately with telephone calls from county merchants inquiring as to whether the committee is behind the magazine for which the advertising solicitations have been going on.

Horner has said he is in receipt of a letter from a John E. Sheffy, identifying himself as president of the Merchants and Consumers Association indicating his company is publishing a magazine.

Anyone using a Bicentennial logo (the official insignia of the American Revolution Bicertennial Commission) without official permission "could be

the early 1970s, and animosity between the two governments developed, particularly over the reatment of each other's nationals.

Hundreds of Vietnamese were slaughtered in village pogroms in Cambodia in 1970. Cambodians living in Vietnam's Mekong Delta provinces charged repression.

I have made analyses of selected offices and units to determine for myself the effect of eliminating men and women in uniform and out. In every case, which included studies of work done by each individual, I concluded between 15 to 25 percent of the personnel could be dropped with an increase in efficiency.

It is therefore my belief that a 20 percent ersonnel cut is called for. As a strong believer in national defense, for the above reasons I am convinced we could reduce
