Heston added that he wants his son to spend much of his childhood in the woods of Michigan. The Hestons have a thousand-acre place near St. Helen, Mich., 200 miles north of Detroit, That's

where Charlton grew up.
"I think it's much less healthy for a boy to grow up in a city atmosphere," he observed. "You have to instruct him in so many things. Like 'Don't accept rides from strangers' and 'Play only in front of our house.' In the woods, you don't have to develop such in-hibitions. Kids grow up much freer. Boys especially: I don't think there is so much-difference with girls.

"Also, it's a much healthier life in the woods. The air is clean and fresh, and a boy is outside and active most of the time. We have no TV and no radio."
