

MEETING AT SAVANNAH MAKES OFFICIALS THINK TIME IS RIPE TO DO SOMETHING

A campaign of vigor and far-reaching importance has been decided upon by the Atlantic Deeper Waterways Association to arouse congress and the country to a realization of the need of improving the canals and streams of the eastern part of the United States. J. Hampton Moore, mayor of Philadelphia, is president of the Association.

The Association held its fourteenth annual meeting in Savannah, Ga., last month. The convention was so successful that the officers decided that the time is ripe to urge action upon the program of insuring the plan of a continuous inside water route from Maine to Florida. The next convention of the Association will be held in Porland, Maine.
