Will Run \$23 Million School Budget Eyed

By BILL SCOTT. A tentative 1969-70 school budget will be considered by the Seminole County School Board during a special 3 p.m. Monday meeting.

Walter Teague, board finance officer, said he would have the budget ready for the board to consider possibly today and a Monday meeting was set to consider the proposal to operate the county's 28 schools.

Because of less money for construction, due to problems of inflation and interest rates going up on the board's proposed bond sales, money to build needed facilities is expected to be less than a year ago, but because of expected increases in local and state funds, the overall budget is expected to be at least \$20 million above last year's \$22.5 million.

At the regular Thursday meeting of the board held in administrative offices on Commercial Street, the educators heard Teague explain how \$324,419.45 in interest was earned by the board by investments of money from the bond issue approved by county freholders in May, 1968.
