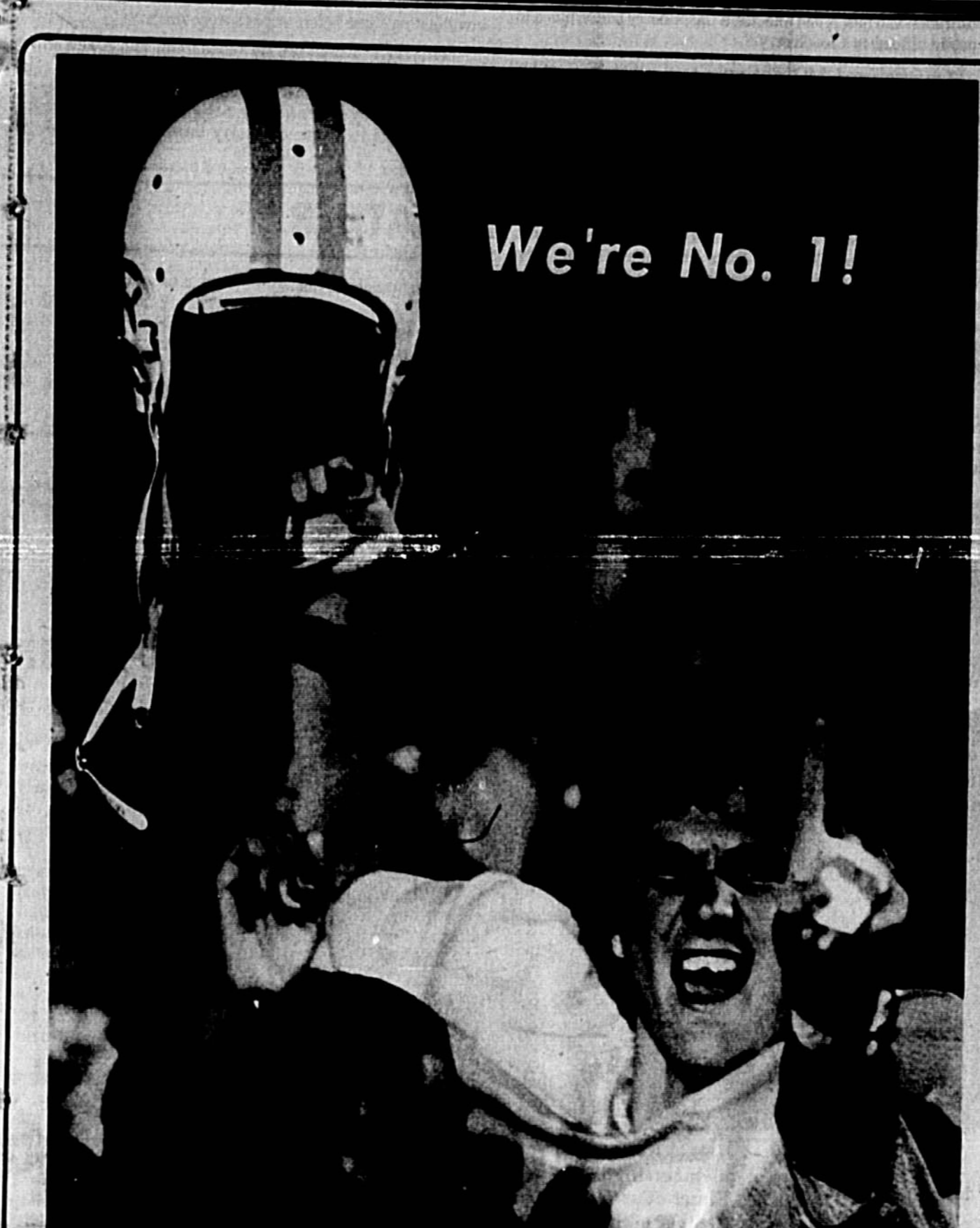

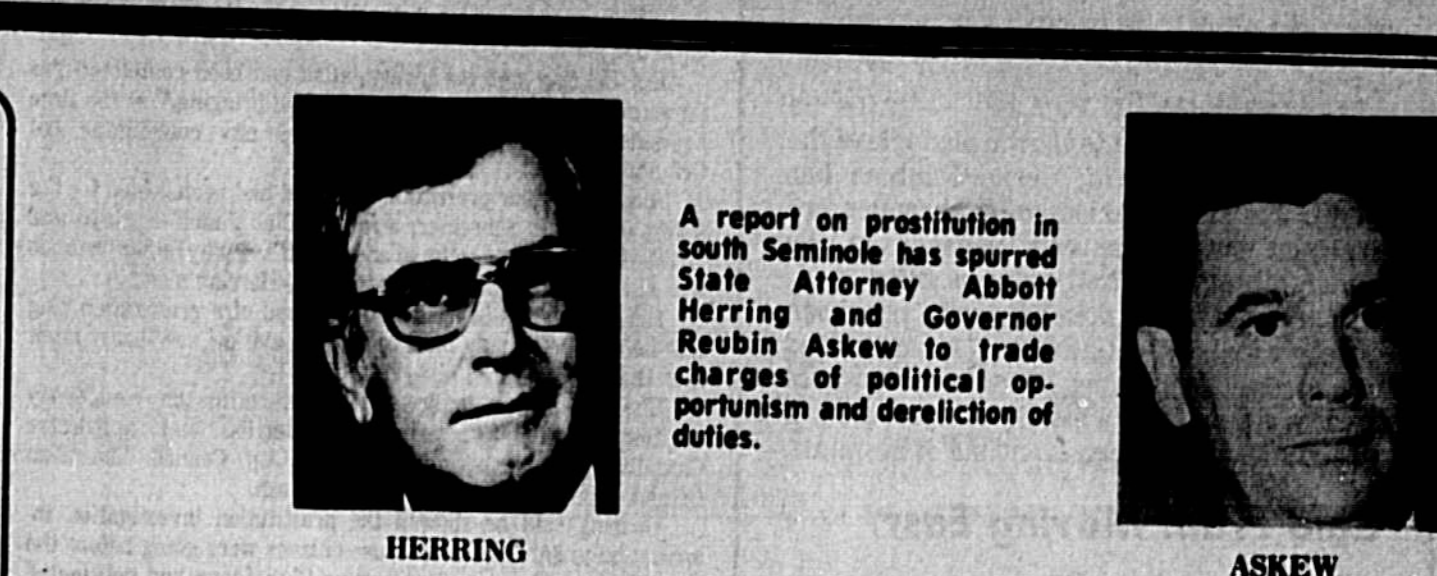

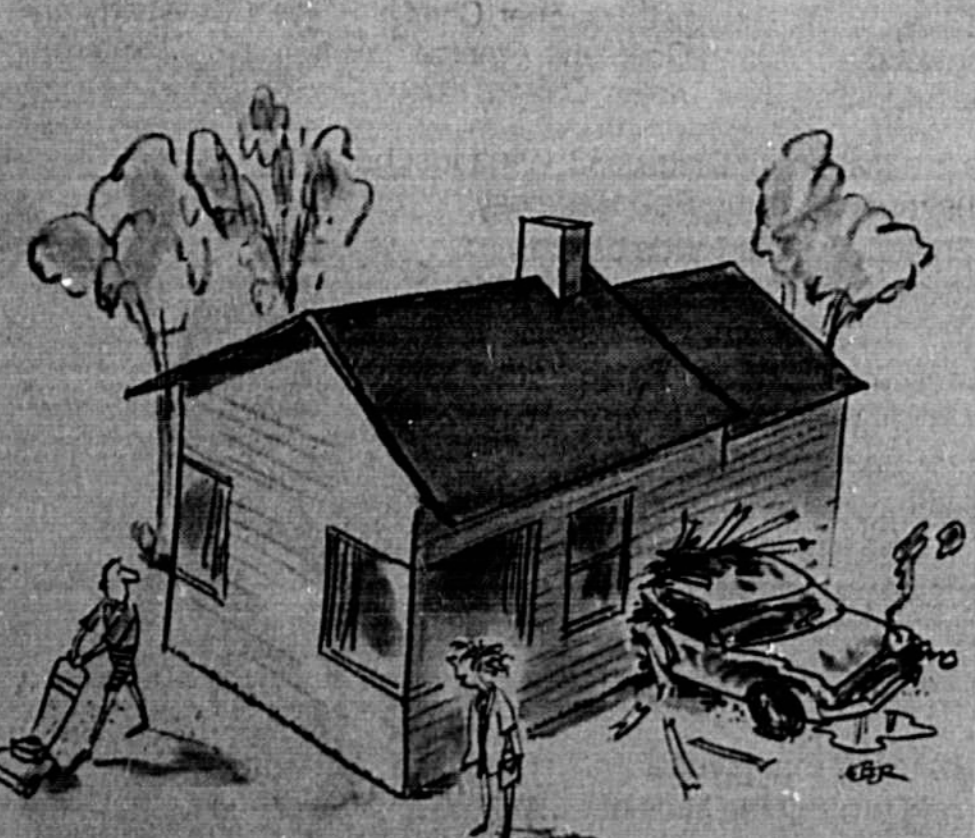

abusing the power of his own office." Askew said he could not retract an instance in which a state attorney released a portion of an investigation before the investigation was even completed. Askew said it is Herring's responsibility to determine whether or not there are grounds for criminal charges. He said Herring released the report prematurely.

"It is one of the most distressing cases I've ever seen," the governor said.
But Herring said the investigation had been completed "as far as criminal charges were contemplated bringing," at the time he passed information to Casselberry city councilman Sal Orlando.

A misdemeanor prostitution warrant had been issued for the arrest of Donald Schreiner, a former Club Juana employe and former Longwood councilman and sheriff's deputy, when Orlando was shown results of the investigation, Herring said.
Herring named Schreiner as the head of a prostitution ring that he says testimony links to Club Juana, a Casselberry night spot that has featured nude dancing.

Herring says the next move in the Casselberry prostitution situation should be by Askew. "I think the governor should rely something to me other than through the press. I've asked the matter be handled quickly because I feel that it is of concern to the citizens of Seminole County."

Both Herring and Polk said the prostitution probe connected with Club Juana was a spinoff from the sheriff's department probe into alleged theft of drugs (marijuana) from the Casselberry Police Department evidence locker and delivery to the 18-year-old prostitute, Casselberry police detective Bobby Gene Bennett has been arrested on felony charges in connection with the missing marijuana. Bennett has been suspended with pay pending outcome of the marijuana case.

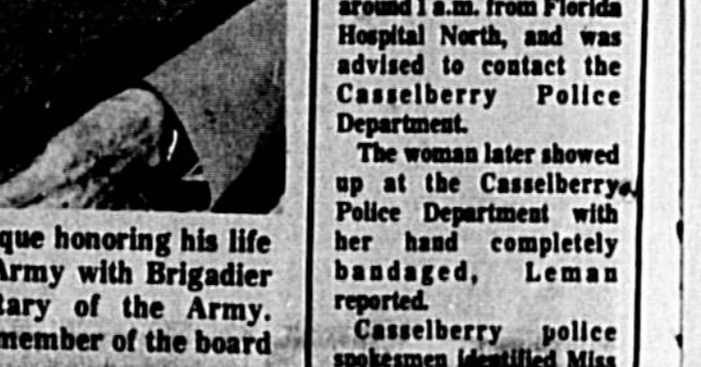

Askew: Judge Elections 'Appearance Of Conflict'

ORLANDO — Quoting the late Winston Churchill the "facts are better than dreams," Florida Gov. Reubin Askew stopped off here Friday to push for a constitutional amendment that would eliminate election of appellate judges.

Under amendment 2, appellate judges would be required to receive a confidence vote by a majority of voters following each six-year term. The amendment will appear on the Nov. 2 ballot.

"The people have the chance to change a system," the governor said. The governor went on to say that 80 per cent of the judges, names never appear on a ballot after they're elected.

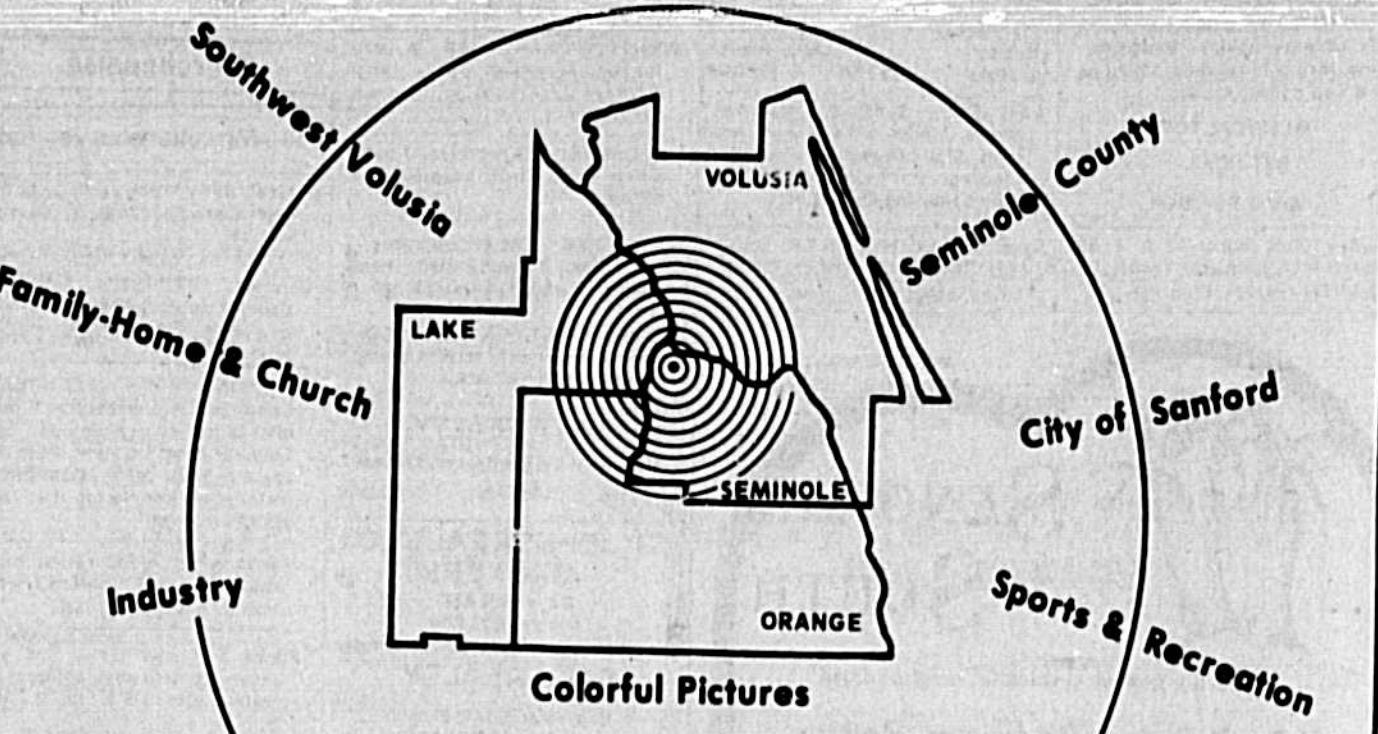

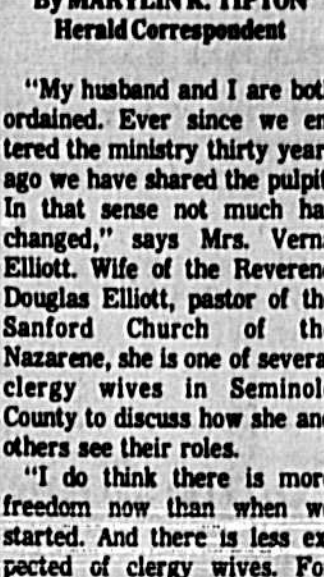

It that sense not much has changed," says Mrs. Verena Elliott, wife of the Reverend Douglas Elliott, pastor of the Sanford Church of the Nazarene, who is one of several clergy wives in Seminole County to discuss how she and others see their roles.

"I do think there is more freedom now than when we started. And there is less expected of clergy wives. For instance, at the beginning it was expected—or at least I felt it was expected—that I make every call with him. Now I don't do that. Physically I can't, but no longer do I feel it is expected of me either."

"There is one big difference now, not just for Episcopal clergy wives—but they have a housing allowance and are responsible for finding their own place to live rather than being furnished by the local parish with a house."

"You know," the surprisingly youthful and vigorous voice goes on, "it's nice to be honored, but... It leaves the sentence hanging, wistfully. "A lot of people think the minister's wife is someone who ought to be holy, who is practically married to God, whose children are perfect.
