Herring Snaps Back At Askew's Criticism

Seminole-Brevard State Atty. Abbott Herring said Saturday e feels Gov. Reubin Askew is derelict in his duties if Askew doesn't give a report on south Seminole prostitution "the appropriate amount of time and review."

Herring says he thinks Askew "would have been livid with rage" had he read the entire inch-thick investigative report and sworn testimony before blasting Herring in an Orlando news conference on Friday, charging that Herring is using his office for

political gain and threatening to send in a special team of state agents to look into Herring's probe of prostitution. itude of the problem and what we're talking about," Herring

"I think the governor is injecting politics because he's putting this thing on a political level," Herring said. "And I think what's going on in this county transcends any politics." Two hours after aides in Tallahassee told reporters that the

prostitution report hadn't yet been received by the governor's office, Askew was telling reporters at Orlando that Herring's investigation was "very disappointing" and confirming that he may do what Herring had recommended — send state agents to Seminole County to look into some of the information contained in Herring's report to the governor.

It wasn't immediately determined if Askew had read the entire report but Herring said he didn't believe that the governor "has read the entire report" including four sworn statements and investigative reports by both the city of Casselberry and the state attorney's office.

Askew appeared angry at what he said were "apparent leaks" by Herring about what the investigation entailed. "I am completely unimpressed with the way Mr. Herring has handled the investigation," Askew said.

Herring denied that he'd "leaked" information on the report. He said he had shown the information to a Casselberry city councilman because he (Herring) thought there was a need for information in a decision-making process. rears at tirst blush" that Herring disclose parts of the investigation to aid in his campaign for another term

Herring said he showed the prostitution investigation in formation to Sal Orlando because citizens were going before the Casselberrry city council protesting Club Juana and petitioning for revocation of the club's license.

"I felt at that time that the city must have information conerning someone who may be involved in the decision making process and may have a conflict of interest." Herring said. "I told Mr. Orlando that he could use the information if that person participated in the hearing (before city council), and it was absolutely necessary. I told him he could say he got the in-

formation directly from the state attorney." "Herring said 2 "master plan" revealed by prostitutes given immunity for testimony alleges a call-girl operation "which appears to be a service that would be available to high-ranking public officials . . . from the governor's office or congressmen when they come to this area."

Askew said information he has received from Herring's office concerns testimony of an 18-year-old prostitute. The governor said he tends to doubt the credibility of the witness. "There isn't sufficient credibility," he told reporters on Friday. Askew also categorically rejected information in the report which the governor said pointed toward use by state and-or national officials of the prostitution ring.

Herring said - besides recommending the governor send in state investigators to probe the prostitution allegations — that he also recommended that Askew "consider suspending from office" a Casselberry city official who has been "compromised" by the

Herring says the next move in the Casselberry prostitution situation should be by Askew. "I think the governor should relay thing to me other than through the press. I've asked the matter be handled quickly because I feel that it is of concern to the citizens of Seminole County."

"Although drug activity was uncovered in the Club Juana probe," Herring said, "the thrust of the investigation dealt with prostitution and how it had affected a Casselberry policeman and a public official in Casselberry."

I recommended that the governor send somebody from his office down here to see what is going on in this situation," Herring said. "I think the governor's office has the ability and authority to remedy the matter by suspension from office. I'm perfectly willing and happy to have him look into our investigation because it was initiated by Sheriff John Polk (Democrat)."

Both Herring and Polk said the prostitution probe connected with Club Juana was a spinoff from the sheriff's department probe into alleged theft of drugs (marijuana) from the Casselberry Police Department evidence locker and delivery to the 18-year-old prostitute. Casselberry police detective Bobby Gene Bennett has been arrested on felony charges in connection with the missing marijuana. Bennett has been suspended with pay pending outcome of the marijuana case.

Williams: A 3-Letter Man

Richard (Dick) Williams was a school teacher and athletic coach, the professional he was trained for, until the mid-1960's when he became disillusioned with the public school system. Holding a master's degree in physical education and health from the University of Florida, Williams turned his attention to land developing and then to public office when the "school system changed to something that was not what I wanted."

A native of Winter Park, he graduated from Winter Park High

School with the class of 1948, spent two years at Rollins and served four years in the U.S. Air Force, stationed in Korea for one year After his service stint, he graduated from Rollins where he attended on a baseball scholarship, taught in the Orange County school system for 10 years, also coaching football and baseball. In 1963, he joined the faculty at Seminole High School, teaching American History and coaching the football and track teams.

Williams developed the 55-to-60 acre parcel known as Trilby Bend after moving to the Markham Woods area of South *Seminole. "The impetus of growth was upon us. A lot of things ere happening, homeowners associations were being formed and I began attending a lot of governmental meetings," he said. He got involved in the Greg Drummond and John Kimbrough

county commission races in 1970. By 1972, he believed he had to get more involved then just by helping others. "I tried to recruit someone to run for the county commission — someone with the same philosophy. I waited until 15 minutes before the deadline and put my name on the line," he said. Dick and his wife, Lamar, met while students at Rollins, got

narried a year later and recently celebrated their 20th wedding anniversary. They are parents of two daughters, Gray and Kerry, and two sons, Greg, and Kirk. 

Butz Departure Was A Necessity

For a President to jettison a member of his Cabinet only a month before election day seems to break all the political rules. Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz had to go, however, and resident Ford can now hope to repair whatever damage has been left in the wake of this 11th hour crisis in his administration.

The circumstances may keep the political damage to a minimum. Mr. Ford has not idiated the performance of Butz as the head of the Agriculture Department or as the chief salesman for the farm policy of his administration. On that score Butz has maintained a high degree of popularity among many farmers for his dogged defense of free market economics and an end to dependency on government quotas and subsidies

But no amount of political stock in the Midwestern states could excuse the incredible and utterly reprehensible remark Batz made within the hearing of at least two people aboard an airliner last August. This is not the first time his firing from the hip has caused embarrassment to the White House. He has a sharp tongue, and a store of colorful expressions to season any dialogue. This in itself is no liability, and Butz's frankness on a odium has doubtless contributed to his success. But vulgarity of speech is no asset, and trying to be witty at the expense of someone else's race is ofensive in public or private.

It hardly needs to be said that Butz's racial slur is miles away from anything we would expect to hear from a member of President Ford's official family, and Mr. Ford personally has no apologies to make for his own attitudes on race. Nonetheless there was no way for the President to right an obvious wrong other than to accept Butz's offer to

This campaign seems to have produced an unusual number of apologies, fuller explanations and clarifications. Vietnam **Problems** Remain

WASHINGTON — There's not much news ou Vietnam these days. But some idea of what's appening there has been pieced together by contacts in Hong Kong.

Item. Vietnamese forces move at will into theastern Cambodia. It is not clear as of this writing whether Hanol intends permanent occupation of this area, important as a north-south Hanoi and Phnom Penh have been quarreling

Pumpkin Supply Said To Be Off Normal Yield

bright orange vegetables to carve into jack-o'-lanterns. There have been scattered reports from individual growers

in the Midwest that this year's pumpkin supply was down. But the U.S. Department of Agriculture doesn't keep statistics on over-all pumpkin production. And one USDA spokesman noted that rumors of small crops are common just before big selling seasons.

While the federal government has no way of keeping tabs

on the pumpkins that are sold at roadside stands, usually only a few miles from where they are grown, it does measure the number of pumpkins at 41 major terminal markets. The 1976 figures are not yet complete. But a smaller crop would be a reversal of a trend. From 1974 to 1975, for example, the amount of pumpkins by weight, unloaded at the terminal markets, increased from 27.6 million to 29.8 million pounds, a boost of about 8 per cent.


