None of the experienced and devoted leaders who have served the community through the chamber of commerce could minimize the built-in difficulties which the Mercer program must overcome.

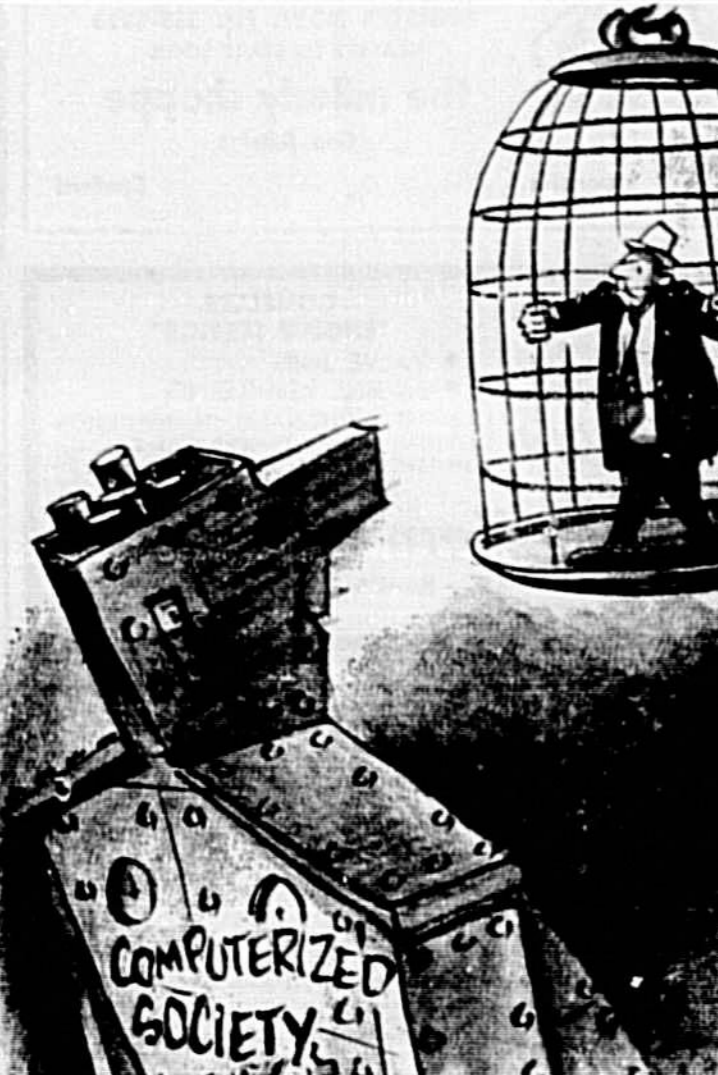

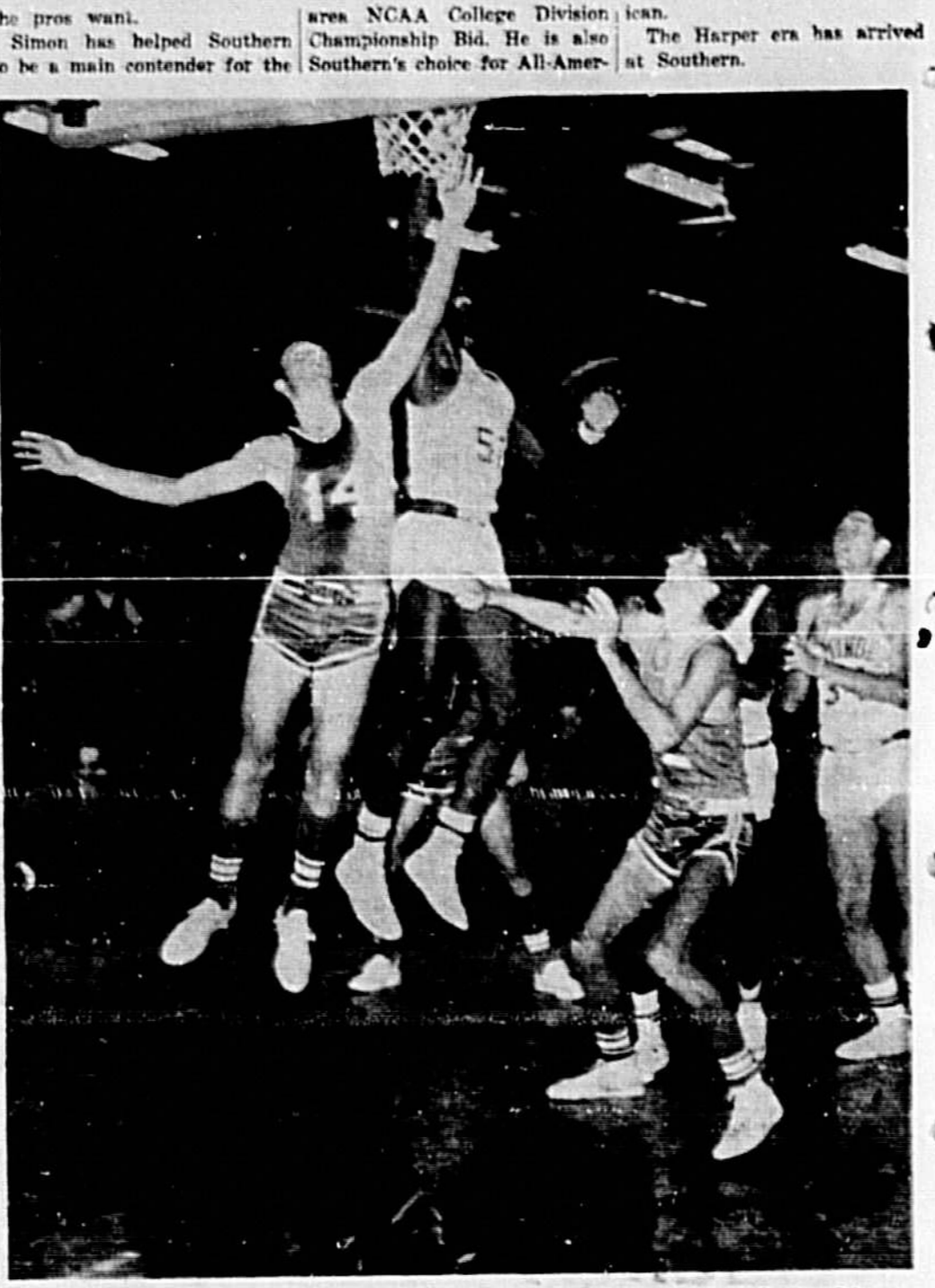

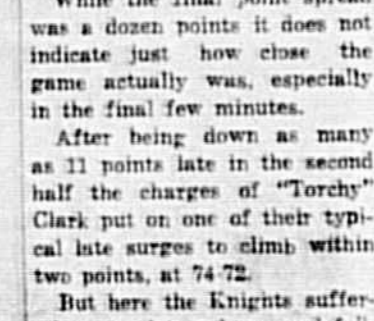

The jury, called in November by the Antitrust Division of the U.S. Justice Department, heard testimony Monday from Jack Kemp, former pro quarterback and president of the Players Association and Alan Miller, former AFL player and legal counsel for the association.

"I prefer the family settlement over federal legislation," said Miller. "I don't want to see the Golden Goose scuttled."

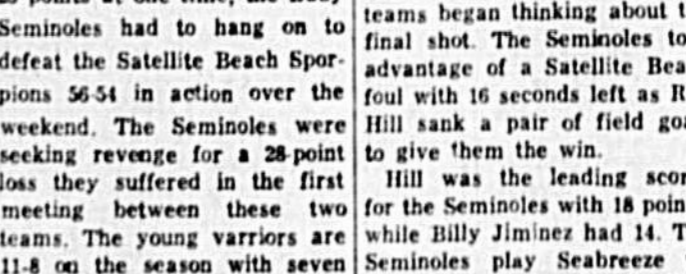

Future Of SR 46 Now Is Uncertain

The uncertain future of planned renovations to SR 46 west by the State Department of Transportation (DOT) due to reported remarks by two of the five Seminole County commissioners has caused the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce long range planning committee to become involved.

This was disclosed Tuesday to The Herald by Douglas Stenstrom, planning committee chairman, who stated he would call his group into session to ascertain the situation.

Stenstrom reacted to word that County Commission Chairman Greg Drummond and Commission novice John Kimbrough had indicated having some reservations about purchasing four-lane rights-of-way to permit the renovation of two traffic lanes by the DOT at state expense.

Layer replied teachers were paid by rank and this was a state law.
