The speaker cited a couple of well known and brilliant golfers who don't follow-through.

There have been, no doubt, some unorthodox players who have won distinction on the links. Some people can hit a golf ball by not keeping the arm straight, some can raise their heads and still knock the cover off the pallet, and some can sink putts by chopping at the ball. But we are inclined to believe that these people are good golfers in spite of their accentricities and not because of them.
