## STIFF BATTLE BEING WAGED UPON HUGHES

### Senator Hill Scores Jurist As Greatest Champion Of Property Rights In U.S.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12—(AP)—Senator Hill, Democrat, Washington, joined in the attack against the nomination of Charles Evans Hughes as chief justice of the United States today as the nomination was returned in the senate.

Senator Hill made reference to the birthday of Abraham Lincoln and added "what a contrast that the senate should create the birthday of the greatest champion of human rights since Jesus Christ, walked the earth in consideration of the greatest champion of property rights in a nation for chief justice of the United States."

"Masses of our people are finding it difficult to earn a living and to buy a little food and clothing for their families," continued the Washington senator. "The Jews of Mr. Hughes on economic questions are not an insignificant factor in the legal world."

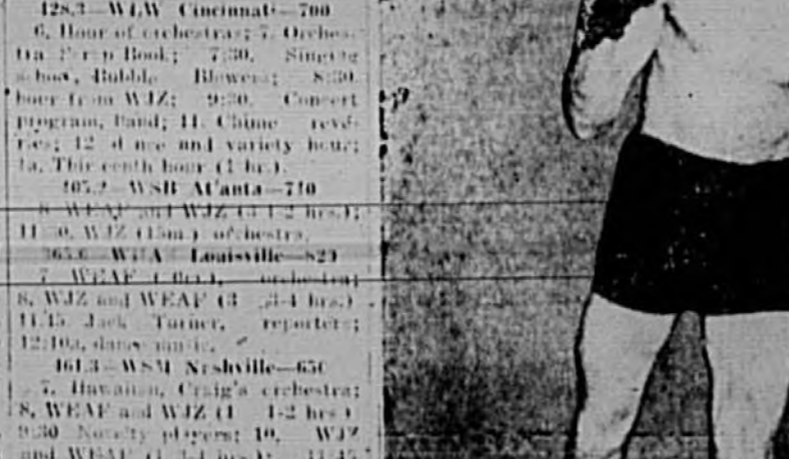

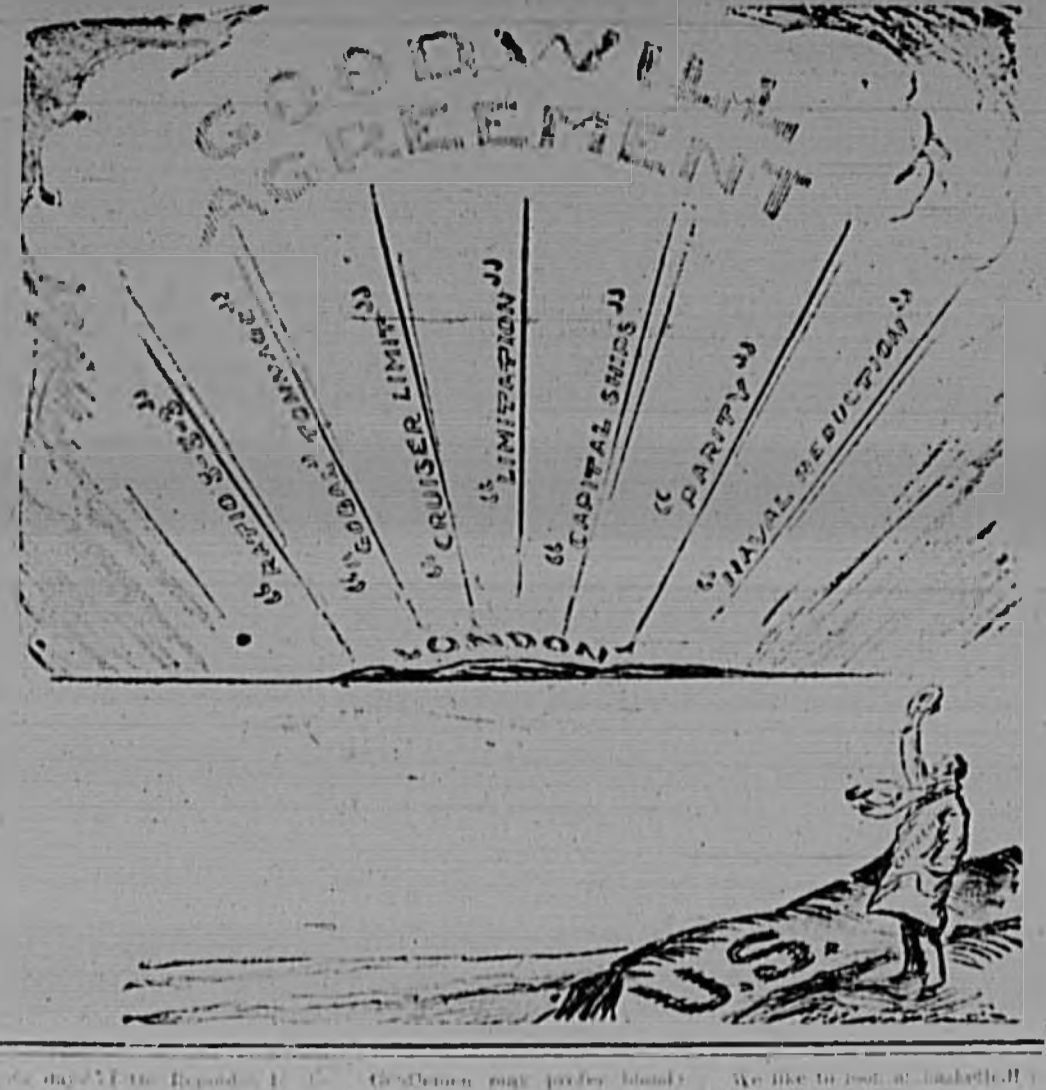
Senator Fletcher's Advice

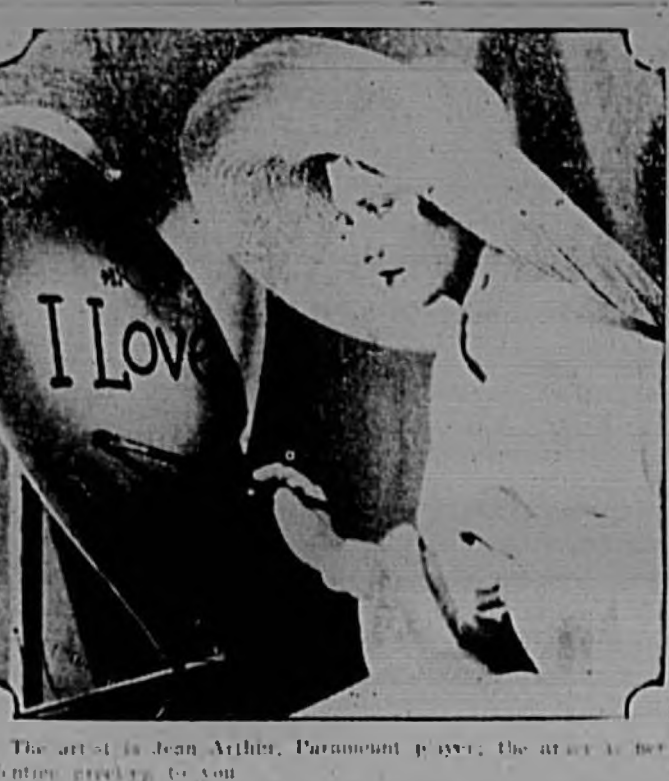

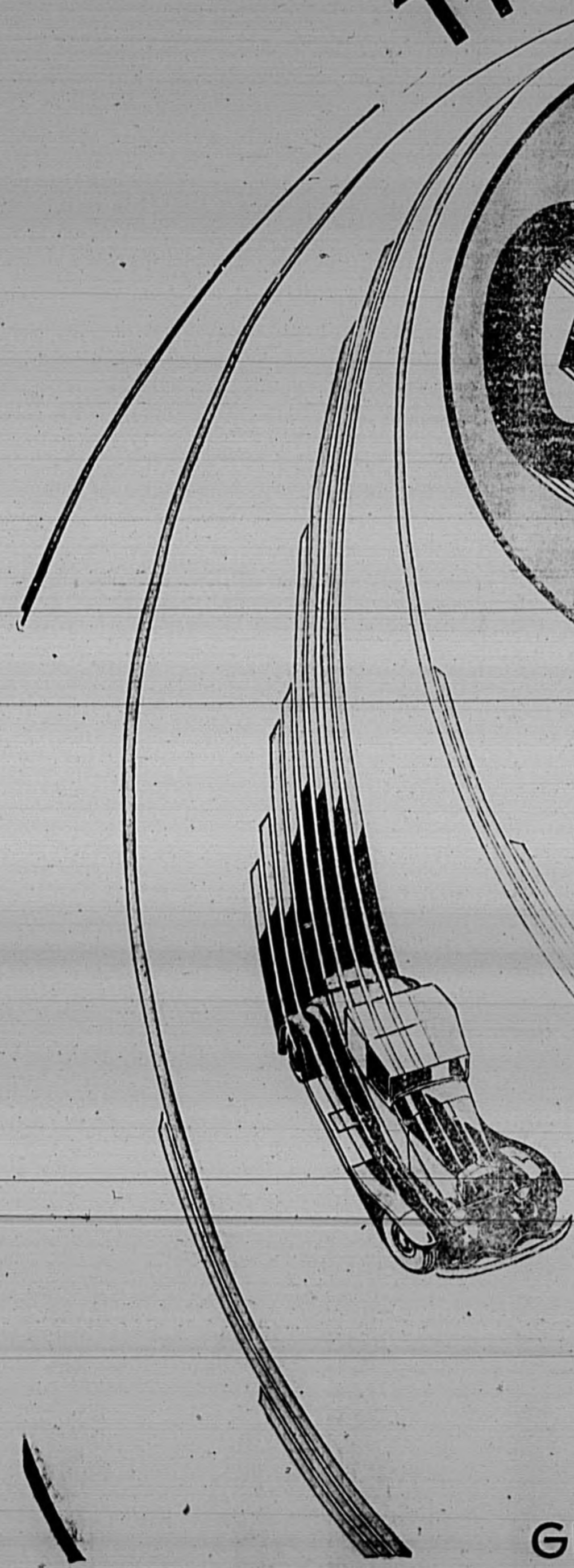
