Sports Spotlight By J Richards Herald Sports Editor "It's all up here," Greg Hecht pointed to the space behind his ear, adding, "It's discipline. Self-discipline and you've got to have it." Hecht, a former sailor stationed with Heavy Attack Squadron 12 at NAS Sanford from 1966-68, was back in town and instead of swinging jet aircraft equipment around for a living, he was swinging a golf club, something he had often done at Mayfair Country Club.

Former NAS Golfer "But that was just throw a couple of bucks in the pot and play a round," the tanned Scarsdale, N.Y. club pro grinned. "Now it's for real." "Not that I've made any real money on the winter tour (he's been on the Florida circuit for two winters now.) I think I cleared \$70 so far, this year, and that sure doesn't pay expenses," he added. Sitting around the Mayfair clubhouse sipping a coke—"training," Greg says with a grin—he explained more of his ambition to be a professional golfer.

"I started out caddyng and even when I was stationed here in Sanford I would still write friends back in New York to keep me in mind if they had an opening. I got the job in Scarsdale when I got out. I was lucky. I would have taken any kind of job around a club. It's outdoors and I like golf. One day I'd like to go on tour, but the security of a club pro comes first. We'll let the tour take care of itself," he said.

Right now, the winter tour plays a big part of Greg's approach to golf. It keeps him sharp and polishes the edge on his game. He shot a less than shining 76 during the first round, but wasn't worrying about that at all. "I try to get each finished round out of my mind. It doesn't pay to brood," he stated.

"...All Up Here "It's all up here," he repeated, pointing once again to his head. "I'm getting my game and myself together," the bachelor thoughtfully spoke. "This game is 90 per cent discipline. Self discipline, and that doesn't come easy."

"So far I've had pretty success from tee to green. I'd put myself up against anyone from tee to green, but I'll say I've had at least 40 putts this winter that didn't drop when they could have. That's something I've got to work on."

But, the trip to Florida isn't all work for Hecht. His parents live in Ocala and the likeable young pro is planning a two-week tour to visit them soon. "The winter tour is great. It gives me a chance to keep my game in shape in the winter and to get the valuable experience of constant competition and playing under pressure. He had confessed to not seeing any old friends in Sanford, but tried like so many other young ex-military men as they think of some old chieft they would sneak off late to play a few holes with instead of performing some mental tasks. Whenever he could, he said, he would be playing golf when he wasn't around the base. Greg was taking it easy. Relaxed. With fellow New York club pro, Jim Buchanan of Rochester, they spoke of the security of being a club pro.

Neither is adamant about being on the PGA tour. The money is fine if you're consistent player. But both were heavy of spreading the cash out too fine, despite what Tom Weiskopf said earlier this year, the money is clumped together too much for the top finishers leaving the struggling pros to wait at the mercy of sponsors, home clubs and luck. Money Has Meaning Speaking of money, Greg doesn't belittle his meager earnings. No one gets rich on the winter tour. Not unless they win more than their share of times. But the money—and this applies to any professional whether it's athletics or any other endeavor—has a much deeper meaning.

Club Pros Take Mayfair Lead With Five-Under 67 Rounds

"We've almost got too many pros out here," stated one Mayfair Country Club employee, beaming over the many sub-par rounds and the first round ace recorded by John Calabria and a trio of 68's some had by early afternoon thought would start.

But a new trio—club pros—shaded some sparkling rounds turned in during the morning session with five-under-par 67s and a host more pros filled in to bring the number of sub-par golfers to 42.

George Lewis, Jim McCoy and Jerry Cardey carried their leading scores as temperatures picked up considerably from Tuesday's pro-am.

Mark Albin, who set Mayfair buzzing with his superb 64 in the pro-am, showed how easy it is not to be good, skyrocketing to an 80 in his first round. "Yesterday everything he did was right on it, but today he was all over the place," one pro said quite quizzically.

Calabria, who shares 68s with Bob Brune, Doug Ford, John Genet and Pete Cooper, held out the par three 150-yard seventh from the tee.

After the high-powered rounds eight golfers came in within 69 rounds, Austin Slab, J.C. Goetz, Steve Benson, Robert Alton, Pete Trellant, Jim Albus, Bob Lenzion and John Molenda.

Pin placement and tricky greens, especially the undulating ninth caused many three-putt holes, cutting into several scores throughout the day, especially as the better professionals consistently made greens at or below regulation.

Lewis, of Lake Worth corded all his sub-par holes on the front nine for a sparkling 31 to tack on to his par 36 back nine effort. Joyce and McCoy, both New Yorkers, came up with eagles during their rounds. Joyce came up with his on the 12th while McCoy found the range on the eighth.

Station sailor Greg Hetch, who carded a 76 after a five-year absence from Mayfair and is now representing Scarsdale, N.Y. as a club pro said it was nice to be back in town. This was his second year on the winter tour and while he's harboring only a few fleeting thoughts of one day joining the touring side of golf life, he finds the winter tour meeting his needs.

The steady golf helps keep me sharp, and I need the experience to get my game and myself together," he said. "I've had a few good rounds, but my putting has been hurting me," Hetch added.

The clear, sunny weather brought out quite a crowd of any kind is welcome by the pros. Most pro felt at least a repeat 67 or 68 would be needed to keep leaders in their places.

Eight under rounds of 64 were recorded during the pro-am event earlier and optimism ran high for some really low closing round scores.

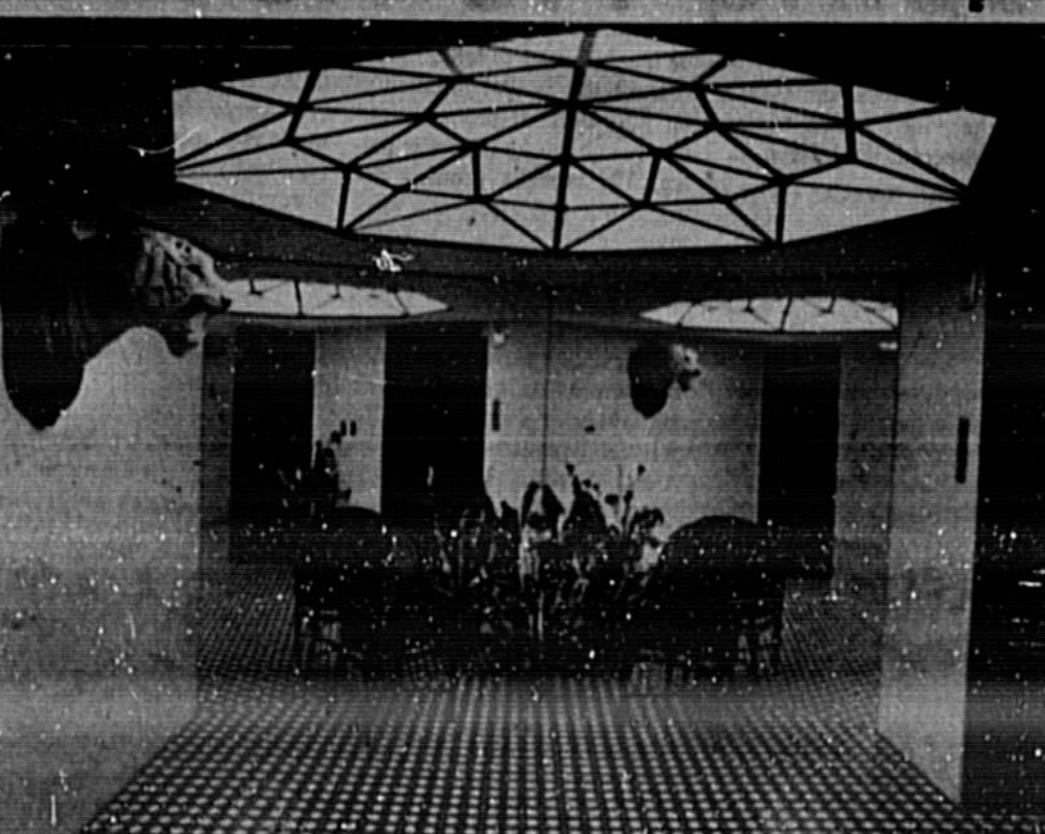

Mirror Magic Works Wonders In Homes Where Space Is Limited

But more than that, mirrors perform an array of other functions. They can expand, even double the space of the room, or at least make it seem that way through the illusion they create.

Homeowners are using mirrors to bring the outside view into their home, to repeat the scene of an attractive furniture grouping or a beautiful painting on the opposite wall.

Today's mirror, of course, is a more refined product than the looking glass of old, a superior grade of polished glass, free from distortion, which can be

something out of a movie magazine. A bedroom with a mirrored ceiling is useful for grooming. In the kitchen, the cook can check the progress of a meal on the stove while sitting in the breakfast nook.

But there are other ideas in the functional field. As a top for night stands, dressing tables or other furniture, mirrors are a protection against spilled liquids.

Designers are constantly thinking of new ways to add exciting new dimensions to the home through the mirror.

With mirrors the normal eight-foot suspended ceiling seems to be 18 feet high. Small rooms take on new dimensions.

Lamps, stained glass windows, works of art, sculptures can be enhanced, multiplied and even seemingly rearranged with mirror clusters on the ceiling.

A: Contrary to some popular beliefs, turning lights on and off for a short period of time does not use enough electricity to be concerned about. But in the case of fluorescent lighting, the life of the fluorescent tube is shortened about two hours each time it is turned off.

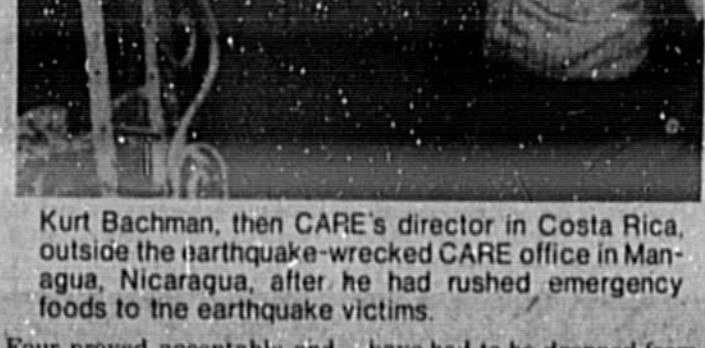

WASHINGTON (AP) — Every federal income tax return is checked for what the Internal Revenue Service calls "overall credibility" by the agency's computers.

If a taxpayer goes over the norm by a large amount in one area, say deductions for contributions, but is below or at the average in other areas, his chances of being audited are probably less than those who are above the average in all areas. That's what the IRS says it means by "overall credibility."



But this shouldn't deter taxpayers in searching for every possible deduction and claiming every penny if they are entitled to them, the IRS says.
