

Nixon's Council on Interational Economic Policy estimated the increase in the dollar value of oil imports, saying it would rise from \$9.3 billion in 1973 to \$25.0 billion ir. 1974, adversely affecting the U.S. balance of payments and its trade

But because other nations depend more heavily on Arab oil than the United States, the sharply higher oil bill will not affect the dollar severely in 1974, the report said.





Education Notebook High Court Bolsters Bilingual Education

The U.S. Supreme Court again has taken ablic education out of the professionals' fumbling hands in a ruling that could benefit millions

of non-English-speaking pupils.
In addition to ordering the San Francisco school system to improve educational opportunities for about 1,800 Chinese pupils, the Jan. 21 decision could rejuvenate lagging efforts to improve schooling for about two million Spanish-ancestry youngsters and thousands of other pupils who speak little or no English.

The court also reemphasized its strong belief in the great importance of basic education skills. This decision also illustrates the logical longterm consequences of government legislation in education in terms of added costs of all types. something perceived dimly, if at all, by those

adopting such legislation.
In his majority opinion in Lau vs. Nichols,
Justice William O. Douglas cited California's education code that says: "English shall be the basic language of instruction in all schools:" that the state's policy is to insure "the mastery of English by all pupils in the schools;" that high school diplomas will not be given pupils who have not met proficiency standards in English; and that makes children age 6 to 16 "subject to compulsory full-time education."

"Under these state-imposed standards," the opinion says, "there is no equality of treatment merely by providing students with the same facilities, textbooks, teachers, and curriculum; for students who do not understand English are effectively foreclosed from any meaningful education.

"Basic English skills are at the very core of what these public schools teach. Imposition of a requirement that, before a child can effectively participate in the educational program, he must already have acquired those basic skills is to make a mockery of public education.
"We know that those who do not understand

The petitioners sought a ruling under the "equal protection" clause of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution and asked that the school board, "be directed to apply its expertise to the proble, and rectify the situation."

For undisclosed reasons, the court did not address the constitutional issue, relying instead of Section 601 of the 1964 Civil Rights Act and related federal rules and regulations. The act and related regulations ban discrimination in any federally financed program.

"It seems obvious that the Chinese-speaking

minority receives less benefits than the English speaking majority from respondents' school system which denies them a meaningful opportunity to participate in the educational program - all earmarks of the discrimination banned by the regulations," the court said.

The court did not define, ". . . a meaningful opportunity to participate in the educational program . . . ," but ordered San Francisco schools to fashion unspecified "appropriate

That relief could require many more special classes in English and Chinese, at a cost of thousands of dollars. If the court's theory is extended to Spanish-speaking pupils nationwide, the impact will be enormous.



on Capitol Hill. The agreement he signed would keep the committee members from talking about depositions by presidential crony Bebe Rebozo, about the milk producers' campaign fund scandal, or Rose Mary Woods' list of secret campaign

The wording of the agreement was so broad that congressmen and staffers could have been considered in contempt if they discussed some matters that have already appeared in newspapers.

The material involved was subpoensed by Common Cause last summer and, although part of the material has become public, much of it has been held under court seal. Nixon campaign lawyers are determined to keep these depositions from the public gaze.

FOOTNOTE: When our associate, Bob Owens, queried the committee about Doar's original pledge, a spokesman for Rep. Peter Rodino Jr., the committee chairman, said it was a routine legal move. But he said that due to the criticism, Doar now planned to withdraw the agreement in favor of committee subpoenas. Yet some committee members have omplained that the subpoena legislation Doar drew up for the committee is faulty.

PETROLEUM PALS: Oil industry critics have long suspected that cozy relationships between major oil com-panies have helped keep bids on federal energy rights artificially low. Now there is evidence of this in a deposition from Otto Miller, board chairman of Standard Oil of California, taken for a California legislative committee. Miller was explaining how Standard, Atlantic Richfield and Humble got together to negotiate a joint bid on some California offshore drilling sites. Here's how it worked: The three companies met

privately and each suggested what it thought to be a good bid. They could not agree on a common figure, however, so each company then went into the bidding session for itself, supposedly so the federal government would get a good price for the drilling sites. Miller was asked whether the companies were free to



Gunter: Drop Fuel Tax

(WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) - Rep. Bill Gunter, D-Fla., said Wednesday night he will introduce a bill to immediately suspend the federal tax on diesel fuel in an effort to end the independent truckers strike.

Gunter also condemned incidents of violence connected with the strike and called for stepped-up efforts by law enforcement agencies to prevent further violence.

If enacted, the bill would cut fuel costs by an estimated \$185 million over the next six months, Gunter said. He said the bill included a provision to reduce diesel fuel taxes on the state level.

Koscot Claims Dismissed

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) - A federal bankruptcy judge has thrown out 80,009 claims against Glenn W. Turner's embattled cosmetics firm, Koscot Interplanetary Inc. Judge Alexander Paskay ruled Wednesday that claims filed by various state attorneys general were invalid. Paskay allowed 7,000 claims for an estimated \$26 million in debts to stand. The largest single debt is claimed by the Internal Revenue Service. Among the claims disallowed by Paskay were 60,000 names listed by the attorney general of Pennsylvania as

Revenue Surplus Expected

TALLAHASSE, Fla. (AP) - Tax collections in the last half of 1973 indicate Florida will end the fiscal year June 30 with a \$200 million surplus, says Comptroller Fred O. "Bud" Dicksinson.

His estimate Wednesday was \$25 million more than the surplus forecast by Gov. Reubin Askew's estimating team, which said the fuel shortage would slow business during the first half of 1974.

"We have been cautiously conservative in estimating revenue because of the uncertainty of the fuel shortage, But he said any decline in gasoline taxes should be offset by increases in other taxes.



Kuwait Denies Terrorists

Demand To Free Guerillas

KUWAIT (AP) - The Kuwait government still refused today to let four pro-Arab terrorists from Singapore land on its territory despite threats of other guerrillas to kill hostages they were holding in the Japanese Embassy in the Persian Gulf sheikdom. The terrorists who seized the embassy on Wednesday claimed they were holding "more than 20" Japanese and Arabs. They vowed to blow up the hostages and themselves unless the Singapore terrorists and their hostages were flown to Kuwait.

Genocide Pact Stymied

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Senate put aside the 25year-old genocide treaty Wednesday after twice failing to

Sponsors indicated they would make another try for Senate ratification next year.

The treaty, adopted by the United Nations in 1948, would make genocide an international crime. Growing out of Hitler's attempted extermination of the Jews, the treaty would commit signatory nations - now numbering 78 — to prevent and punish action intended to destroy all or a part of an ethnic, national or religious

Canal Zone Anxiety

BALBOA, C. Z. (AP) - Many of the 10,000 American civilians living in the Panama Canal Zone fear Secretary of State Heary A. Kissinger's visit to Panama today will lead to major changes in their lives. "There is a constant feeling of tension and anxiety, and sometimes downright fear, because of the uncertainty of our future," Patria Fulton told Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker, one of the treaty negotiators, at a recent meeting.

Cambodian Army Gains

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (AP) -- Government troops made gains on both banks of the Bassac river southeast of Phnom Penh, the Cambodian military command claimed

The command said its troops cleared a three-mile section of Route 21 south of the industrial suburb of Takhmau, seven miles southeast of Phnom Penh on the west bank of the Bassac.

On the east bank, about 50 rebels were killed in fighting at the village of Prek Pra, the command reported. About 1,000 Khmer Rouge rebels were reported concentrated in a bend of the Bassac southeast of Prek Pra. Government reinforcements are moving toward the area.

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - A pay raise by King Hussein

Wafa said the mutineers had surrounded an oil refinery in Zerqa, 15 miles north of Amman, a government radio station, the army staff headquarters and one of Hussein's palaces. MOSCOW (AP) - Dissident Soviet historian Roy Medvedev has defended Alexander Solzhenitsyn's "Gulag Archipelago" as a significant work and a true account of the Soviet labor camp system. In a 6,000-word critique, Medvedev said Wednesday that



FPL Says Power Use Is Down

Voluntary conservation has cut electric power use more than five percent but Daylight Saving has had "little apparent effect,"

Consumers in FPL's service area used 2.5 billion kilowatt hours last month. "That was about five percent less than our projection, which hadn't taken conservation into account," an FPL

"Indeed, December was cooler than expected, with extra electricity needed for heating. This normally would push power output above projected levels, but last month we were five percent below. So, clearly, there was more than five percent conservation

"Indications are that customers have continued to save energy in January." Although voluntary steps are working, the spokesman said, the switch to Daylight Saving Time hasn't produced any apparent results in the half of Florida served by FPL.

"Since the time change January 6, people have been using less electricity in the evening but more in the morning. Peak demand in early evening seems about 150,000 kilowatts lower due to the daylight change, but this is offset by higher consumption at other

"The net result, as far as we can see now, is that Daylight Eaving is responsible for little or no change in total kilowatt hours er day. In fact, if there is a change, it may be a slight increase. Yet this possible increase muy be more than balanced, in turn, by a saving of fuel-because the lower peaks allow our most efficient plants to produce a greater percent of total output.
