



To pay for our actual participation, it is stated, cost this country 22 billion dollars. Loans to our Allies, largely unrepaid, ran to more than 8 billions more. That's a direct cost of 30 billions, then, paid mostly in the productive wealth of our factories, our retailing, our farming, and the hard work of Americans in every branch of productive enterprise. ductive enterprise.

What's more, it's only the beginning. It takes no aclowed the war. Total veterans' expenditures to date, for instance, have come to nearly 12 billion dollars more.
