

The temporary injunction will remain in force until the case is
heard on its merits. This may be
months away.

Wilson, in the Raliway Mail
Service 29 years, sent a letter to
the Houston Post in June, 1934, in
which he called Shivers a "renegade" and likened him to a
"Judai" leading the Democratic
party into a Republican fold.

"The Dreyfus case" used to be fighting past or present Communist affili- mittee's questions — such as adwords in France, and apparently they still are, as is shown by the new hook of that name by Guy Chapman, a retired English professor of history. All France was divided into two factions, those who believed Alfred Dreyfus. a young Jewish lieutenant, guilty of treasm, and those who were sure that he had been framed.

Convicted in 1894 and sent to the Erench penal colony of Devils Island off French Gulans, he had friends who still believed in him Later evidence pointed to the guilt of Major Ferdinand Esterhazy, another army officer. The documents implicating Dreyfus were shown to have been forged. Eventually a new trial found Dreyfus guilty, but, oddly enough. "with extenuating circumstances." Finally he was completely vindicated. He died in 1985.

The case aligned conservatives, monarchists and anti-Semitos on one side against liberals and radicals. Chapman thinks that the army opposition to Drevius was not due to a plot but to a mistaken feeling that officers should stand together. But the case nearly wrecked France.






