After two weeks at Fort Bragg, N. C., with Headquarters Company, 1st Battalion (Airborne), 504th Infantry, \$2nd Airborne Division, he was airlifted to the Dominican Republic in June and found himself in the middle of a

Capt. Phillip Goddard, M. C., his commanding officer, said he was "a very helpful and competent individual" and "an asset to the platoon."

It was hot last October Santo Domingo and the republic seethed with tension and unrest. Gene Barboza got his first

taste of action when an enlisted man's club was blown up. He rushed to the scene

carrying his medical kit. "There was a lot of smoke and debris all over the place," he recalled, "and a lot of people running out. I ran up and got a few of the people out so I lined them up along the sidewalk and started treating them." The medic treated American soldiers and Dominisan citizens.







From Robert King High I wish to thank The Sanford Herald for this opportunity to state to its many readers the accomplish ments I feel have been obtained during my eight years as mayor of Miami and what reforms are urgently needed to improve the administration of state government. y saved by the state with the adoption of an effective statute requiring that all state contracts be let. and all purchases made on a competive bid basis. On the subject of education, noth-

ing would please me more than to become known as Florida's education governor. I deplore the political manipula-

tion that saps and riddles our education system and advocate immediate measures to end this dram of evil. We all know that the National Education Association Report was a strong indictment of the current distasteful solution of Florida's mixture of politics and education.

I am for the transfer of as much control as possible from the cabinetcontrolled Board of Education and State Budget Commission to the Board of Regents.
