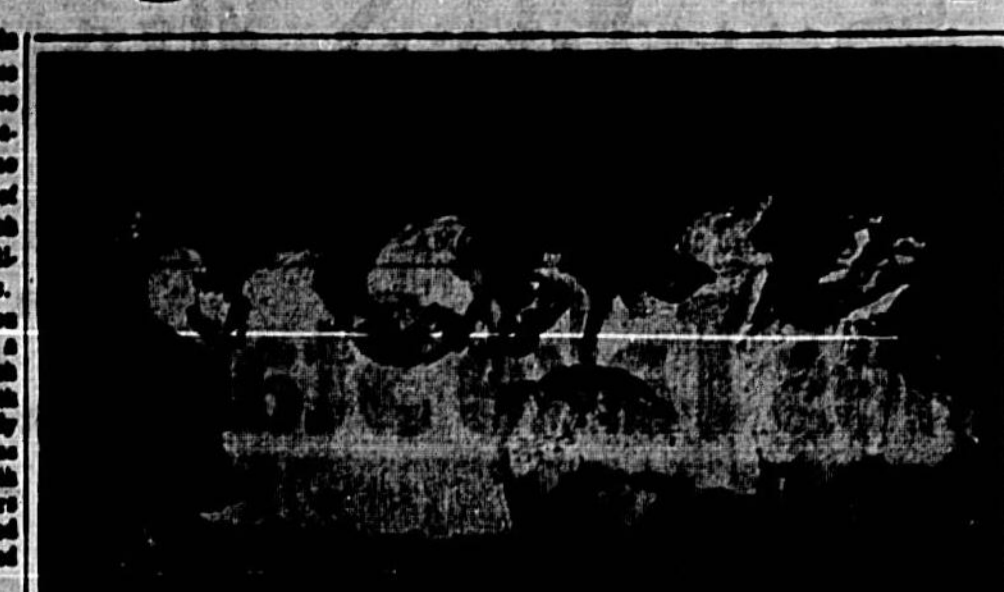

Well, you've made it. A college has accepted you. A year or more of strain, tests and intensive body English has paid off. Now, you're campus-bound.

It may seem unfair, but it will be to jolt your feelings of euphoria right now.

Your problems have only begun. You have four years in which to make a success of your college experience—and it won't be easy.

Here is a checklist of things that a college education is not:

- College is not merely the "thing to do." If you want to do an "it" thing, take up polo. It would be cheaper and it would not involve any of the self-deception entailed in finding education.
- College is not a passport to upper-middle class suburbs. Students—regard on parents—who see education in terms of prestige and status, are misled. The "prestige" of a college graduate will never equal the value of true college education.
- Not, to tighten the focus, is a college education merely a process of advanced vocational training. Anyone who goes to college solely to be accredited as a doctor, lawyer, or business chief has missed the essential part of the whole experience.

One of the runners that Huggins passed in his great kick was Seabreeze's Marshall Howell, and this in itself was a helping hand to the victor, Lyman Huggins.

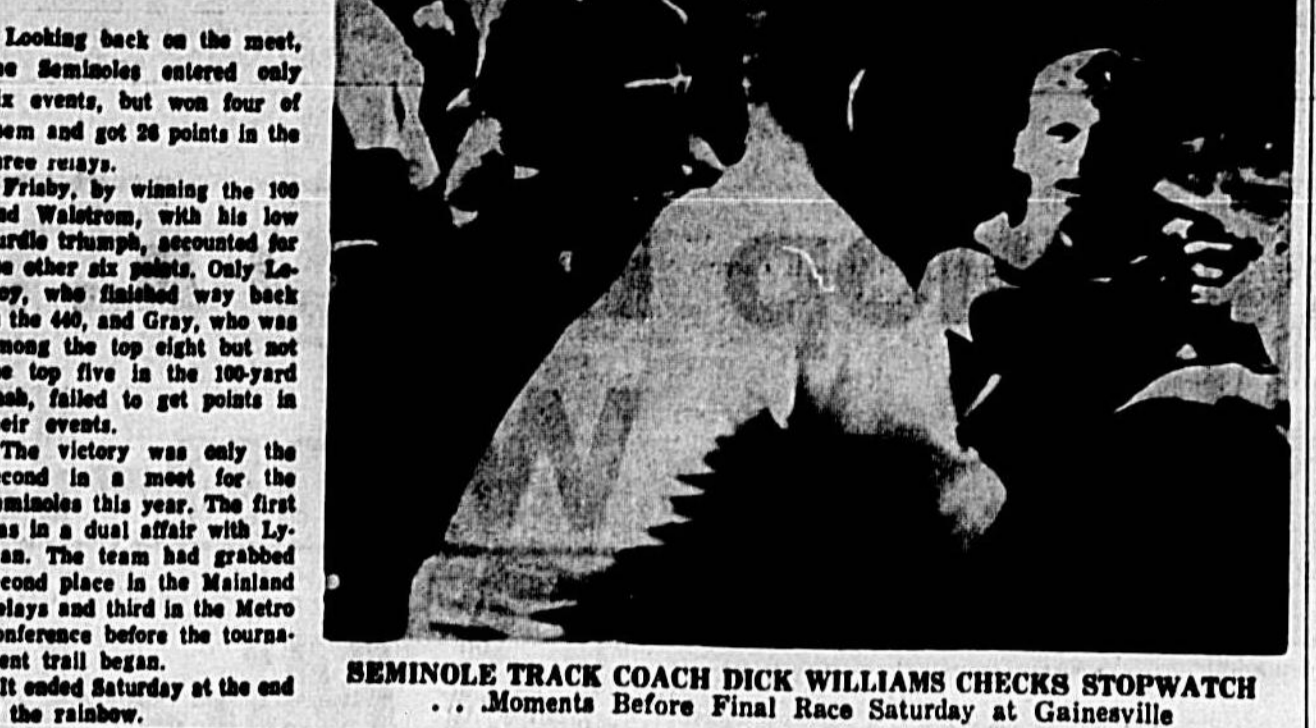

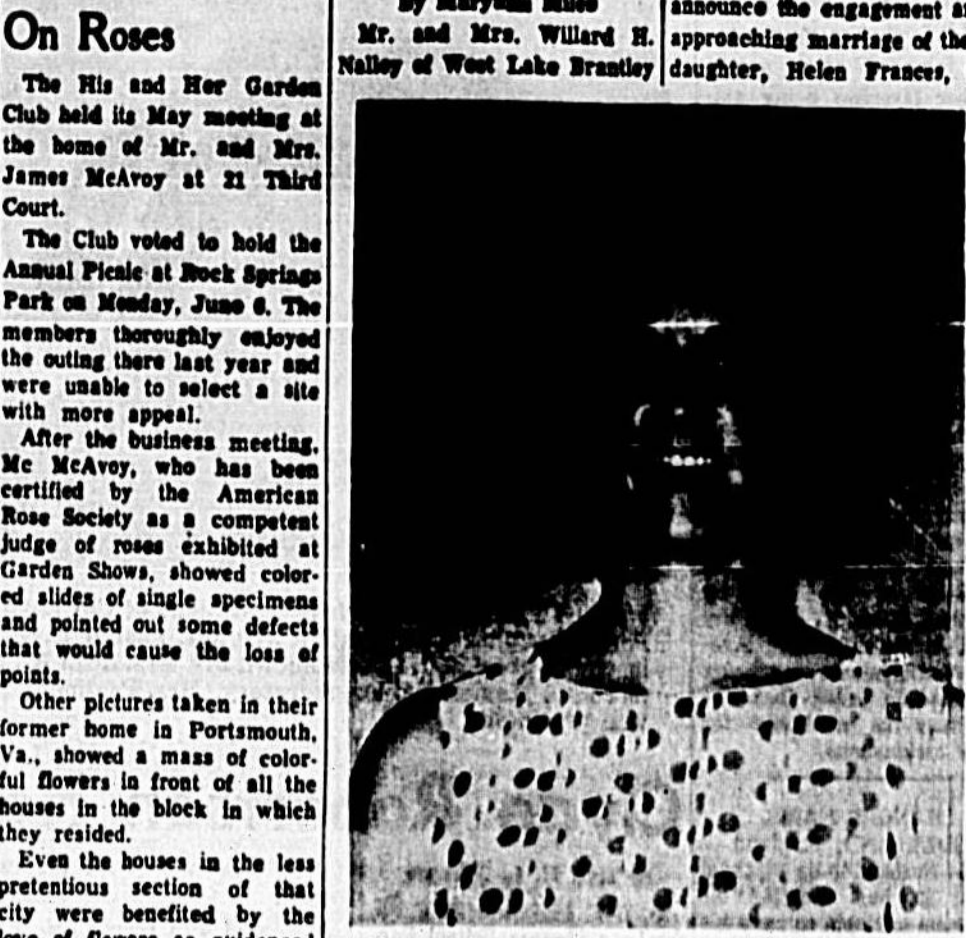

Rocket Runs Off Haywire

CAPE KENNEDY (UPI) — An unmanned Atlas-Agena rocket went haywire after lift-off today and blasted for the second time to launch two astronauts after a target in space.

The mission of disappointed Gemini 9 pilots Thomas Stafford and Eugene Cernas was canceled.

Officials immediately sought to determine what caused the Agena to soar in a bright tail of flame from the launch pad and then, about eight minutes later, to fall into the Atlantic Ocean.

Stafford pulled off his space helmet and shook his head disbelievingly.

First estimates were it would take at least two weeks to re-schedule the Gemini 9 flight.

The Atlas booster rocket ignited in a burst of smoke and golden flame and it carried the 7,000-pound Agena payload straight into the sky.

At the start it looked flawless. But ground control failed to receive data.
