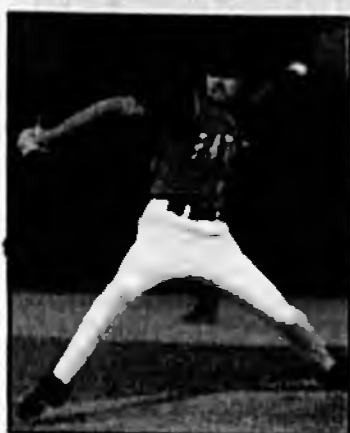

Jax the manatee dies at SeaWorld

Jax, the 7-foot, 655-pound manatee found injured in Monroe Harbour Marina, died Wednesday.

Officials at SeaWorld Orlando said the manatee was euthanized after it failed to respond to treatment for a severe laceration, mostly likely the result of being struck by the hull of a boat. Veterinarians had been tube-feeding the manatee and administering antibiotics.

On Tuesday Jax's condition began to rapidly deteriorate and the decision was made to euthanize the manatee. This was the second time Jax had been rescued. In April 1998, SeaWorld's manatee rescue team nursed Jax back to health when he was found emaciated near Jacksonville.

Deputies find missing infant

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office recovered Tuesday night a six-month-old child who had been the subject of a parental abduction Tuesday, which occurred Monday near Altamonte Springs.

The Seminole County Sheriff's Office was searching for the child, as well as two suspects, Shantee Koger, 18, who is the child's mother, and Eliezer "Elijah" Robles, 18, who is Koger's boyfriend but not the child's father.

Koger reportedly abducted her daughter, who was in the legal custody of a relative. Koger was visiting the residence where the child was staying, when she allegedly took the child.

Robles and Koger have been arrested and are accused of interference with child custody and concealing a child contrary to an order of the court. Koger has also been charged with delinquency of a minor.

Vacation Express lands at Sanford airport

SANFORD — "We're back!" Those two words, spoken by Pace Airlines CEO Darrell Richardson, were music to the ears of Orlando Sanford International Airport (OSIA) officials.

The North Carolina-based airline operates 737-300 jets for Vacation Express, one of the nation's largest tour operators which announced in January it would move its hub operations to Sanford from Atlanta.

Friday marked the beginning of a 7-year contract between

Vacation Express and OSIA. To celebrate, local dignitaries welcomed airline officials during a ceremony in the international terminal.

"This is a tremendous boost to the airport," said Larry Dale, president and CEO of the Sanford Airport Authority. "We expect Vacation Express to bring in 250,000 to 300,000 people a year to Sanford."

Vacation Express will use OSIA as its hub, linking seven of its major gateway cities to Aruba, Cancun (gateway to Cozumel and the Riviera Maya), Costa Rica, and Puerto Plata and Punta Cana in the

Dominican Republic. Passengers originating in central Florida can access non-stop service to tropical destinations plus domestic service to all hub feeder cities. For the 2004 season, the cities in the hub program are: Atlanta, Baltimore, Charlotte, Cincinnati, Louisville, and Nashville.

The move to Sanford is actually a return for the Atlanta-based Vacation Express. The company operated its hub out of OSIA from December 2001 to January 2003 before switching its hub to Atlanta. During that

City eyes smoking ban at parks

LONGWOOD — A debate to ban smoking from public parks in Longwood fumed Tuesday night as city leaders debated the merits of another. Central Florida city's action that recently outlawed the habit in its recreational areas.

Port Orange last month made it illegal to smoke in city parks when children are present during youth activities. Longwood commissioners considered going one-step further as to ban all smoking in public parks, but two commissioners that occasionally light up a cigarette lobbied for a less stringent prohibition.

"I'd be scared to death to accidentally have a cigarette in my mouth under all these rules," said Commissioner Mike Holt as he looked over the Port Orange ordinance. "How far are we going with it," he added. "I agree with I don't want to sit next to someone smoking a cigarette in a bleacher full of children, but I just understand when someone wants a cigarette there should be an area designated to do that. If you don't want to breathe it don't go over there."

Butch Bundy agreed with Holt, "If you don't have at least a designated area where smokers can go parents may be reluctant to take their kids

Boat to help SFD respond to marine emergencies

The Sanford Fire Department has a new Fire/Rescue/Dive Boat. Called "Unit 31" it has been placed into service prior to the Riverwalk grand opening. This boat will ensure that the citizens of Sanford and visitors will receive the best service available in case of a marine emergency.

Boat 31 is a 22-foot center console "Boston Whaler Guardian" powered by a 225-horsepower Mercury outboard engine. Fire emergencies along the Riverwalk and along Lake Monroe will be suppressed by this special operations boat. The 50-horsepower Hale pump will supply 500 gallons of water a minute from the lake to a deck mounted nozzle. With multiple hand lines, this unit will offer fire protection as well. The 34-inch access door will aid to assist in rescue emer-

gencies such as patient loading and dive operations.

The purpose of this new unit is to rapidly intervene in emergency medical calls, marine fire emergencies and assist with events on or along the Riverwalk.

The unit is based at the Monroe Harbor Marina for a quick response to the St. Johns River. Trained firefighters will be assigned to the boat and specialized equipment will outfit the boat to manage any 911 emergency.

The fire department gives special recognition to the Sanford City Commission, mayor and city manager for their committed leadership in fire protection and prevention. Battalion Chief Tim Benton, of the Special Operations Battalion is in charge of the new craft.



Lynx adds 7th busline in Seminole

SANFORD — It took nine years for a bus line to be added to Seminole County's five existing routes, but already in 2004 Lynx has unveiled two new lines, including one last week at the Sanford airport.

"Having two new routes is a big deal," said Brian Martin, Lynx media relations manager, about the airport and Lake Mary bus lines.

Similar to the Lake Mary Boulevard route that was started at the beginning of the year, the new airport bus line is expected to increase the ability for potential employees to travel to an expanding business area of the county. The Orlando Sanford International Airport is an economic engine for the county as it has increased its growth by 150 percent last

year and employs about 4,700 people.

"We are thankful the Lynx bus service is coming out here," said Larry Dale, president and chief operating officer of Orlando Sanford International Airport. "We have worked

on this for a long time.

"The implementation of this new route meets the needs to help our employees get here."

Funding for the airport route comes from a federal

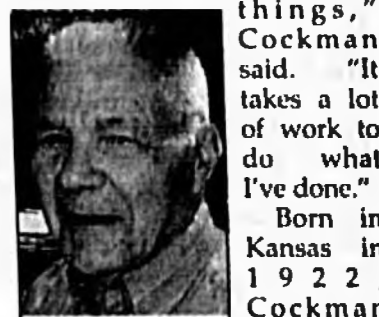
The event will begin at 6:30 a.m. on Sunday, May 9 (Mother's Day) at Memorial Park. The choir will perform a mixture of patriotic songs,

Crazy for parking: For those readers who still doubt whether I have lost my mind, I'm about to give you the ammunition you need to declare your favorite **Clock Keeper** certifiable: The city of Sanford should begin charging for parking downtown.

Yep, you read that right. The city should install parking meters and "park in a box" features at selected lots in downtown.

City officials believed they had a comprehensive plan for downtown parking. When **James McCuen** ordered a towing company to remove cars from his Wachovia Bank building property two weeks ago, it became clear there were some holes in the plan. Though the city had printed brochures and signs indicating that McCuen's two lots were available for public parking, no one had bothered to get

McCuen's signature on a contract agreeing to the deal. (By the way, those signs are still up and the brochures are still in City Hall.)

Word from the McCuen camp is he is amicable to the city using his lots if they will assume liability for accidents, all the city has to do is ask. I don't know if City Manager

Al Grieshaber has made that request to Mr. McCuen, but I could understand why the city would be hesitant to agree. They would assume all the liability risk with little to no monetary reward.

What if, however, the city agreed to assume liability and leased the parking lots from McCuen? To cover the costs of some additional insurance and to pay for the lease, the city would then charge to park in those lots. If you had 70 parking spots that generated \$4 per day, that's a little more than \$100,000 per year.

But why stop there? The city owns a lot at the corner of Park Avenue and 1st Street. Charge for parking. Put meters up and down 1st Street and start charging there, too. (If you're tearing up 1st Street for renovations, there would be no problem to add a few parking meters.) What about that big city-owned parking lot to the east of the **Seminole County Courthouse**? Bingo, charge to park. At \$4 per day per spot, the city could easily approach \$300,000 or \$400,000 in revenue per year, more than enough to bond money to pay for the fancy parking garage **Bill Kirchoff** has been trying to convince the city to build.

Who'll monitor the parking meters and lots? How about the parking lot attendant the city is going to use to enforce the new parking rules at City Hall? Even if you checked the City Hall lot every hour, you still have 55 minutes of thumb twiddling left.

Downtown private property is appreciating in value. In my opinion, the city's parking spaces are undervalued. City officials need to start considering the city's parking spaces as an asset, just like they do the **RiverWalk**. It's an asset because convenient parking is necessary if downtown is to flourish. (By convenient I don't mean everyone will be able to park in front of the **Colonial Room**.) The city's parking spaces are also an asset because it could generate revenue that could be used to create a long-range parking plan, be it a garage or some other option.

Who'll pay for parking? Ask **Jeno Paulucci**, Sanford's only billionaire. As with most things business oriented, Jeno has set the trend for paid parking downtown. The lot on the corner of Commercial Street and Park Avenue (directly behind the **State's Attorney's** office) belongs to Jeno and he charges a monthly fee to park. He's been doing it for years.

If you think I'm crazy to suggest paid parking downtown, then you've got to put Jeno in that same boat. I could live with that, though Jeno might have second thoughts about sharing an idea with a dim-witted editor.

Odor relief? With the **RiverWalk** open for business, the smell wafting over from the water treatment facility is becoming a nuisance. Help is on the way, however.

The **City Commission** will consider Monday night a contract with **CPH Engineers** to design "odor control facilities and biosolids management system improvements." It all has to do with "microbial organisms" in the "digested sludge" and something about "aerobic digesters." I'm not sure what it all means, and I don't care. Just make it smell better.

Bad drivers: The city commission will also consider a recommendation to terminate the garbage collection contract with **Florida Recycling Services Inc. (FRS)** if the company does not supply the city with a certificate of insurance.

Might I suggest the city take it a step further and revoke the contract if **FRS** continues to hire drivers who drive like madmen? Twice last week I was run off the road by **FRS** trucks. In both cases, the drivers ignored stop signs and blew through the intersection. Keep it up **FRS**, and my heirs will have a nice monetary reward courtesy of your insurance company, that is if your insurance is still valid.

time, nearly 350,000 Vacation Express passengers traveled through OSIA, accounting for 26.4 percent of the airports' total domestic and international passengers.

Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson airport is the busiest passenger airport in the world, and some Sanford officials predicted the company might return OSIA.

"The reason they're leaving is because the airline and the tour operator believe they can generate more traffic from Atlanta than they can from Orlando," Larry Gouldthorpe said at the time. Gouldthorpe is the president of TBI Airport Management Inc., which manages the domestic and international terminal in partnership with the Sanford Airport Authority. "Do we agree with that? No. It will be more costly for them to operate from Atlanta, and there are, of course, the hidden costs like flight delays."

Cary Evans, executive vice president of FlightSery, which owns and operates the Vacation Express, agreed with Gouldthorpe's assessment.

"They say the best thing about Atlanta is seeing it in your rearview mirror," Evans

said. "The delays and obstacles we encountered in Atlanta don't exist (in Sanford)."

"In addition, Orlando Sanford International Airport provides us with service to the No. 1 family vacation destination," Evans added. "And it's more convenient to Daytona Beach — the world's most famous beach — than the Orlando airport."

Evans said the airline expects to add six additional domestic destinations in the next year.

"This is the building block for the airport's domestic growth," Gouldthorpe said. "This will not escape the notice of other airlines looking to serve Central Florida. There is no longer a question of whether Sanford will be an alternative to using the Orlando airport. We are a viable alternative and the industry is recognizing that."

Vacation Express and west coast sister company SunTrips are both wholly owned subsidiaries of FlightSery (a division of RCG Companies Inc. Vacation Express has been a leading tour operator from the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic region of the country for 15 years.

there."

Mayor Dan Anderson said setting up a permitted smoking area with possibly a bench and ashtray in the city's larger parks such as Candyland and Reiter could work, but it probably wouldn't be feasible in the smaller recreational areas. Commissioners rejected the idea of establishing the parking lots as the designated smoking area, but Commissioner Brian Sackett said he entirely disagreed with the idea of areas set aside for smokers.

"There is no smoking at high schools and there are no designated areas, and parents show up in groves there," he said. "They know the rules."

Other concerns of the City Commission included the perceived absence of a penalty in

the Port Orange ordinance for those that do not abide by the law.

"What happens if you do light up in the bleachers, what can officers do about that," opined City Attorney Richard Taylor.

According to Kent Donahue, a Port Orange spokesman, he does not expect any problems enforcing the ordinance, as the police department has not issued any citations so far as smokers are given three warnings before

an officer is dispatched. He said if a smoker refuses to

comply with the ordinance they could be fined up to \$500 or spend 60 days in jail based on a current rate structure of failing to comply with a city ordinance. While Donahue

said he's only received one call against the new ban, at a meeting last weekend as the city is in the process of updating its vision statement the ordinance received a round of applause

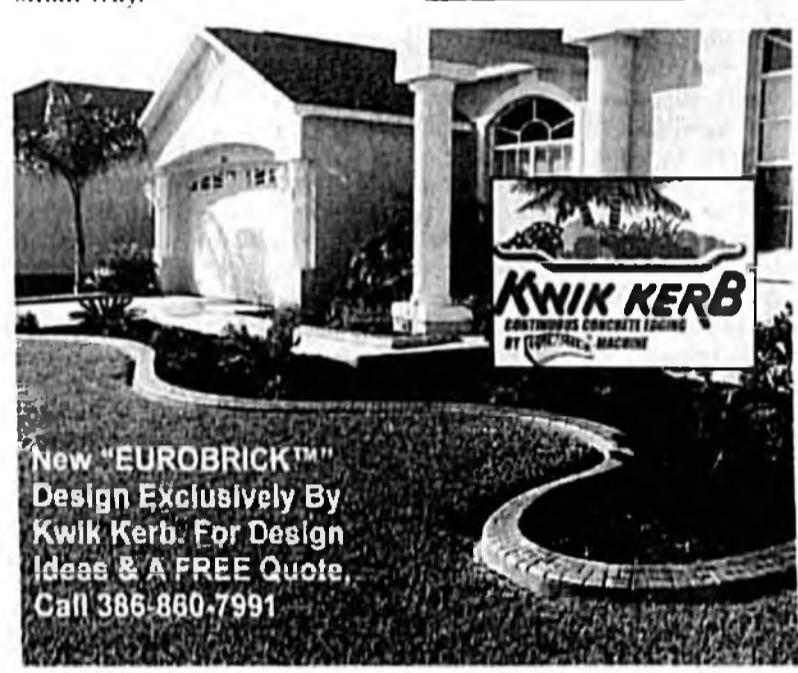
from the crowd when it was mentioned.

Longwood commissioners are expected to consider an ordinance for the no smoking ban in city parks next month. Along with Port Orange, Brevard County has enacted a similar ban and the city of Ormond Beach is also considering an ordinance to limit smoking in city parks.

"To me I think it's an issue where I see the city parks as an extension of city buildings," Anderson said. "It's areas where the citizens come together to enjoy and utilize their property."

"Overall what you end up with is better recreation opportunities," he added. "You just have a nicer environment for families to come down and enjoy the

park. Also this would help control the litter problem in a small way."

Writing for publicity

In the newspaper business, we receive many letters, e-mails and fax communications requesting help in promoting a particular event, or announcing a specific activity, including a possible upcoming sporting event. When it affects the local area, we are pleased to cooperate and present the material in an appropriate venue.

For many organizations, the communications are written by persons charged with publicity or the person coordinating a particular event. The problem in many of these communications however, is the lack of sufficient information or misspelled words or sentences that confuse everyone, such as one I recall that said "The event is free of charge. Admission is \$10."

The basic ingredients in promoting an event include what, when, where, why, and how. You would be surprised to find out how many of these fail to include all of the ingredients. In many cases, the letters will omit one or more of these items, and we end up having to make phone calls — generally to people who "are unable to come to the phone right now, please leave a message."

While this is probably my responsibility, to find out all of the details, the problem extends to other areas of concern as well. Brochures promoting particular events are often printed up and plastered all over town. They may also fail to add all of the ingredients. One in particular comes to mind. While it announces a fund-raising event, gives the time, date and explains how the profits will be used, it fails to say where it will be held other than naming the sponsoring organization. The people who made this brochure (and probably paid much for it), apparently believe everyone knows where it will be held. I don't, and probably many others don't as well, especially those who may not be familiar with this area.

Billboards often have messages which make me squirm. Along Interstate 95, there are several large billboards advertising a particular men's club. In large letters, possibly three feet tall, it advertises a "Gentlemen's Club." Surely someone goofed, and no one caught the error. It makes the club appear as though it is not attuned to much culture or is operated by persons who are under-educated. Even so, you'd have thought the billboard people would have noticed the error.

The inclusion of telephone numbers is always essential. (This is probably classed under the "who" category.) In recent cases, people have suggested only an e-mail address for further information, apparently assuming that everyone in Central Florida has a com-

puter with access to the Internet.

Another bone of contention is the use of acronyms in press releases. For example, "the XYZ Club will meet (etc.)" Perhaps the people who are already members of the club know what XYZ stands for, but the rest of us don't. If they want to attract new members, or at least explain the purpose of the organization, one would think they would explain the acronym. The proper usage is to explain an acronym, at least when it is first used. From that point it can be used again without an explanation.

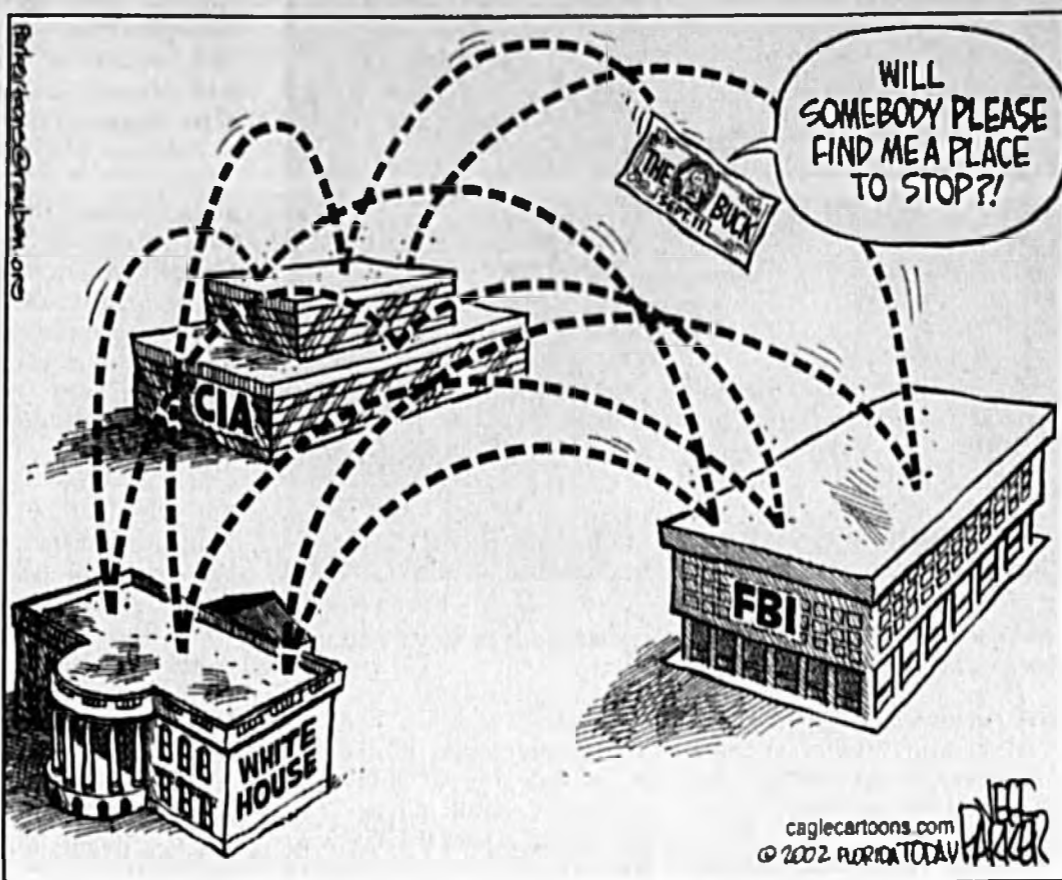
I had one case late last year when this took place in a press release. Would you believe, when I called to find out what the acronym stood for, I was told it was a secret society and only members knew the meaning of it. Were they so secretive no one was to know anything about them? Why bother with a press release?

Businesses often send us press releases they hope we will publish free of charge. Most of them are really ads for the business, under the guise of "information." Some we receive have a dateline. Recently, an item was sent to us slugged "LAKE MARY." Upon reading it, it had absolutely nothing to do with Lake Mary, and was a national business ad disguised as a "local news story." Another one I recall was slugged "SANFORD." It was about an increase in productivity at the General Motors Cadillac Plant in Michigan. Just to find out why it was given a local designation, I called the writer of the press release. "Why did you slug it 'Sanford' I asked. The response — "Well, don't people in Sanford buy Cadillacs?"

(I received two such items disguised as news stories just this past week, both were slugged "Sanford.")

The best way to submit publicity is to put yourself in the place of a stranger who knows nothing about your activities. You want them to read about them and hopefully take part. Start with WHO — "The XYZ Club of (city or area) will hold a meeting (the WHAT) to examine the problems of (The WHY)...at the PDQ Club located at ... (the WHERE)...on April ... (the WHEN). Then, if appropriate, list the speaker or other information which may entice people to attend and/or become involved. If the meeting is restricted to attendance only by certain people, (political party, men only, senior citizens, etc.), explain it.

Writing a press release isn't difficult, but it must include proper information to be effective. Failing to include all the necessary ingredients is the same as baking a cake and not including all of the ingredients. It may look good, but few will want to taste it.

UCF holds Belmont scoreless in sweep

Lake Mary's Kyle Bono tossed a two-hit complete-game shutout and Darren Newlin came within one out of a no-hitter in leading No. 26 UCF to a doubleheader and series sweep of Belmont Saturday afternoon at Jay Bergman Field.

Bono pitched his fourth complete-game shutout of the season to defeat the Bruins 3-0 in game one, while Newlin finished with a one-hitter in UCF's 2-0 game two victory.

In the series opener on Friday, Matt Fox tossed his second complete-game shutout of the season to lead the Golden Knights past Belmont 3-0 Friday evening at Jay Bergman Field.

With the sweep, UCF improved to 32-8 overall and 17-4 in the A-Sun. Belmont dropped to 23-14 overall and 9-9 in the conference.

With the three shutouts over Belmont, it marked the first time in school history that UCF has shutout an A-Sun opponent in a three-game series and gives the Golden Knights 11 on the season, which sets a new school record. 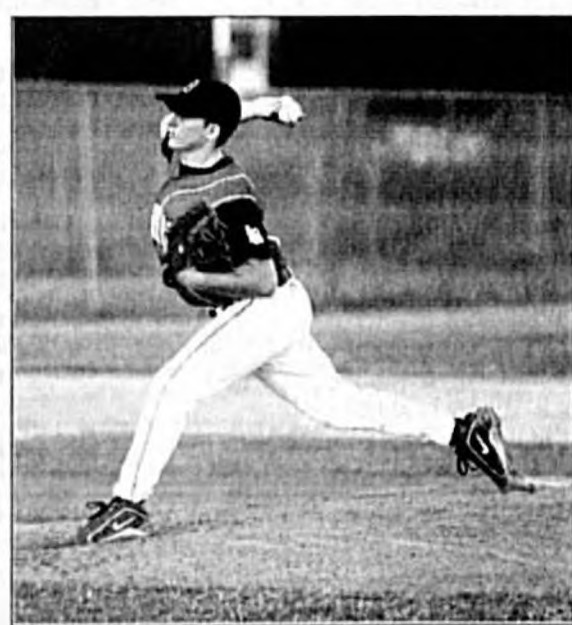

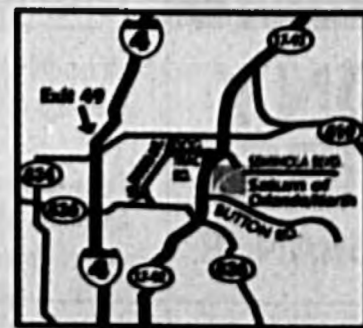

Once again: 1st Street project goes to bid

SANFORD — Renovations to 1st Street will be delayed as city officials have decided to put the project out to bid for a second time.

Bids for the project came in substantially higher than the Downtown Community Redevelopment Agency's (CRA) budget of \$1.7 million. Gomez Construction of Winter Park was the low bidder on the project with a \$2.7 million bid.

In order to meet budget, CRA board members instructed city staff to work with Gomez on "value engineering" the project. One of the savings Gomez and city staff suggested was to close

1st Street during construction, a major change from the way the project was put out to bid. In its project specifications, the city had requested 1st Street remain open to traffic.

After studying the proposed changes, City Manager Al Grieshaber recommended the project go through the bid process because the project specs had changed so significantly he was concerned with legal issues. The CRA unanimously approved the recommendation.

"We're putting it back out to

bid, not because I want to," said CRA chairman Bob Parsell, "but because city staff feels more comfortable rebidding."

Parsell said depending on how quickly city staff act, the project could be under construction by mid summer.

Renovations to 1st Street include replacing stormwater and electrical infrastructure under 1st Street from Sanford Avenue to Oak Avenue. The project also includes extensive streetscape work including rebricking portions of the street, widening side-

walks and installing landscaping and street lights.

In addition to Gomez, Wharton Smith of Sanford submitted a bid on the project. Wharton Smith's bid was \$3.4 million, double the CRA's \$1.7 million budget.

When the bids came in over budget, the CRA had two options: scale back on the project or find additional revenue sources. Reducing the scope of the project has been difficult because CRA members, particularly Parsell, has been adamant

about installing enough infrastructure underground to serve downtown's needs for at least 20 years.

"We don't want to dig up the street five years from now because we didn't provide enough electrical or stormwater capacity," Parsell.

Likewise, Parsell said the CRA doesn't want to skimp on the above-ground amenities.

"We want this to be a first-class project," Parsell said. "There is no way I would agree to do this job halfway."

Gomez had identified \$515,000 in cost savings and Grieshaber was working to find additional revenue sources. Grieshaber has yet to identify which, if any, sources may be tapped.

County schools foundation makes a difference

the 2003 Seminole County Teacher of the Year, said this is only one way the schools foundation aids education.

"The foundation truly takes funds and disperses them in meaningful ways," Partridge said.

The person charged with monitoring the distribution of funds is Executive Director Tina Calderone. She said every school in Seminole County benefits from the non-profit foundation, but not everyone knows it.

The foundation sponsors the program that names the teacher of the year as well as awards for principals and school-related employees of the year, for example.

The organization also raises and disperses money to enhance what Calderone calls the "superior performance" of our teachers and students. The foundation helps low-income students, but also rewards those who excel, Calderone said.

She calls donations to the fund "phenomenal." She points to a long list of corporate sponsors. Corporations such as Progress Energy and Darden Restaurants give more than half of the sponsorships, gifts and donations taken in by the foundation. Individuals donate about a quarter of the money with government contributing another 15 percent.

Corporate sponsors recognize the need for a well-

'Smash and grab' robber suspect sought by SCSO

knocked the suspect into a newspaper rack, but he recovered and ran out of the store heading toward Orange Blvd.

Another witness told the deputy she heard the man yelling to someone to hurry up, that the police were on the way. She then said she heard a car's engine rev up and the squealing of tires as the vehicle drove away.

Citizens to supply input on Lake Mary's park project

A series of small parks in the Lake Mary's downtown are subject to change over the course of the next year as the public is invited to comment Monday, May 3, on the proposed restoration plan.

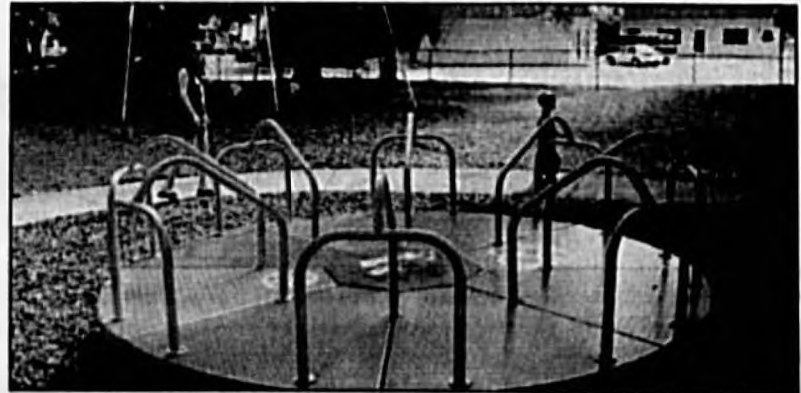
The five parks averaging about one third of an acre apiece were originally laid out in 1916 as part of the Crystal Lakes Winter Homes plat. They extend in a diagonal row from north of Crystal Lake Avenue, across Wilbur and Lake Mary avenues to

about the city community center on North Country Club Road.

In conjunction with revitalized downtown development, the stair-stepped park restoration plan was developed over the past year by city staff. City officials are now soliciting comments from the community at a scheduled public meeting to incorporate any concerns or changes from citizens.

"We sat down as staff and developed a plan for each one of the parks," said Shannon Suffron, senior planner with the Lake
