\$850,000 Bond OK'd For New Sanford Business

County officials today gave final approval to an \$850,000 bond issue which will allow a telephone repair firm, Phonserve, Inc., to locate in Sanford. County officials said they will initially employ about 35 workers at a site in Industrial Park near Interstate 4 and SR 46. The industrial bonds were approved at a Seminole County Industrial Development Authority (SCIDA) board meeting this morning at the Seminole County Courthouse. "We're pleased that we're going to do business," said SCIDA Director Jim Daniel. Daniel said two California underwriters have agreed to purchase the bonds for re-sale. Also, Phonserve's corporate officers have pledged \$255,000 in operating and start-up capital. The California-based underwriters are J. A. Overton and Co., and Eldridge and Co. In the event Phonserve proved unsuccessful, the county would not be obligated to repay the bondholders, it was explained. The two underwriters would bear that burden. SCIDA chairman Eugene Mooney said county officials have done all they can to insure the success of the new venture. Mooney called the market for the Phonserve product "viable." Phonserve secretary Frank Proctor said he anticipates handling one-half-million dollars worth of business the first year. The firm is scheduled to begin operation in January. The second year, Parker said, Phonserve plans to double the output. Phonserve will use Sanford as its home base for operations in Florida, in Georgia, and Alabama. The firm repairs old telephones for independent phone companies and others. Proctor and Daniel both said future plans include expansion of the present facilities to allow the manufacture of more sophisticated communications equipment. Daniel said Phonserve will not be exempt from county land taxes. However, the SCIDA director said from federal law will be exempt from paying federal income tax on the bond issue. SCIDA first announced the telephone firm's intentions to start a business here in October. At that time, however, the SCIDA board held up operations until the underwriters agreed to purchase the bonds. SCIDA is a taxpayer-funded industry-seeking agency which operates under the auspices of the county commission.

Sex Prober Had Eye On Casselberry Mayor

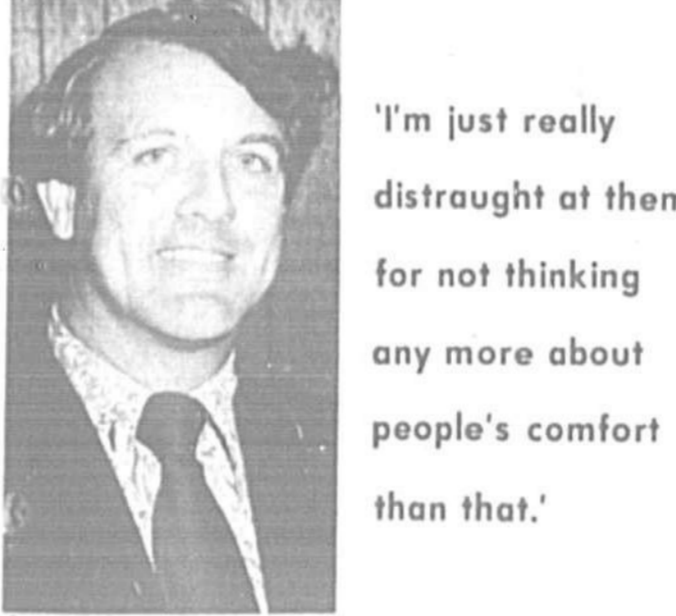
Casselberry police detective Bobby Bennett told a circuit court jury today that he believed was old, impotent marijuana from an unlocked "junk drawer" at the police station to a prostitute. And he said he was later used by sheriff's agents in an investigation of Casselberry Mayor Gerald Christensen. Bennett, 32, of Chulohota, said he acted in an official law-enforcement capacity in delivering the 67 grams of "old evidence" to Carmen Nevils, 18, at her Fern Park apartment on Sept. 8. He said the woman, then working as a topless, bottomless dancer at Casselberry's Club Juana, was a confidential informant and he gave her the marijuana to gain her confidence. He also smoked marijuana. Bennett testified that he feared the smoking of the drug. He said, he coughed, and tried to cover up his inexperience by remarking, "I've got plenty of this stuff laying around in the office." Earlier, Miss Nevils testified that "we all were smoking marijuana" and said she had sexual relations with Bennett at the party. Christensen today denied the allegation concerning smoking of marijuana. "I think I'm going to start using somebody," he said, when contacted at Casselberry. "I don't know who is putting who up to what. I really don't understand what they're trying to prove. This has been brought out before. I've denied before. I wasn't there. I haven't been there (to parties with those girls)." Bennett today denied under oath that he'd ever had sexual intercourse with the admitted prostitute. He said on several occasions she had attempted to have sex with him, "but I couldn't perform because of a mental block." Bennett denied Miss Nevils' accusation that he got into bed with her while she smoked a marijuana cigarette with her.

Keller: Not Asked To Quit

Delivered to Lormann Tuesday afternoon, said for personal reasons of which I feel to be in the best interests of each member of the department and the city council. Keller's resignation, Lormann said today he will be leaving the city, proud of his accomplishments in the police and fire departments and with the knowledge that he has made many friends who appreciated his effort. He declined to reveal his future plans. "There are many people in Longwood who appreciate what I have done in the past 19 months. They will know what I am doing in the future," the 30-year-old public safety director said. "I feel I have done a great deal to benefit the people of the city. We have a good police department, a better department now, and certainly as the years go by it will become even better," Keller said.

Opt's For Courthouse Site Board Limits Meeting Size

After being advised that the general public should be allowed to participate in a Jan. 12 impasse hearing between school management and the Seminole Education Association (SEA), the district school board took action Wednesday night which would limit the number who could comfortably attend the session to fewer than 100 persons. Board members voted 3-2 to hold the public hearing in the county commission hearing room at the Seminole County Courthouse, rather than at Lyman High School. SEA leaders had asked the board last week to schedule the hearing at Lyman so greater public attendance would be possible. The county commission hearing room contains 96 permanent audience chairs while Lyman's auditorium has a seating capacity of nearly 600. Last week school board attorney Douglas Stenstrom was still examining a legal question as to whether public participation at the hearing would constitute an unfair labor practice in the contract dispute between management and representatives of the county's 1,300 teachers. "The legality of the question has been rendered academic," Stenstrom said Wednesday night, "by the fact that both the SEA and the chief negotiator (for the school system) feel that the public should be allowed to speak. Since neither side objects to public participation, there can be no question of an unfair labor practice claim being made later." The question — which Stenstrom said had caused concern in other Florida school districts where collective bargaining is used — involved the fact that the SEA holds exclusive bargaining rights with the school district. Thus, if non-SEA instructors or members of the general public addressed the school board on the contract dispute, the attorney feared it might constitute a breach of the labor-management relationship. SEA members voted last week to delay a decision on the hearing site until Stenstrom reported that the legal issue had been resolved.

Unhealthy Habits Irritate Hernia

DEAR DR. LAMB—A person I know has an inflamed esophagus and also a hiatal hernia and cannot keep food down. Do you think smoking cigarettes or drinking alcohol is advisable for this person? I keep nagging that they are harmful. I would greatly appreciate any answer in your column. DEAR READER—The person you know has his own worst enemy and deserves to be nagged. Unfortunately nagging may do not any good. Through centuries of relations between men and women, nagging has proved to be very poor medicine. If you will forgive my exaggeration think of all the healthy husbands there would be if nagging resulted in good health. I presume from your remarks that the person you know has an irritated lower esophagus because acid-digestive juice leaks backward out of the stomach into the lower esophagus. This is commonly associated with a hiatal hernia (hernia in the stomach through the diaphragm). Alcohol increases the formation of acid digestive juice and makes matters worse. Caffeine and all caffeine-containing beverages also make it worse. Cigarette smoking has not been shown to increase acid formation, but it may affect the normal contracting action of the stomach which may aggravate the situation. WIN AT BRIDGE

Box 1551, Radio City Station, New York, NY 10019. DEAR DR. LAMB—I had a vasectomy three years ago. A hard nodule has formed in the scrotal sac. The nodule is about the size of an English pea, and the doctor has assured me that it is nothing to be concerned about. Do you foresee any complications? In the event, I should desire to sire a child, could an operation reverse my sterility? Or could sperm be withdrawn from an artificial insemination? DEAR READER—A small lump or nodule can be many things, including a small cyst filled with sperm cells, or the scar tissue that may have formed around a small amount of blood associated with the operation. In any case you did the right thing. Anyone who has a lump or nodule of the testicle should have an examination as soon as possible. In some cases it is a malignancy and early diagnosis may save a person's life. Don't delay as some of these tumors spread very rapidly. You should consider a vasectomy as permanent at the time you have it done. Some urologists claim a 25 per cent success in restoring fertility by re-operating on the vas and rejoining it. Success is not success unless sufficient healthy sperm cells are released to enable pregnancy. Recently microscopic operations, perfected by a few surgeons, have been credited with better results. Withdrawing sperm by a needle after a vasectomy has been performed may not be successful. Sometimes the testicle stops forming an adequate amount of viable sperm cells after the vas is tied. Sperm banks have been used to store frozen sperm before a vasectomy is performed but these are not well regulated in every instance and no one can guarantee you how long the frozen sperm will really be useable. I don't think you need to worry about that lump since you have had your doctor examine it, but your chances of regaining fertility are not outstanding.

Actress Angie Dickinson was named Woman of the Year by the Hollywood Radio and Television Society, for the success of her TV series, "Police Woman," the fourth woman ever to be given the society's top honor.

Tantum O'Neal, 12, was named "Female Star of the Year" by the National Association of Theater Owners. Dolly Parton, 30, was named top female vocalist for the second straight year by the Country Music Association.

Anthropologist and author Margaret Mead, 74, was inducted into the Women's Hall of Fame, located at Seneca Falls, N.Y. For the second consecutive year, Trina Jarrish, 34, of Costa Mesa, Calif., won the Powder Puff Derby cross-country air race. The race was sponsored by the Ninety-Nines, an organization of women pilots, who announced it was their last race.

It wasn't all good news for women during 1978. In the area of crime, they made their share of headlines. Sara Jane Moore, 45, was sentenced to life in prison, the maximum sentence prescribed by law, for attempting to kill President Ford on Sept. 22, 1975. Patricia Hearst, 22, was back with her family for the first time in almost three years, out on bail while appealing her bank robbery conviction for which she was sentenced to seven years in prison.

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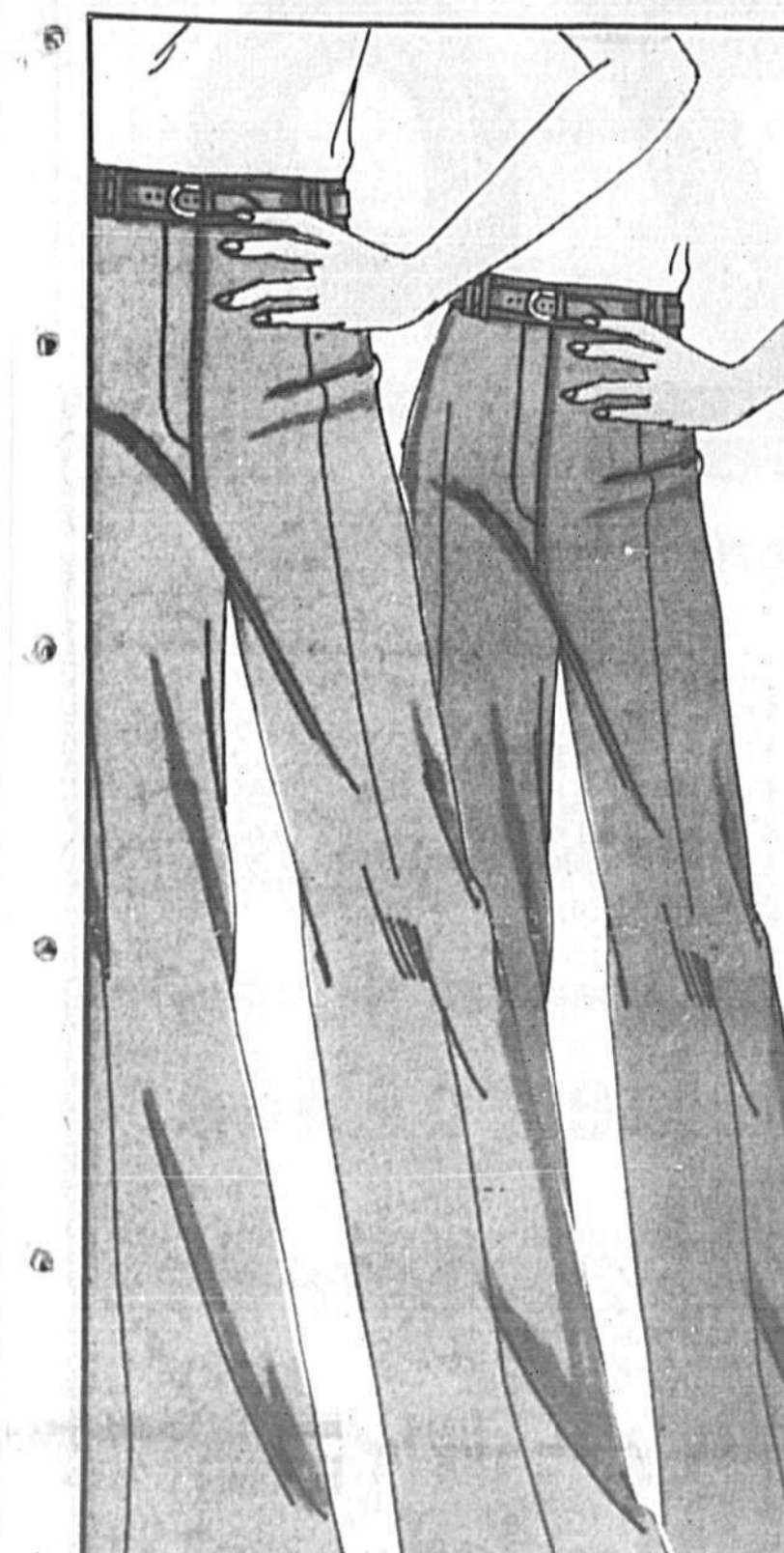

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## Women Become 'First Ladies' In New Fields

The Herald Services Former first ladies were in the news during the year: Mamie Eisenhower, who spent 11 weeks in Washington's Walter Reed Army Medical Center with a viral infection, celebrated her 80th birthday; Lady Bird Johnson visited Israel; and Pat Nixon was hospitalized after suffering a stroke.

Women seeking a toehold on the career ladder in fields previously dominated by men could take heart from the successes of their sisters during the year.

Barbara Walters, 44, who had been cohost of the NBC "Today" show for the last two years and a writer and personality with the network for 12 years, accepted an offer of \$1 million a year over the next five years to coanchor "The Evening News" at ABC with Harry Reasoner.

Not only was Deborah B. Doane of Essex, Conn., the Maine Maritime Academy's first female student, but she was its top ranking graduate this year and the first woman in the country to graduate from a four-year maritime school. The 26-year-old woman graduated with 104 classmates as an ensign with full qualifications as a third mate.

Winning 57 per cent of the vote, 20-year-old Anna Maria Riccio became the first woman in the Polytechnic Institute of New York's 121-year history to serve as president of its student council. The engineering and science school has 4,600 students, of which fewer than 5 per cent are women.

Shirley Temple Black, former child movie star who was previously ambassador to Ghana, became the first woman to hold the post of U.S. Chief of Protocol.

Jeanne M. Holm, 54, retired from the Air Force, where she had been the nation's first woman major general, was appointed by President Ford as his special assistant for women's affairs. In that post she succeeded Patricia Sullivan Lindh, former Republican national committeewoman from Louisiana, who was named deputy assistant secretary of state for education and public affairs.

Evelyn Gandy, a 55-year-old attorney, became Mississippi's first woman lieutenant governor, elected to the post after serving two times as state treasurer.

## Lakeland Woman Stricken County Official: Store Flu Shots

A Lakeland school teacher who received a swine-flu vaccination last month developed symptoms like those that caused national health officials to suspend the inoculation program, doctors said today.

It was the first report of a Floridian developing symptoms of Guillain-Barre syndrome. Officials are investigating to determine if there is a link between numerous reports of the malady and the vaccination program. Usually not fatal, the illness may cause temporary paralysis.

Officials identified the patient as Judy Roberts, 36. They said she was in serious condition at Lakeland General Hospital.

Meanwhile, in Seminole County, Dr. Orville Barks, director of the county health department, said today the flu vaccine should be stockpiled.

"I think that they'll do it to have us keep the vaccine on a stand-by basis in case there is any breakout of a swine flu epidemic."

Federal officials suspended the program Thursday to investigate reports that some vaccinated persons have developed Guillain-Barre syndrome, a disease affecting the nervous system.

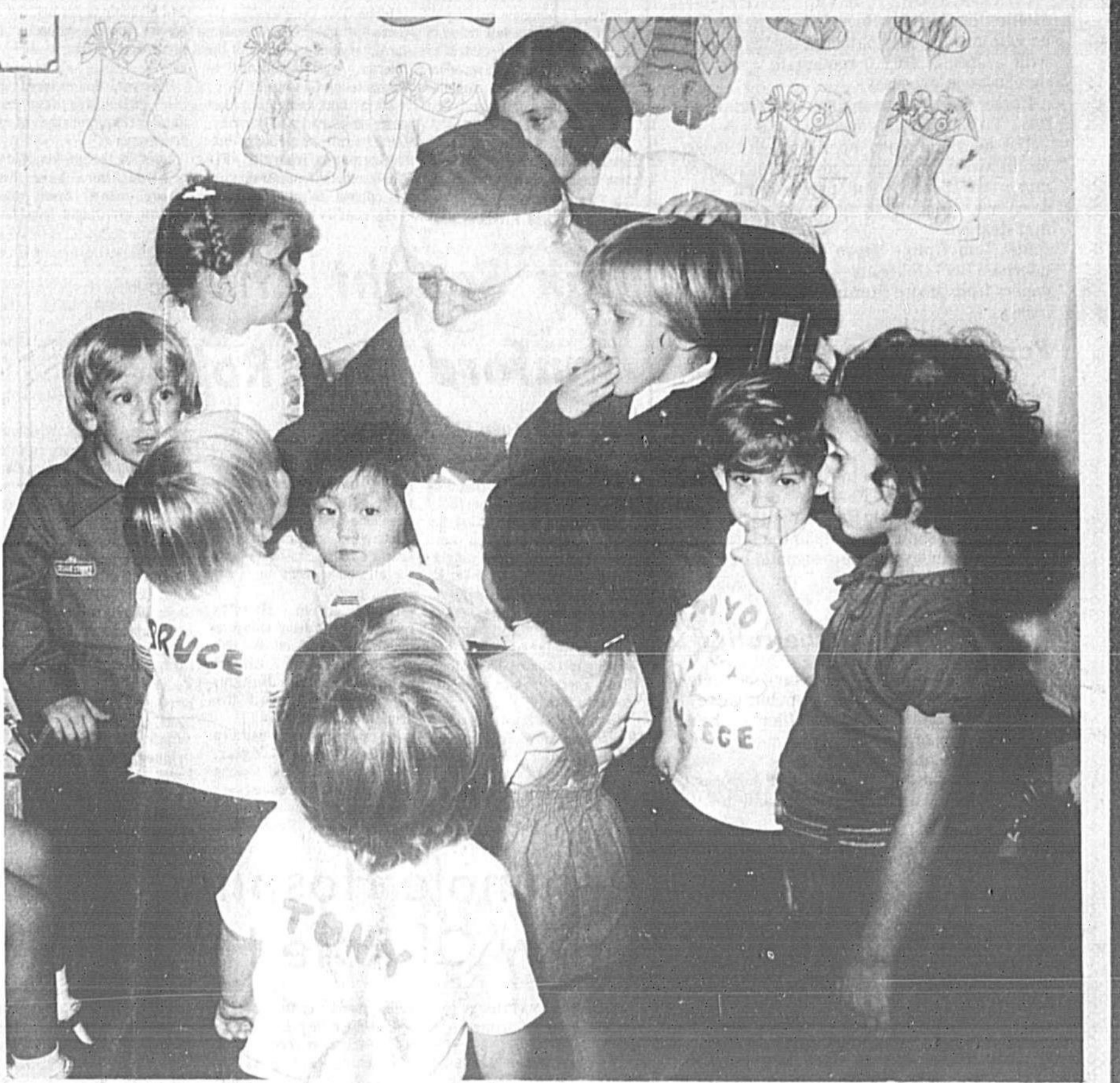
They stressed that there was no proven association between the swine flu vaccine and the disease, but that the program suspension was "prudent," until the possibility of such a link was checked out.

"We're pleased with this decision to shut down," Barks said. "I think it's the only move they could have made."

Federal health officials indicated that this is the second suspension of the program in two months.

Shaken public confidence in the vaccine and the fact that restarting the program might come too late in the influenza season for effective immunization cloud the program's future, according to Dr. Theodore Cooper of the Department of Health, Education & Welfare.

## He Misses A State's Crown, Gains A City's 'Thanks'

The Florida AAAA high school football championship will be played tonight at Bryant Stadium in Lakeland, and Sanford's Seminoles won't be there. But a group of city and county dignitaries treated Seminoles Coach Jerry Posey Thursday as if he had already captured the state crown.

"Gee, I don't know what to say, except that I'm just overwhelmed," Posey said after receiving the key to the city from Sanford Mayor Lee Moore, along with a pile of other "tokens of appreciation."

"It's not just me," Posey said. "I've had quite a bit of help along the way. But I sure do appreciate it."

Among those mentioned as "helpers" in producing Seminoles' 20-2 grid record over the past two seasons was Posey's wife Martha, who also attended the fet.

"It's a lonely life being a coach's wife, I think you all know that," Mrs. Posey said. "But with my three little children and all my friends, it does help."

Tom Hunt, president of the Greater Sanford Chamber of Commerce, pinned a corsage on Mrs. Posey's dress without drawing a drop of blood.

Posey also directed heavy praise toward his coaching staff.

"If it wasn't for them," the Warrior chief said, "I don't know where we'd have been."

Where the Seminoles are, despite an unblemished 10-0 field ledger during the past campaign, is sitting on the sidelines while Tallahassee Godby battles Miami Carol City for state AAAA laurels.

The competition gets pretty stiff in the late rounds of the playoff so Godby gouged a well-balanced, inspired Merritt Island club, 21-0, to make the finals while Carol City was thrashing out a 7-6 decision over rugged Tampa Plant. It's rough up there near the top. So it would have been no disgrace for Seminoles to be eliminated from the competition.

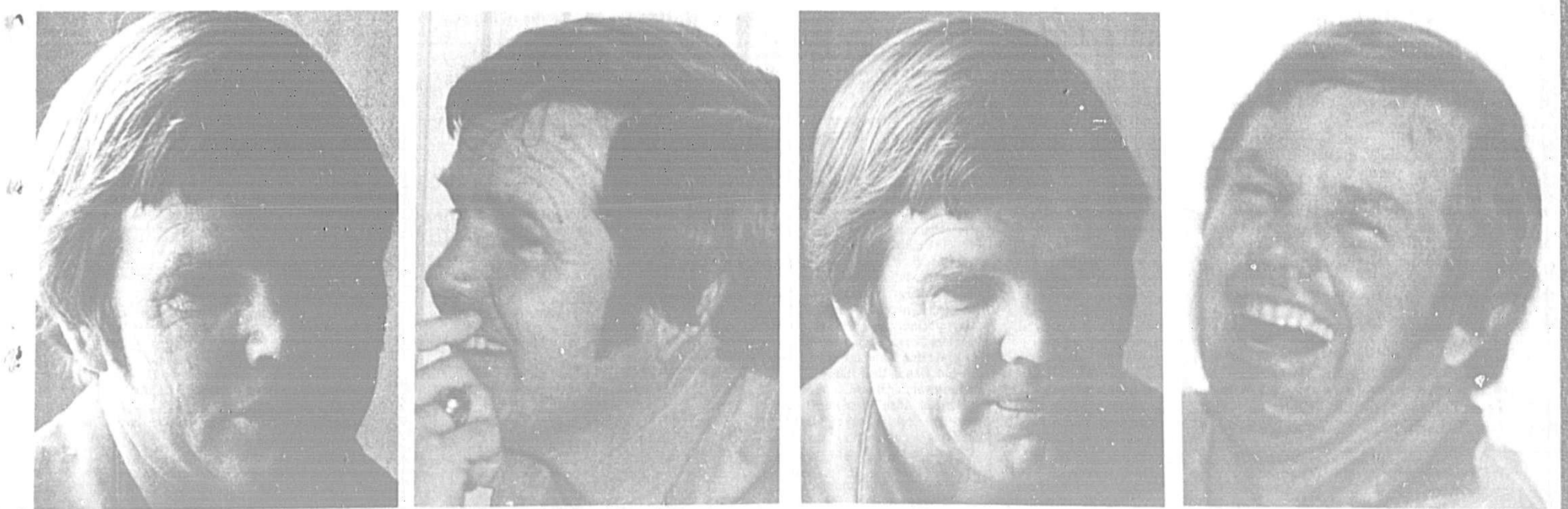
But the Braves weren't eliminated. They were disqualified.

The 10-0 record was changed officially to 8-2 and the Sanford school's first playoff berth in history went sailing out the window because a fourth-string without was ineligible. And Posey put him in near the finish of Seminoles' 20-2 regular-season romps, 35-7 over Daytona Beach Seabreeze and 41-19 over Lake Brantley.

So when it was discovered that the young man had, in fact, flunked two subjects, Seminoles was out. They were replaced by Gainesville, who promptly lost to Winter Park, 13-0 in the opening round. The local squad took Gainesville's slot in the meaningless Florida Bowl and squeaked past Largo, 13-12.
