

\$850,000 Bond OK'd For New Sanford Business

County officials today gave final approval to an \$850,000 bond issue which will allow a telephone repair firm, Phoneserve, Inc., to locate in Sanford.

County officials said they will initially employ about 35 workers at a site in Industrial Park near Interstate 4 and SR 46. The industrial bonds were approved at a

Seminole County Industrial Development Authority (SCIDA) board meeting this morning at the Seminole County Courthouse. "We're pleased that we're going to get to do

Daniel said two California underwriters have agreed to purchase the bonds for re-sale. Also, Phoneserve's corporate officers have pledged \$255,000 in operating and start-up

The California-based underwriters are J. A. Overton and Co., and Eldridge and Co. In the event Phoneserve proved unsuccessful, the county would not be obligated to repay the bondholders, it was explained. The two underwriters would bear that burden.

SCIDA chairman Eugene Mooney said county officials have done all they can to insure the success of the new venture. Mooney

called the market for the Phoneserve product

Phoneserve secretary Frank Proctor said he anticipates handling one-half-milliondollars worth of business the first year. The firm is scheduled to begin operation in

The second year, Parker, said, Phoneserve plans to double the output. Phoneserve will use Sanford as its home base for operations in Florida, in Georgia, and Alabama. The firm repairs old telephones for independent phone companies and others.

Proctor and Daniel both said future plans include expansion of the present facilities to allow the manufacture of more sophisticated communications equipment.

Daniel said Phoneserve will not be exempt from county land taxes. However, the SCIDA director said the firm under federal law will be exempt from paying federal income tax on

SCIDA first announced the telephone's firm's intentions to start a business here in October. At that time, however, the SCIDA board held up operations until the underwriters agreed to purchase the bonds.

Socialists Prevail In Jamaica

KINGSTON, Jamaica (AP) - Jamaican voters gave a landslide endorsement to Prime Minister Michael Manley's Socialist, pro-Cuban policies in an election that the 52-yearold prime minister termed a "victory for the Third World."

Unofficial returns early today gave Manley's People's National party (PNP) 45 of the 60 seats in the House of Repesentatives and Edward Seaga's Jamaica Labor party six. Nine seats were undecided, but computer projections gave a division of 48 to 12. The PNP held 35 seats and the JLP 15 in the outgoing 53-seat house.

That recommendation, which goes to the legislature, would mean that the unemployment compensation benefits would go up automatically as wages climbed due to inflation.

The council's labor members, who pushed the recommendation through, argued that Florida ranks 47th among the states in the amount paid in unemployment benefits. 'No Pay' Tourist Penalty

TALLAHASSEE (AP) Tourists who ignore Florida's traffic laws could have their driver's licenses yanked by their home states under a proposed interstate agreement. In exchange, Floridians who think they can flee another state without paying their traffic

fines could lose their licenses, too. The Cabinet is expected to approve a proposal next Tuesday by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to join an agreement known as the Non-Resident

Violator Compact. Under the agreement, Florida motor vehicle officials would contact officials in the offender's home state. If the ottenders still refused to pay the fine, their licenses would be lifted by their home states.

State analysts say general revenue increases won't keep pace with inflation next year. but Budget Director Joe Cresse has refused to say whether he thinks tax hikes are in order. Cresse reported Wednesday that a revenue estimating conference projected a 3.1-per-cent increase in 1977-78 for total general revenue of \$2.54 billion.

The current appropriations act is based on \$2.46 billion in general revenue, but Cresse said the conference has reduced this year's projection by \$33.5

Efforts to increase taxes, notably on gasoline and alcoholic beverages, loom as the major issue of the 1977 legislative ses-

While Cresse would not say

whether he thinks there will be enough money to head off tax increases, he noted that the projected increase was less than half the 6.6-per-cent rate of inflation.

"There's no question it would be a whole lot easier to balance with a 7-per-cent increase than a 3.1-per-cent increase," he

He pointed out that the state will have to provide for collective bargaining agreements, increased public school enrollments, additional prisoners and a 2-per-cent population growth

Cresse said there has been a healthy increase in most tax collections and they will show a gain in excess of 6-per-cent next

He said the decision of the 1976 legislature to use nonrecurring revenue sources to provide for nearly \$100-million worth of spending this year makes next year's revenue gain ook worse than it actually is. Cresse said the state must replace those nonrecurring revenue sources with general reve-

"The jockeying around the egislature did in order to get through the appropriations this year is coming home to roost,'

Cresse cited three main sources of nonrecurring revenue that won't be available next year: about \$28 million in sewer loan repayments, \$34 million from changing the auto license distribution system and about \$15 million from speeding up tax collections.

"Our economy is not that bad," he said. "We have a 9per-cent increase in the sales tax. Our problem is simply use of nonrecurring revenue."

The \$33.5-million dip in this year's revenue projections results mainly from a slump in the construction industry resse said.

"The increase in construction ve forecast when we forecast last January has not materialized as rapidly as we anticipated," he said.

However, Cresse said, there will be no need to reduce spending this year as happened in each of the two preceeding fiscal years. The Cabinet had to cut 1974-75 spending by \$114 million and 1975-76 spending by \$44 million because revenue fell short of expectations.

> The major factor in avoiding another holdback this year, Cresse said, was \$18 million in federal grants designed to cushion sags in state revenues. The conference, consisting of

Ethics Star 'Unreachable'

Undoubtedly President-elect Jimmy Carter is particularly sensitive to conflicts of interest in the executive branch because of his own personal dilemma.

Mr. Carter is a very successful farmer. He will be considering many bills in the future that will affect agriculture, including peanut farms. To be totally above reproach, Mr. Carter should sell his interests in his peanut farm and industry. Yet that is not fair, because the Carter farm has been in the family for generations. It is more than a farm, it also is a heritage.

Thus, we can doubly sympathize with Mr. Carter as he proposes a new, tough code of ethics for the executives of his administration. He says he does not plan to appoint persons with strong vested interests to government positions that deal with similar matters; he will require his appointees to be scrupulous in their dealings with private business; officials in regulatory agencies will have to meet strict new requirements; and, finally, after government officials leave public service they will be circumscribed in using their influence to win government contracts.

These are noble goals, but as Mr. Carter himself is learning, the problem is infinitely more complex than it appears to be. Constitutional questions of rights of privacy, freedom of speech and activity, and equal protection of the laws immediately arise.

Beyond that, a conflict of interest is not readily definable in all instances. Any successful person in the United States frequently has a myriad of economic interests, some of which are intertwined. persons who have served government honorably and well have, like Mr. Carter, carried on a business legacy that they cannot readily abandon. Blind trusts and other methods, customarily used to put a curtain between an appointee and his prior career, may not always work. And if Mr. Carter is too astringent in enforcing academic codes of ethics, dynamic, successful persons could turn away from service to their country. Neither Mr. Carter nor the country would be served.

We give Mr. Carter high marks for his concern about the problem and for his determination to follow through on campaign promises.

We also are sure that he will learn the same lesson that many other presidents have. While it is theoretically possible to legislate ultimate morality, pragmatically a modicum of trust is always necessary.

The frightening aspect of the crimes is their total callousness. Many of San Francisco's society have long been accustomed to "doing their thing." Now the most liberal of these elements apparently believes that doing you own thing extends to terrorism, killing and robbing. Consequently, San Francisco authorities are fighting a psychological attitude as well as

WASHINGTON - Some people never learn anything from history. Next January will mark the 27th anniversary of Secretary of State Dean Acheson's historic address to the National Press Club in which he gave the green light to Communist aggression by

'80 Olympics' TV Price Tag: \$100 Million NEW YORK (AP) - The battle lines have been drawn. The wheeling and dealing is over. The high commands of

the three major networks are on hand. Two years of preliminary negotiations will climax over the weekend with a meeting in Moscow And within the next few days it should be known which network will own the television rights to the 1980 Summer

"When you look back over the last several years to what has captured the rancy of the American viewing public, to what has brought viewers to their TV sets that might not otherwise be there, the answer is the Olympics," says CBS President Bob Wussler. "We would be hard pressed to find a better way to spend our money."

And spend someone will. ABC paid \$25 million for the

rights to the Montreal Games last summer. The price tag for the 1980 Games is expected to be in neighborhood of

It's not a bad ratings booster, either. ABC averaged a 47 per cent audience share, meaning 47 per cent of the televisions turned on were tuned to ABC, over the two weeks of the Summer Olympics. And the network drew a 35 per cent share over the 11 days of the Winter Games in Innsbruck.

But CBS turned the idea down, saying it would prefer to take its chances alone. And those chances look pretty good. A brief look at the competition:

CBS-The network is rated the favorite. CBS has worked very hard for the Games and may be willing to bid higher than the others. Network officials have pursued the Soviets vigorously for 21/2 years. Also, CBS has been in a slump lately and needs the Games badly to restore lost ABC-Experience is the key to ABC's presentation. The

network did a fine job in Innsbruck and Montreal, and the Russians were impressed. But there is a feeling that ABC, NBC-Rated the longshot. Network sources have been

PHOENIX, Ariz. (AP) - Sandi, a 33-year-old Phoenix nurse, says she's found the joys of motherhood without the complications of marriage, adoption or sexual intercourse.

On Nov. 9, nine months after being artificially inseminated, Sandi gave birth to a girl, Mandy. "I always thought I would just get married and have six kids," she told the Phoenix Gazette.

Having no husband or boyfriend and religious principles that rade a casual affair distasteful to her, Sandi tried to adopt a baby, but found only one agency that would even consider a single woman. None had a healthy, white baby. Her gynecologist referred her to Dr. Robert Tanis, who main-

tains Arizona's only sperm bank. She checked with her minister, with a lawyer about illegitimacy problems and with her parents "in case something happened to me." Sandi started working two jobs to save money and lined up a future babysitter.

"I thought about it a long time, almost a year. I think I knew I was going to do it the day he (the gynecologist) mentioned it. It took me six months to get pregnant. I would go two to three

swallowing. Leukoplakia should be regarded as a potential cancer. That is why the doctor took a biopsy. Many of them do not progress to a malignancy, but others do. I must emphasize that your doctor has already considered this and has satisfied himself that your sister does not now have a cancer. However, it is very important that she be examined regularly and that a doctor check the status of the spot to detect any new changes as early as possible.

A Lakeland school teacher who received a swine-flu vaccination last month developed symptoms like those that caused national health officials to suspend the inoculation program, doctors said today.

It was the first report of a Floridian developing symptoms of Guillain-Bare syndrome. Officials are investigating to determine if there is a link between numerous reports of the malady and the vaccination program. Usually not fatal, the illness may cause temporary paralysis. Officials identified the patient as Judy

Roberts, 36. They said she was in serious condition at Lakeland General Hospital. Meanwhile, in Seminole County, Dr. Orville Barks, director of the county health department, said today the flu vaccine should be

"I think what they'll do is have us keep the vaccine on a stand-by basis in case there is any breakout of a swine flu epidemic." Federal officials suspended the program Thursday to investigate reports that some vaccinated persons have developed Guillain-Barre syndrome, a disease affecting the

They stressed that there was no prove association between the swine flu vaccine and the disease, but that the program suspension was "prudent," until the possibility of such a link was checked out.

The investigation which caused suspension of the program resulted from a reported 91 cases of Guillain-Barre syndrome in 14 states. Barks described the progress of the disease as follows: "First there is a mild respiratory infection with fever. This lasts a few days, then the patient recovers. Then around 21 days later the patient develops some weakness in the lower part of the body extending gradually upwards. The weakness may go as far as the arms. Occasionally there is paralysis merely of the face or arms, but this is rarer."

The disease as it is now being investigated in relation to the swine flu vaccine behaves somewhat differently. "When we knew this disease before the vaccine, people normally recovered. They probably spent a month in bed, but they did generally recover."




