These applications need to be signed, and either mailed or brought into the tax assessors office along with the personal property returns which need to be filled in, completed, and signed. Intangible personal property tax returns should be properly completed and filed also, Mrs. Walker added.







A Puzzle

Every few weeks, a man or woman phones or puts in an appearance at the Herald newsroom. This, in essence, is the usual plea -

"Listen, I've got myself in a little jam—got picked up for driv-ing while I had a few too many. How about keeping it out of the paper?"

Sometimes friends will call to "put in a good word" for Joe or Bill or Mary. These conversations leave the impression that the offense wasn't driving drunk, but being stupid enough to get caught.

Commenting on some recent auto tragedies, the Emerald Empire News, of Eugene, Ore., had this to say -

"The wife's hometown weekly newspaper arrived yesterday morning carrying news of a drunken driver who drove on the wrong side of an unloading school bus, struck and killed a six-year-old girl getting off the bus at her farm home.

The penalty meted out to this 'businessman gone astray" was a \$1,000 fine and a five-year suspended sentence. It cost him less to kill a first grader than it did to buy the car that killed her.

A few years ago we were involved

personally in the aftermath of an accident in which the mother, father and two of three children in a family were killed on a vacation trip by a drunken driver roaring down the wrong side of the highway at 80 miles an hour.

Who's to blame for this accepted state of affairs?

You are . . . the smug, complacent citizens who cluck like an old hen over murder at their back door and neither say nor do anything about it.

The drunk driver is still "socially acceptable" . . . a poor, unfortunate critter who has simply had one too many and too little sense left in his befuddled head to know better than to drive."

Acceptance of the drinking or drunken driver by the best people of our society is puzzling. As long as we continue that acceptance, as long as we smile indulgently and regard him as devilishly clever chap who got caught (or didn't get caught) doing something a little mischievous, just that long will we and our loved ones be endangered by dangerously impaired persons behind the wheel of death-dealing autos.







Stock Official Indicted On Tax Fraud

Street, much buffeted by recert federal inquiries, suffer ed a fresh jolt Tuesday with the indictment of J. Truman Bidwell, chairman of the board of governors of the New York Stock Exchange, on income tax evasion charges.

Bidwell, among the most successful and prominent of brokers, was accused in a federal indictment of evading \$55,908 in personal income taxes for 1956-57. The twocount Indictment followed elosely on reports that the federal government was build ing a major tax case against a prominent Wal! Streeter.

Bidwell's resignation from the board of governors and as chairman of that policy-making body of the nation's largest securities mart was quickly announced by the New York Stock Exchange. He had submitted the resignation Feb.

chairman of the board and a partner in the firm of Mitchell, Schreiber, Watts & Co., will succeed Bidwell as chairman at least until the annual exchange election May 14. Bidwell replied to the two count indictment, saying, "I have fully paid all taxes duc. At the same time he bitterly deplored what he called "a

most disquieting series of leaks and planted stories from high places in Washington." Bidwell, a 55-year-old inde pendent floor broker who handles orders for his own customers and other brokers, will plead to the indictment in federal court here next Mon-

Bidwell was the first ranking exchange official to be named in a criminal action in more than two decades. The last was Richard A. Whitney, a prominent broker-sportsman and exchange president from 1930 to 1935. Whitney pleaded guilty in 1938 to charges of stealing \$214,000 from funds in his custody and was given a 5-to-10-year sentence. Whitney virtually dropped from notice after emerging from Sing Sing Prison after serving nearly three-and-a-half

However, the financial world has been jolted by recent Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) criticisms of trading practices on the American Stock Exchange (AMEX), which ranks accond in size to the New York Stock Exchange. Both the AMEX president and its board chairman resigned, and a reorganization program for that exchange is expected to be presented by late May or early

Only a little over a week ago the SEC gave New York Stock Exchange specialists detailed questionnaires covering their market practices and activities.

U. S. attorney Robert Morgenthau followed up Tuesday's indictment by repeating an earlier declaration that there is no "concerted" government drive to investigate the tax background of persons working in Wall Street.

The indictment against Bidwell charged he had actual income of \$110,829 in 1956, but reported it was \$63,157, on which tax of \$28,116 was paid. The government claimed the 18x was short by \$31,429.

For 1957, Bidwell allegedly reported only \$61,336 income instead of \$97,372, and paid \$26,919 in taxes. The shortage for that year was said to be \$24,479.

Bidwell issued a statement

saying he had paid a halfmillion dollars in income taxes in the past five years and added, "This controversy is purely a personal tax matter between the Internal Revenue Service and myself. Neither


