

#### Glades Boat Ban Asked

MIAMI (AP) - Motorboats would be locked out of more than half of the Everglades National Park if the people charged with taking care of the area have their way. The National Park Service asked Congress on Thursday to declare 764,700 acres of the Everglades a wilderness area, a proposal which would limit development and close 54 per cent of the park to motorboats.

Though portions of the park are still privately owned development is not allowed except by the park service. But under the wilderness proposal, even the government could not build marinas or roads in certain areas. Park Superintendent Jack Stark admitted that the park is nearly "impossible to explore without a motor craft But he added that motor propellers were endangering procedule and alligator lairs and chewing up vegetation.

#### United, Union Avoid Strike

The twin-engine airplane crashed near the top of Mt. Graham, a peak 10,700 feet above the southern Arizona desert. An Army graves registration team from Ft. Hood, Tex. was scheduled to go to the scene today. Officials said the plane was a UC78, an Army trainer airplane which got its nickname because of its fabric and wood construction. It was used during World War II to train bomber pilots.
