# Lake Mary drops park plans

**LAKE MARY** — Property owners adjacent to Big Lake Mary once again encouraged city officials to halt plans for a public green area.

City Commission voted unanimously Thursday to withdraw an application to the Florida Communities Trust's Preservation 2000 Program for a grant to purchase a 5-acre piece of property located on the southside of Lake Mary

## For the second time, commission drops plans to develop Big Lake Mary area

Boulevard, City Commissioner Thom Greene said. The commissioners based their decision on public input that overwhelmingly supported not constructing the Lake Mary Preserve.

Before Thursday's special-called meeting, Greene said he received a form letter

stating opposition to the preserve that contained more than 30 signatures.

"I only received one letter in support of it," he said.

Of the more than 70 people who attended Thursday's meeting, only one property owner supported the preserve,

Greene said. Opponents voiced concerns about their privacy, public access and the lack of a guarantee that the area's usage would not increase in the future.

Three months ago, Commission voted to halt plans for Paradise Park, a green space on the same parcel of land that was considered for the preserve, following weeks of debate from residents. A majority of property owners voiced similar concerns about privacy, public lake

Record crowds are expected at fireworks displays throughout Seminole County.

Fireworks shows in parts of Central Florida were cancelled because of drought conditions earlier this summer. This is expected to boost attendance at festivities in Seminole County.

Festivities in Altamonte Springs today are expected to draw more than 100,000 people. Then on Tuesday Sanford, Winter Springs and Geneva will hold July Fourth fireworks displays. Each city's celebration offers a variety of music and festivities prior to the fireworks.

The following is a preview of fireworks displays on Monday and Tuesday in Seminole County:

• "Red Hot & Boom — 2000" will light up Altamonte Springs on Monday with a 20 minute fireworks show and a concert. Entertainment will

include Sonique, Amber, Effie 65, Sister Hazel, Voice V, and My Town.

Last year, 125,000 people participated in the celebration at Crane's Roost Park, located behind the Altamonte Springs Mall. The city is predicting a record crowd this year. Attendance is free.

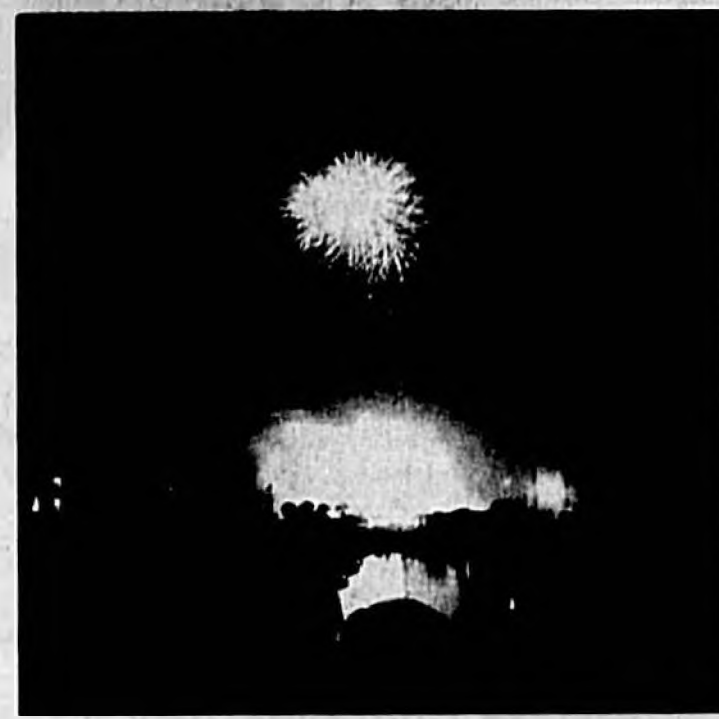
North Lake Boulevard and Whooping Loop Drive will be closed Monday for the event. Central Parkway will be shut down to all traffic at about 8 p.m. In addition, drivers not attending the celebration are encouraged to avoid the intersection of State Road 436 and Interstate 4 from 10 p.m. until midnight.

# SHS earns accreditation for magnet program

**SANFORD** — Seminole High School received good news recently regarding its International Baccalaureate program.

The IB program at Seminole has fulfilled the conditions of full participation in the Diploma Program with the International Baccalaureate Organization in New York.

The approval follows a lengthy application, a visit by the International Baccalaureate team, and an end of the year evaluation for the 1999-2000 school year.

Seminole is preparing to expand its International Baccalaureate (IB) magnet program for next school year.

The program will be expanded to include 11th grade in the 2000-2001 school year and 12th grade in 2001-2002. For the last school year, 230 students in the ninth and 10th grades were enrolled in the two-year-old program.

Students who live more than two miles from the school receive bus transportation. In addition, students living outside the regular zoning district for Seminole High School who are participating in the IB program receive transportation for extracurricular activities to and from the school they would normally be zoned to attend.

Students entering the magnet program take a rigorous set of English, social studies, math, and foreign language courses all four years of high school.

For students in the 11th and

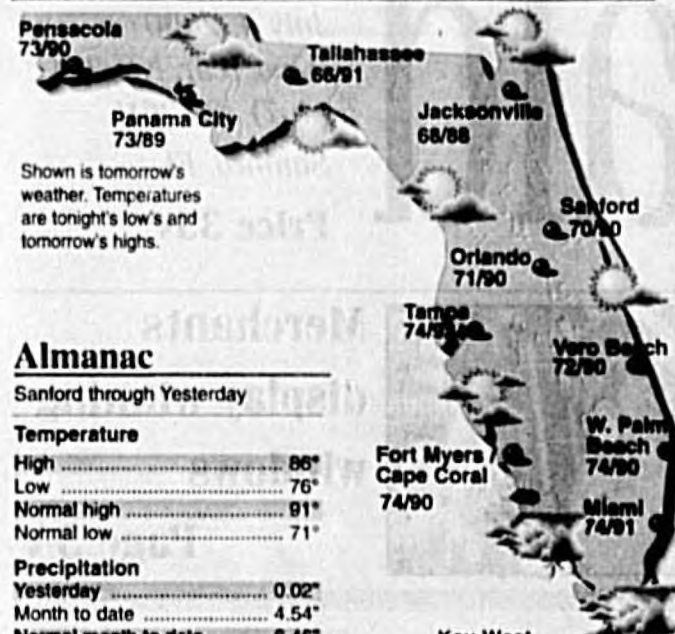

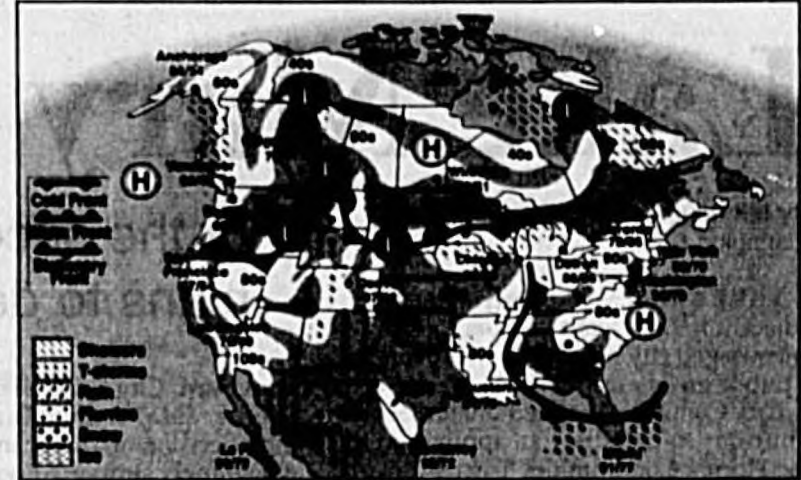

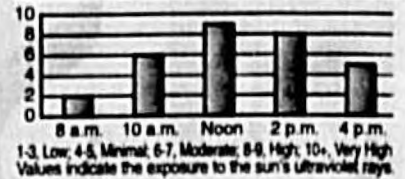

# A few words about the man I could never be

One Sunday morning when I stopped at a roadside flower stand on Route 434 in Longwood, the attendant — a young woman 17 at most — started to giggle.

When I inquired about the Easter lilies, she broke into the silliest of grins.

"You're Mr. Wilson, aren't you?" she said. It wasn't the first time something like this had happened to me.

A year or so before while with my family at Sea World, a gentleman stared my way and shook his head.

"For a moment there" he said. "I thought you were Walter Matthau."

I suppose there were similarities between myself and actor Walter Matthau, who passed away on Saturday. He was a tall man with a perpetual slouch. He usually looked as if he were sleeping in his clothes. He was created to be Oscar Madison in "The Odd Couple." And, Mr. Wilson in "Dennis the Menace."

There are worse things than being told you look like Walter Matthau. No one ever saw a hand-dog look on my face when receiving such notice — unless I was imitating the actor's hand-dog face which was recog-

nizable by people all over the world.

"My doctor gave me six months to live, and then when I told him I couldn't pay the bill, he gave me six more months," Matthau said in 1966 when he suffered a severe heart attack after filming "Hello Dolly" with Barbra Streisand. Matthau said working with Streisand was "an absolute nightmare."

Asked if he would work with Streisand again, Matthau rasped, "I'd love to work with Barbra Streisand again, in something appropriate. Perhaps Macbeth!"

Once described as unlikely a Hollywood star as the neighborhood delicatessen man, Matthau played an extraordinarily diverse galaxy of characters in a rich Broadway and film career. He won an Oscar and two Tony awards. His most recent movie, "Hanging Up" was released this February.

Two weeks ago when my wife tried to rent "I.Q.," the 1994 movie in which Matthau played Albert Einstein, she was told there were no copies available. She came home with one on Saturday about the same time we heard Mr. Matthau had died at 79.

"I.Q." was a nice movie, the type of movie my wife and I could enjoy on a Sunday afternoon. Matthau's Einstein was brilliant. As the New York Times obituary writer put it, "Einstein began to resemble the shaggy, shambling actor." The reason the movie didn't get rave notices, I assume, is because it wasn't vulgar or obscene.

Matthau told interviewers, "there are very few good stage actors but many good movie actors." He said he enjoyed being on stage because it was like having a seven-course meal. Doing movies, he said, was like eating a lot of hors d'oeuvres. "You get filled up but you're never quite satisfied," he said.

Playwright Neil Simon said Saturday that he wrote the "Odd Couple" with Matthau in mind to play Oscar. He was dumbfounded when Matthau insisted he play Felix Unger, Oscar's fussy apartment mate. Art Carney was Felix on Broadway, Jack Lemmon in Hollywood.

"We have lost one of the best damn actors we'll ever see," Lemmon said about his frequent co-star and dearest friend.

I'm slouched over my keyboard just thinking about the man I could never be.

Because of drought conditions and the threat of wildfires, the state has banned all outdoor burning, except in backyard barbecue grills.

The ban makes it a misdemeanor to light outdoor fires, including burning trash, building campfires or doing controlled burns to clear out vegetation. Violators face a fine of \$1,000 or more.

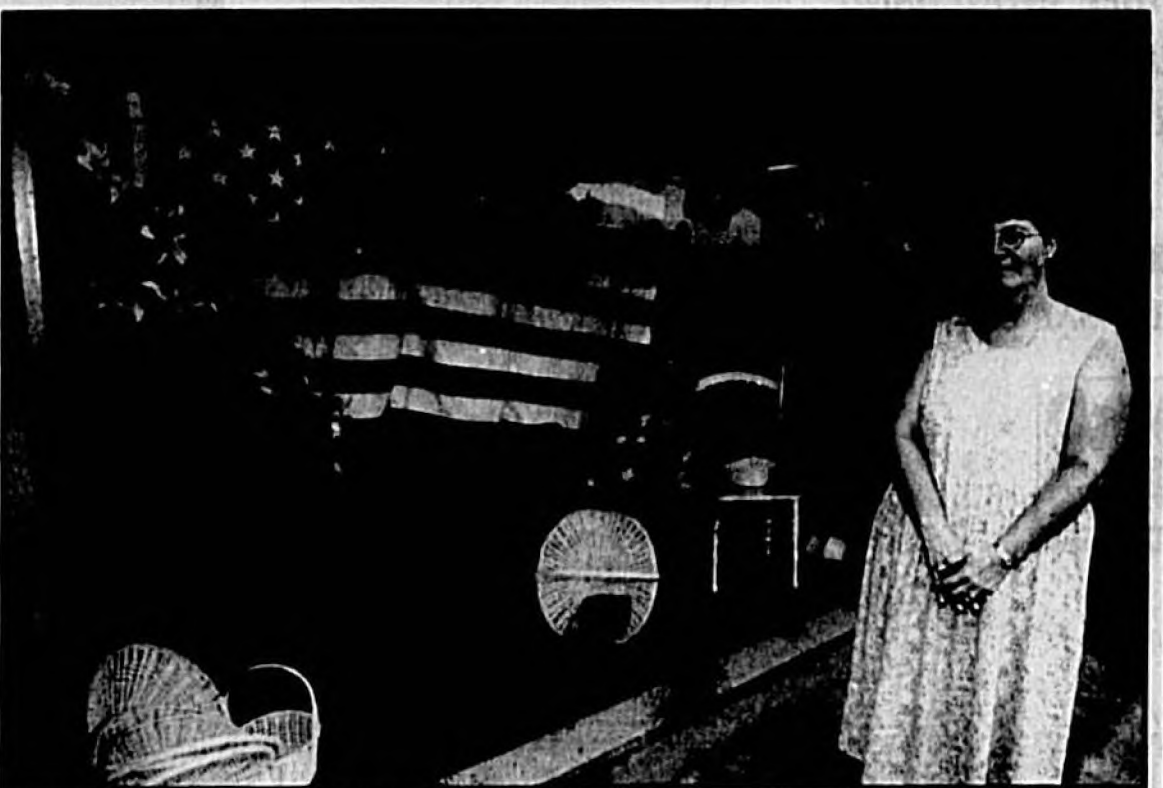

access and the possible future of the green space.

At the beginning of June, Lake Mary Mayor David Mealor said the city was once again submitting a proposal to the Trust after opponents and proponents of Paradise Park approached city officials and asked them to reconsider a green area for the property.

Plans for the Lake Mary Preserve included scattered picnic tables, a parking area, a non-

intrusive board walk and an experimental yard area.

"I feel Commission did its very best to listen to the public after hearing their concerns regarding the first application," Lake Mary City Manager John Litton said. "However, it came down to terms of privacy and public access."

The second application also included a "reverter clause" which guaranteed the preserve would remain the same in the future or it would revert back to

its original use. However, Greene said there was no guarantee the preserve's usage wouldn't increase.

As for the future of the property, Greene said he doubts the city will pursue any future plans for the area.

"I don't envision another attempt for the property" Greene said. "We were probably already at the minimum amount of public access the state would approve."

12th grades, the courses are college level. Students in the 10th grade can also take an Advanced Placement European History course for college credit.

In addition, students also must complete 150 hours of work in a community-oriented program called Creativity Action and Service, beginning in the summer after their 10th-grade year.

To complete the program, students must write a research essay of up to 4,000 words on a topic of their choice. Students in

the 12th grade also take a course called Theory of Knowledge, which ties together work students have performed throughout high school.

Students who complete the IB program automatically qualify for the Florida Academic Scholarship, which pays full college tuition plus \$600 for books and other expenses.

Seminole's IB program is one of 36 operating in Florida and 295 in the nation. Worldwide, there are 800 IB programs in operation.

Seminole High School this school year received notice that

it has been accepted as an affiliated International Baccalaureate (IB) school. The school will gain full IB status on Aug. 31.

Meanwhile, the school's Health Academy magnet program is also continuing to flourish. More than 500 students are expected to participate in either the IB or Health Academy magnet programs, which are open to students throughout Seminole County.

In the recent Health Occupations Students of America Competitions, 21 Health Academy students were recognized at the state level.

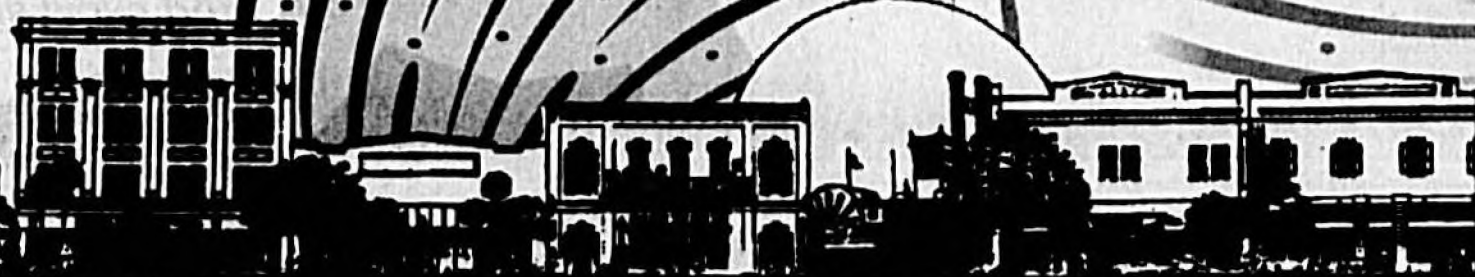

## New bass limits to take effect on two Central Florida lakes

New limits on large-mouth bass for Lake Walk-in-Water in Polk County and Lake Istokpoga in Highlands County will take effect on July 1, according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC).

The new regulation prohibits harvest of fish from 15 to 24 inches in length and reduces the bag limit to three largemouth bass per day, only one of which may be greater than 24 inches. The FWC instituted the regulation to preserve the quality of the fishery in two of central Florida's best bass fishing lakes.

FWC studies indicate that in both lakes, the harvest of bass greater than 18 inches is occurring at a rate much faster than the system can replace them. In fact, on Lake Walk-in-Water, fish greater than 18 inches make up only 3 percent of the population, yet they account for about 25 percent of the harvest.

"The regulation is designed to help maintain the high quality fishery, yet allow anglers to harvest a limited number of large trophy fish and abundant smaller largemouths that inhabit these two lakes," said FWC fisheries biologist Tim Coughlin. Public meetings on the proposed rule changes were held last November during which public comment was taken and the rule was refined.

Slot limits and limiting the number of trophy fish that can be kept will be more and more commonplace in the future. Taxidermists can do excellent replica mounts of fish from photographs and measurements. It's a good idea to keep a camera in your boat, to take pictures of fish that have to be released.

### FISHING FORECAST

River action is still fair in spite of the heat. Summer showers and low water levels combine for better fishing. Think small for river bass, and use tiny lures. Bass are feeding on grass shrimp and ditch minnows, and they balk from large lures.

Sebastian Inlet has good catch-and-release snook action with fish to over 20 pounds. Large live shrimp or finger mullet are the top baits. Also expect trout, red-

# Win some, lose some

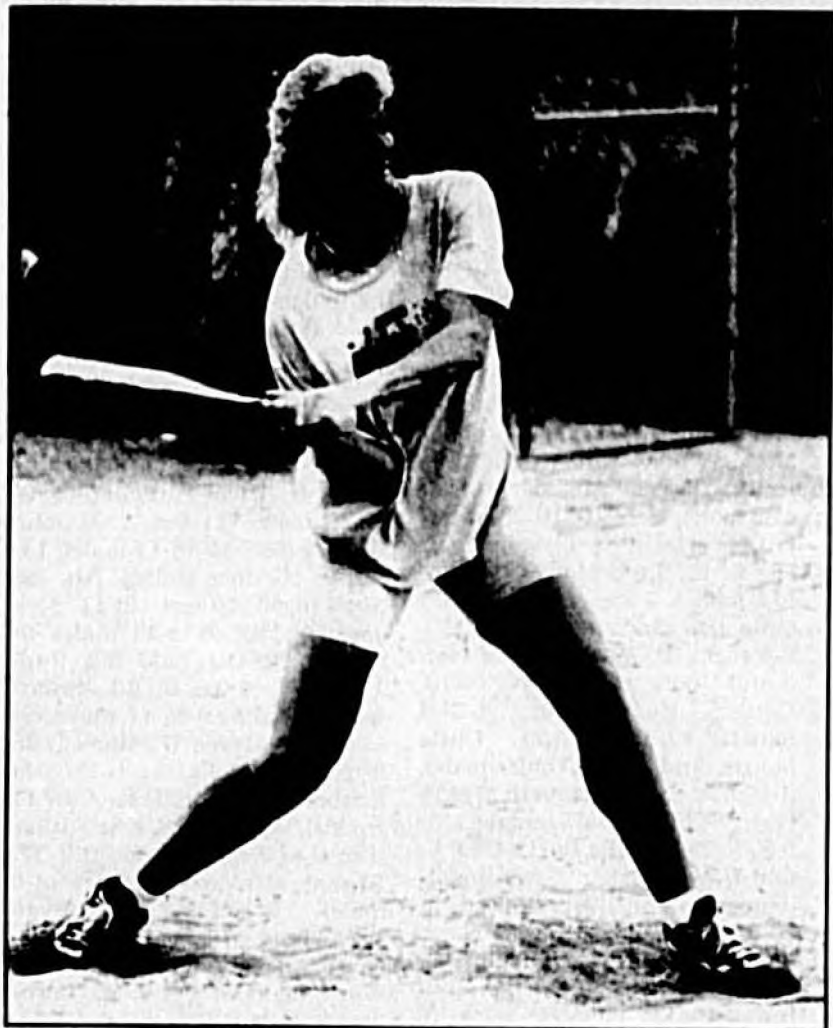

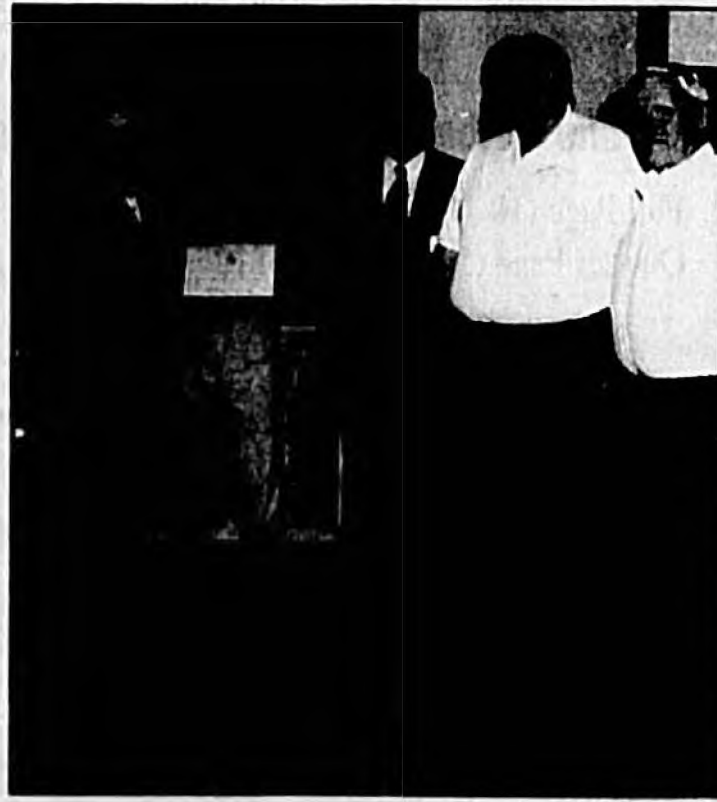

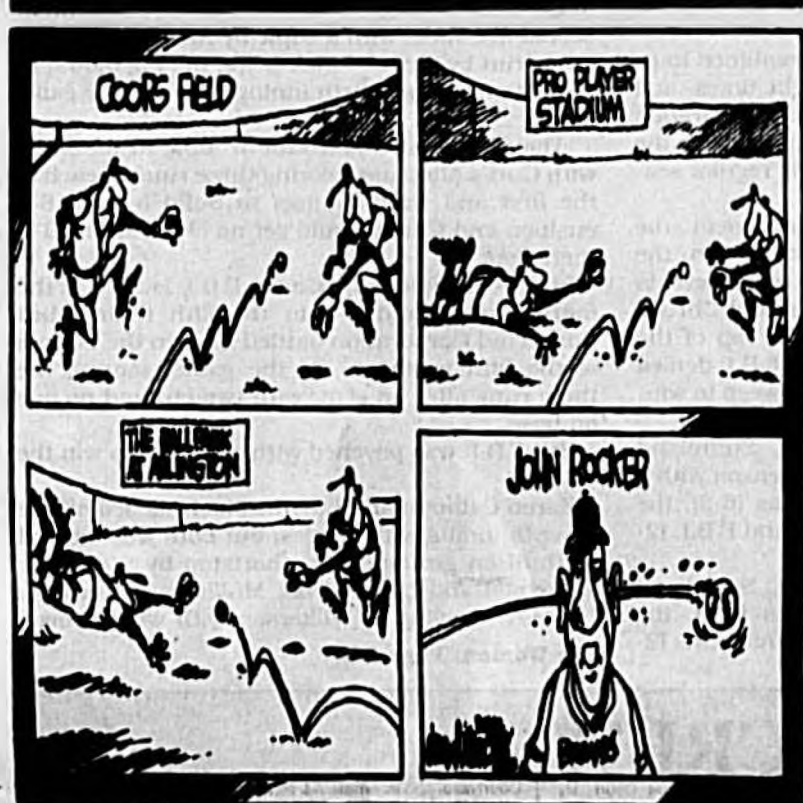

**Ponce Inlet** has good action on live or dead shrimp with a wide variety of species. Sheepshead, drum, redfish, bluefish and jack crevalle are all present in good numbers. Trout and redfish are rated as good in Mosquito Lagoon.
