





To many American diplomatic observers, the Soviet concession in the Pacific seems to be the Kremlin's way of sugaring renewal of that bid. There is no indication that the United States will change its stand against Russian control in the Dardanelles. But the Kremlin still appears

The Dardanelles to be hoping. Incidentally, the Russian approval of Amerian domination in the Pacific is viewed by some experts as a wedge between the Western allies. They point out that Russia reversed the British view—and thereby punched a hole in the Allied dyke through which the waters of discord may flow. . WHEN THE LATE O. 




