Retail Code Highlights U.S. SEEKS TO For Seminole County

No retailer shall increase the price of any merchandise sold after Oct. 30 over the price existing June 1, 1933, by more than is made necessary by the amount of increases in production, operating, replacement, invoice costs of merchandise, taxes or other costs resulting from action taken pursuant to the NIRA or the AAA since June 1, 1933. In setting such price retailers shall give full weight to probable increases in sales volume.

In order to prevent unfair competition against local merchants, the use of the so-called "loss leader" is hereby declared to be AN UNEXER TRADE PRACTICE. These "loss leaders" mre articles often sold below cost by the mercianit for the purpose of after ting trade. This practice results, of clusse, either in effort by the merchant to make up the loss by charging more than a reasonable profit for other articles, or else in DRIVING THE SMALL, MERCHANT WITH LITTLE CAPITAL OUT OF LEGITIMATE BUSINESS. It works back against the producer of raw materials on farms and in Industries and against the labor so employed.

Justices Hughes and Roberts sided with the progressives and the law was approved by the narrow margin of four to

five Another case involved an Oklahoma state law which would have put ice manufacturing in the class of a public utility and would have made it incumbent upon anyone wishing to go into the ice business to secure the consent of the state. When this case was brought to the Supreme Court by a manufacturer who had not secured the state's consent, the two justices who form the balance wheel sided with the conservatives and the law was held unconstitutional.
