County has not had that much experience with student housing. This is rapidly changing as Orange County $s$ oversaturated with apartments calering to students and they are stattine to deny and they are statting tha deny wanted to build a student
housing project on Alafaya near Colonial Dr. However a very vocal group of local residents told Commissioner Edwards that "no way did they want student housing next to their nelghborhood. The commissioner listened and Mr . Enmer dropped the project. In a recent convers tion with Mr. Emmer he acknowledged that Orange County is slowing down on student housing projects and that at least two other devel opers are looking to build student housing on Madent housing
With the recent denial of Knights Krossing and Spanos Knights Krossing and Spanos and the disclosure of complaints; it is abvious that student housing is not compatible with single family homes Orange Count is proposing a new Ordinance to deal with buffering student housing, hotels, boarding houses with single family homes. The Ondinance recommends 1500 feet between hotels or boarding houses and single family homes would be adequate. Seminole County needs to use this ordinance and adopt one similar to it now before allowing addition al student housing.
The main issue is why doesn't the University o Central Florida accept responsibility and house $50 \%$ of their students on cam pus? According to the UCF housing office only about housing office only about pus. Knights Krusing, off
