

## CROSS NATION RAIL SYSTEM IS SEEN NEAR

### Van Sweringen Brothers Have Only One More Short Link To Acquire In Project

CLEVELAND, Mar. 11.—(AP)—Formation of America's first transcontinental railroad system under control of O. P. and M. J. Van Sweringen is near completion, it was learned by financial circles here today. Only one more rail road is needed to complete the Van Sweringen system, more than according to the prediction of various railroad financial observers.

Already in control of a large railroad system covering 10,000 miles from the Atlantic to the Mississippi River, the Van Sweringens, according to financial circles, have acquired recently a working control of the Missouri Pacific system, which covers important trunk lines in Missouri, Kansas, Oklahoma, Texas, and Arkansas, and connects with the International Great Northern railroad at Mexico to Laredo, Texas.

The Missouri Pacific system has been acquired through the purchase of common stock and convertible bonds.

The only remaining link believed necessary to join the Atlantic and Pacific by a railroad system under the Van Sweringen management is the Western Pacific line from Salt Lake City to San Francisco.

The transcontinental system is being owned by a holding company which controls the following lines: Delaware, Lackawanna and Western, Buffalo to New York, Norfolk and Western, St. Louis, Missouri Pacific, St. Louis to Pueblo, Colo.; Denver, Rio Grande and Western, the 15 Salt Lake City and Western Pacific, from Salt Lake City to San Francisco.

## Cattle Rustlers In South Florida Are Caught By Sheriff

SARASOTA, Fla., Mar. 11.—(AP)—Cattle rustlers using methods employed in the old days of the Far West are active along the Myakka River in south Florida, Sheriff W. A. Jerns said today in reporting the arrest of two men.

Charles O. Rine, 35, and "Red" Anderson, 25, of Punta Gorda, were caught slaughtering a steer after the carcass of a rifle had been found in their backwoods camp. The sheriff said the men were heavily armed and the men surrendered without offering resistance.

Evidence of rustling was received by the sheriff several days ago and the hunt started. The rustlers remained in the backwoods until a camp in the dense vegetation along the river was located and worked up the stream. Large piles of cattle skulls were found with evidence that the skins were taken and the beef marketed through an accomplice in Punta Gorda.

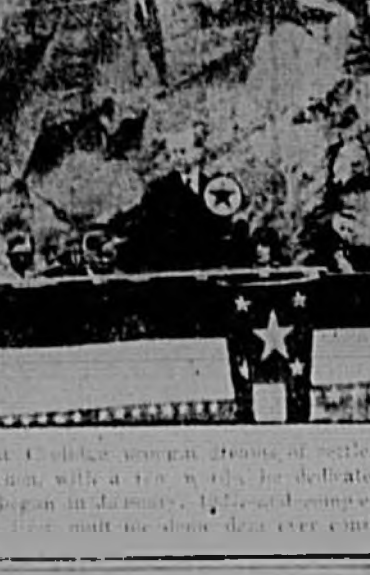

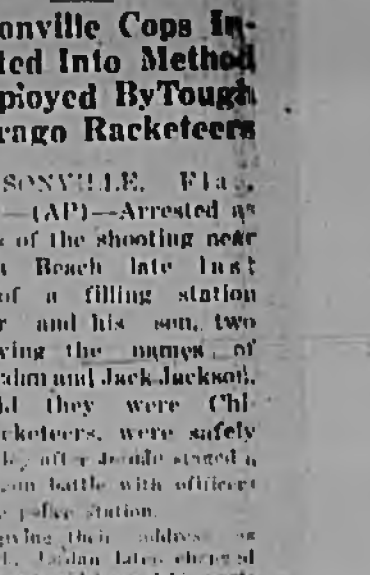

#### Dr. David A. Robertson To Give Farewell Address To Graduates

FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE, Tallahassee, Mar. 12.—Dr. David A. Robertson, assistant director of the American Council on Education, will give the commencement address and the right reverend president, A. J. W. Wilson of the Board of Trustees of the Florida State College, will preside at the ceremony.

Commencement this year will celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the college, and a large number of alumni are expected to return for this event. ### Mahatma Devotees Depart Upon Third Day Of Their March

NAWAGON, India, Mar. 14. (AP)—Mahatma Gandhi, Indian nationalist leader, left here at dawn today with his 79 devotees for their third day's march to the salt fields at Jalapur, in inaugura-

tion of the movement for Indian independence. They arrived shortly at Vasa and intended to proceed to Matra where they will halt for the night.

In an address before the village at Nawagon Gandhi congratulated the eight head men who resigned in protest against Vallabhai Patel's imprisonment. He ex-

horted them to manufacture and to wear homespun cloth and to volunteer as civil resistance workers. His exhortation for severance of government connections also brought about resignation of police head constable at Vasa and Mahatma. The villagers voted in Gandhi's presence not to fill the vacancies.

### Mayor Of Hialeah Testifies In Court At His "Rum" Trial

MIAMI, Fla., Mar. 14—(AP)—Mayor John P. Grethen of Hialeah, testified in United States district court today that ill feeling had prompted testimony given against him yesterday in his hearing on charges of conspiracy to violate the national prohibition law.

Grethen, A. K. Ewing, former Hialeah police chief, and William P. Ennis, now chief of police at Hialeah, went on trial yesterday. Witnesses testified that they conspired with liquor traffickers to violate the prohibition law and that they took for their own liquor confiscated in raids.

A rebuke administered to Walter Maddocks, former city judge of Hialeah, for stealing liquor brought the breach between him and Maddocks after which Maddocks threatened him, Grethen said. He further testified that Maddocks had made a "proposition" to him to dispose of a seized liquor through government agents. When he refused the offer, Grethen said, Maddocks told him he would have government agents "down on him" in the future.

Threats also were made by J. I. Quinby, former chief of the Hialeah Police Department, that "he and federal men would get me," Grethen testified. This threat, he said, was occasioned by his action of discharging Quinby.

### Cole Blease Says Postoffice Jobs In Dixie Being Bought

WASHINGTON, Mar. 14—(AP)—The allegation that postmaster jobs were being sold by Republican officials in South Carolina with the knowledge of Postmaster General Brown, was made in the Senate today by Senator Blease, Democrat, N. C.

Blease said the postmaster general "ought to be sent to the Senate when he knows that they have been paid for." He spoke after Senator Brookhart, Republican, Iowa, had notified the Senate that tomorrow he would submit to the Senate a final report on the investigation of patronage conditions in the southern states by the postoffice committee.

Demanding to know why Blease had not placed his charges before the investigating committee, proposed to go over the evidence of Blease and if it warranted, to reopen the inquiry.

"I don't bring it to the committee's attention," said Blease, "because if it has done anything I don't know it. I want action and I am going to get it."

They speak of this as a mysterious form of paralysis which has been afflicting scores of persons in Tennessee, Oklahoma, and a number of other states. But we don't see anything mysterious about it. We've never seen anyone yet who could drink enough of the stuff without having a paralysis.

There seems to be some question as to whether there will be any thousand cars of celery shipped from Florida, or ten thousand cars. Now if the Senate will just send down an investigating committee to ascertain the truth of the matter, we'll guarantee that it won't be long before we will be shipping any cars at all.

The possibility looms that Judge Nathan Bryan, formerly United States Senator from Florida, not a judge of the United States circuit court of appeals, may be appointed to succeed Justice Swayne of the Supreme Court. Judge Bryan was one of Florida's greatest senators and President Hoover would not do better than to put him on the Supreme Court.

The Chamber of Commerce wound up its campaign in a blaze of glory. There were a few citizens who could not forget the mistakes of the old organization, but almost everyone, whether remembering or not, seemed to realize that without undivided support there can be no Chamber of Commerce and that without such an organization very little if anything can be done for Sanford.

Let's Be Cheerful

A real estate man told us the other day that if some of our people don't get over the habit of complaining about hard times, it never would be possible to interest outsiders in making investments here. "Business conditions are no worse in Sanford," he said, "than in most parts of the country at the present time, but our folks have gotten so in the habit of talking about it that people, who come here and listen to the complaints, think we must have the worst town in the United States."

The real estate man was particularly put out because he had been on the verge of making a sale to a tourist who wanted to purchase a home in one of the smaller cities of Florida where he could send his family each winter. He deemed it like Sanford and to think it was the very place for him. The golf course, the wonderful roads for motoring, and the fact that Sanford is in the very center of things, not much farther from Miami than from Tampa or Jacksonville, all appealed to him.

There is little doubt that he would have bought one of our fine homes and become a regular winter resident, but in the course of his stay here while he was looking around, he made it his business to talk to some of our citizens about conditions generally, and during these conversations it soon became impressed upon him that we have what might be called, to say the least, a pessimistic population. Not entirely of course, but far too much so.

For he told the real estate man, that while he was not worried about the bond situation and the possibility of high taxation, he did not want to bring his family to a place where they would be located in the midst of a cloud of gloom. He said that some of the merchants in whose stores he had seen a reasonable number of shoppers, had told him that business was rotten. He said that some of the farmers had told him that the celery market was shot. Others had said that Sanford would never be able to pay its debt.

If Sanford people do talk this way to strangers who come here, possibly with the idea of investing money, either in homes or new industries, it is perfectly obvious that they are defeating the only means of saving themselves. If business is bad, the only way to improve it is to bring in more people and more money. If taxes are high, the only way to reduce them is to find more people who will come here and help us pay them. And we can't very well do this by throwing a wet blanket over every stranger in our midst.

We suggest, purely as a matter of good feeling, that the next time a tourist ventures to discuss local conditions with any of us that he present our most favorable side to him. We do not have to falsify, for conditions are not really so bad as some of us apparently like to believe, in order to convince him that we haven't really the worst city in the United States. If we are cheerful, bright, optimistic, that alone might be sufficient to induce some to come here.

Take Care Of Your Teeth

"Have you anything the matter with your teeth?" recently asked Mme. Ida Chernoff, famous lecturer on beauty, health, and charm. It is a real question to ask publicly, but then many things for the best are personal nowadays, and those who see no harm in a free discussion of sex problems, physical culture, or the income tax, certainly cannot object to Mme. Chernoff's remarks on personal hygiene, particularly the care of the teeth.

For the teeth, as she very rightly says, not only give or take from one's health and physical strength, but may also detract greatly to one's beauty and charm, or they may detract from one's appearance that he is doomed by them to failure in life. The sudden death of Justice Sanford recently, immediately following the extraction of a tooth, shows the tremendous effect upon the health which these apparently insignificant parts of the body may have.

"The old story of the lost horseshoe nail which caused the loss of a shoe, of a horse, of a rider, of a battle, and ultimately of a nation, has nothing on teeth, so far as consequences are concerned," declares Mme. Chernoff. "We are all lip readers, whether intentionally or not. A demonstration of the rapidity with which the public notices teeth, can easily be noticed in their absence. Many an otherwise beautiful countenance is marred by faulty teeth.

"Teeth are viewed today as a certain proof of character. Ill-treated for teeth breathe literally the shameful story of their neglect. We may easily classify the person with the badly kept teeth as being either ignorant of the most common social graces or most careless of public opinion. A woman with bad teeth probably extends the same care to her body cleanliness, to the neatness of her home and the quality of the food she serves.

"You would not think of a woman who was as immaculate housekeeper and faultlessly careful of her own cleanliness as being a sloven in the kitchen. Neither would you think of a woman with the same attributes as being neglectful of her teeth, unless it was through sheer ignorance, and even this last excuse is losing plausibility when so many worthy products are constantly being brought to her attention as solutions for teeth trouble.

"Nothing adds more to a happy countenance than the gleam of pearly white teeth. True, if they are regular and even, the effect is heightened. Clean teeth are instinctively read as a sign of good breeding. No amount of other toilet detail should permit a woman to neglect this most important item. Psychologically, teeth carry a message of cultural propriety cared for."

WASHINGTON DAY BY DAY

Although the United States has not joined the World Court yet—two American jurists have served on the bench at The Hague—John Bassett Moore and Charles Evans Hughes.

If they are foreigners the tourists bow low, almost reverently, as they pass the bench where the jurists sit in velvet robes with jabots and lace cuffs. Visiting Americans wave their hands in greeting or else say, "Hello, Judge."

While Chief Justice Hughes was on the Hague bench, the court attendant rushed in one day with cards of two American women who wished to pay respects. The attendant was in a state of high excitement. The women had written on their cards:

"Daughters of the American Revolution." The attendant raved over the word "Revolution." Even when an explanation was given him as to the patriotic nature of the D. A. R., he was unimpressed and walked from the room mumbling: "Revolution revolution."

Acting Secretary of the Navy John D. Ford went down to the Navy Yard, recently to help dedicate a statue. There was a big parade. Streets were jammed. Buildings were decorated.

Commander John L. Ford said: "There's a man leaving to you Mr. Secretary." "How do you know that one man in this crowd is leaving to me?" John asked.

"I know he is," Ford replied with assurance. "But how do you know?" "Because he is a Republican," the former Governor declared. "And how do you know that?" "Because he is the President of the Board of the National Association of Manufacturers," Ford replied with a smile.
