



Foes Massing To Fight Carter Jet Sales Plan

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Congressional sources said today a strong majority appears to be emerging in the both Senate and House foreign committees against President Carter's proposed package sale of jet warplanes to Israel, Saudi Arabia and Egypt.

Senate Foreign Relations Committee members were meeting today in closed session to continue seeking a "pragmatic settlement" with the administration over the controversial sale.

Vorster Shuns U.S. Raid Rap

CAPE TOWN, South Africa (UPI) - Prime Minister John Vorster, apparently ignoring American criticism of a South African raid against Namibian guerrillas in Angola, today congratulated his troops on their one-day invasion. Angola said it had mobilized its Cubanbacked army

Defense Minister Pieter Botha said South African forces crossed the Angolan border Thursday and destroyed several guerrilla bases to put a stop to their incursions into South West Africa, also known as Namibia.

Mondale Talks In Indonesia

JAKARTA, Indonesia (UPI) - Vice President Walter Mondale arrived in Indonesia today for talks with President Suharto and other government leaders on the third leg of his five-nation Asian and Pacific tour.

Mondale flew to Jakarta from Bangkok, where he had toured a hot and crowded refugee center earlier today and received a flag-waving welcome from Indochinese bound for the United States.

Italians Urge No Moro Deal

ROME (UPI) - Four masked gunemen blew off the left kneecap of Umberto Degli Innocenti, 51, of the Sit-Siemens telecommunications plant in Milan and just moments later in Genoa, two men shot Alfredo Lamberti, 41, personnel chief of the Italsider metal plant, shattering his right leg. The Red Brigades quickly claimed responsibility for both attacks.

The terrorist action resulted in a flood of calls to radio and television stations throughout Italy today protesting any government move to negotiate with the Red Brigades for the release of kidnapped former Premier Aldo Moro.

Fedorenko, 70, listened attentively during two days of hearings that ended here Thursday as witnesses testified before a special U.S. District Court master. The government charges that Fedorenko killed people at a concentration camp during

If the government succeeds in deporting edorenko he faces possible trial in West Germany as a war criminal. A former resident of Miami Beach, Fla, the earing will resume in Ft. Lauderdale on May

The case hinges on statements Fedorenko made when he entered the United States in 1949 as a displaced person and in 1969 when he filed a naturalization petition.

He said then he was a laborer in the Russian Army and was found to be of good moral character, a requirement for citizenship. Assistant U.S. Attorney Don Boswell said Fedorenko has admitted in a deposition that he was trained by the Germans to be a guard at Treblinks, a Nazi death camp in Poland But, Boswell said, that's the only concession the Russianborn Fedorenko has

Florida Takes Closer

Look At Personnel Travel

TALLAHASSEE (UPI)-in the wake of the resignation of one of its top officials, the state is taking another look at loopholes in laws governing spending by personnel traveling abroad.

Joseph K. Hennessy resigned as assistant commerce secretary Thursday following release of an audit alleging he bilked the state of \$2,369 and used another \$10,124 to pay personal obligations for three months before turning it back to the state.

State Attorney Harry Morrison said he is investigating to see if criminal violations were involved. Hennessy hired an attorney and declined to comment beyond his resignation.

Court Asked: Condemn Corn

JACKSONVILLE (UPI) - The government Thursday asked the U.S. District Court to condemn as a health hazard 134,000 bushels of shelled corn stored at Live Oak and another 375 bushels at Green Cove Springs. U.S. Attorney John L. Briggs said the contaminated corn contains a poisonous substance described as aflatoxin, which is caused by bacteria molds.

The corn at Live Oak is in possession of Gold Kist Inc., an Atlanta-based firm, while that at Green Cove Springs is owned by Wil-Win Farms Inc. Briggs said it was shipped from Nashville (Ga.) Milling Co. last January.





A Matter Of Deduction

The White House staff is said to be urging President Carter to rally public opinion behind his tax reform proposals. The House Ways and Means Committee mi. seen giving them rough treatment.

Mr. Carter may have presumed that the public would rally behind him with no further prompting when he announced his proposals last January to simplify the federal tax system and make it more

After all, his campaign crowds in 1976 always applauded when he falked about the disgrace of

But Democrats on the House Ways and Means Committee are defecting to join Republicans in discarding one after another of Mr. Carter's proposals.

Why? The reason is that the president's reforms would do away with deductions that millions are using to whittle down their income taxes every year.

Mr. Carter's attack on the business deduction for the "three-martini lunch" and other entertainment may have kept the majority applauding, but that was only one target.

He would also eliminate the deduction for property taxes, and for state and local sales taxes. Millions of taxpayers also would lose the deduction for medical expenses, because only those expenses exceeding 10 percent of income, rather than the present 3 percent, would be deductible.

The president doesn't hide the fact that his reforms are designed to raise more federal revenue - some \$9 billion more. The idea is to combine that increase with \$34 billion in reductions in tax rates, thus producing the \$25 billion net tax cut which the administration believes is necessary to keep the economy humming.

Hattaway Predicts Senate Bill Defeat

They're calling it "The Year of the Horse" at Seminole Harness Raceway.

"I don't undersicing how the bill got to the Senate floor anyway without track management even being consulted," said track manager Neil Makin Thursday night at the season opener, which drew a crowd of 3,310 fans who wagered \$149,472, both opening-night records.

About the proposed switch from harness to greyhound license, Makin commented, "It would be a severe blow to Florida's harness racing industry. Pempano Park is going strong, running from November until mid-April. Horsemen take two weeks off, come here and race until September. Horses have to rest a while, and by then they are ready to go to Pompano again.

"I see this operation turning \$300,000 in mutuel handle

on weeknights and close to \$500,000 per night on weekends in five years. This will bring us into the major league of harness racing. It will also bring a lot of horsemen here to

live year-round." Principal owner Paul Bowlen did not want to comment on the sale or the bill. He admitted being miffed by the premature announcement from Dervaes, an officer with the Washington County Kennel Club near Ebro. If the sale

Court Reporter Admits, But Defends Double-Billing

Seminole County Court Reporter Norman Robbin had admitted double-billing the county and state for the same work, during fiscal year 1975, but defended it as a practice authorized by the circuit court at that time.

Robbin and other officials in the 18th Judicial Circuit, which includes Seminole and Brevard counties, were

criticized for "questionable" record-keeping practices in a newly released audit by Assistant State Auditor General Bob Syms. It covered from July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976. State law provides court reporters will be paid \$5,400 base pay per year for a maximum of 60 hours permonth.

Robbin and three court reporters in Brevard County billed both the county and state for the same initial 60 hours of work each month, according to the audit.
