The Seminole County Association for Retarded Children (SCARC) got its needed shot in the arm from the county commissioners this morning. The commissioners voted to authorize payment of up to \$5,000 of SCARC's debts,

The only commissioner opposing the move was Al Davis, who said he is not opposed to the group and what it does, but is opposed to the county government taking the responsibility of funding part of the program.

Most of the commissioners indicated they believed the program was primarily of an educational nature and in the future the majority of the funding should come from the School Board.

The commission has delayed a decision on the requested funding to await the outcome of a conference between Clerk of the Circuit Court Arthur Beckwith and County Attorney Harold ohnson. The two conferred as to the proper legal procedure for

Beckwith said for the county to pay the bills a complete audit of the accounts must be made and payment of the invoices authorized individually. The procedure the county must follow will prevent the group from meeting their July 1 deadline to avoid losing state matching funds.

SCARC representative Christine Jones said the group had made provisions for borrowing the money using the county commission resolution as collateral.
