





Admiral Turner defended his war-warning message to Kimmel which was sent on Nov. 27, 1941, declaring that it was entirely adequate and did not call for any supplementary orders. He added that he had had the utmost respect for Admiral Kimmel's abilities, and that this respect was shared throughout the Nayy.
