Longwood will study parking impact of boats

LONGWOOD - Several Longwood residents Monday said they are angry over city codes regulating the parking of commercial vehicles and boats in residential areas, as the City Commission said the

codes will be revised.

The commission, before an audience of nearly 30 people Monday, approved hiring consultants for comprehensive planning of land development codes. City Manager John Drago will work with the city's Code Enforcement Board to ease growing friction between

residents and code enforcement officers.

The commission will review the proposals by the consultants for the revised land development code in sections.

"Just about everyone in the city is out of compliance with boats," Commissioner Paul Lovestrand said.

The city's current land development code says that boats, trailers and recreational vehicles may be stored in a side or rear yard, but they must be screened from the street and all abutting lots by an opaque fence, dense hedge, wall or healthy ornamental evergreen hedge that is at least 80 percent opaque.

The code says that the fencing must be at least eight feet tall. The code at one time required six foot tall fencing. Mayor Rusty Miles said concessions can be made for fencing at least six feet tall.

Miles said Drago will have discretion to work with the Code Enforcement Board. Commissioner Annamarie Vacca said concessions need to be made for older homes. Commissioner Steve Miller was also in favor of reviewing

the land development code.

"The laws have to make sense," Miller said.

Longwood resident James Smith said that he does not know how to bring his 1-ton

flat bed truck that is used as a commercial vehicle into compliance with city codes.

The code says that commercial vehicles will be allowed in residential areas only if they can be parked in the garage with the door closed. The vehicles can not have more than two axies, four tires, and four square-feet of signage, according to the code.

"We need to take consideration for the 50 some-odd residents who have been cited for similar issues," Vacca said.

Longwood resident Leo Canarelli said that the part of the code regulating fencing should be dropped. He said a stockade fence is an invitation to

crime, since it prevents neighbors from keeping an eye on nearby backyards. He also said that the sight of a boat in Florida should not be a cause

for concern.

"What we want is fairness,"

Canarelli said. "And I don't

think we're setting that "

think we're getting that."
Longwood resident Vince
Warren also said code regulating boats should be reviewed.

"It's Florida," Warren said.
"People have bosts."

Longwood resident Robin
Thorne said he does not know
how to store his boat in compliance with the code. He said
building a fence would obstruct access to his backyard.

New helicopter is latest addition to county fleet

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Seminole County this week took possession of its newest tool in firefighting and public safety -a military surplus helicopter, recently retrofitted in Panama City, which will serve the county in three major roles.

According to county fire chief Terry Schenk, the helicopter's first mission is to fire prevention and safety. A 420-gallon bucket hangs from a tether to scoop up water from a lake or river and dump the water onto a fire site.

The helicopter will also be used to transport patients to hospitals. "We will continue to use AirCare (provided by Orlando Regional Medical Center)," said Schenk. In the past, if AirCare was not available, the county used the Orange County Chase helicopter. "We now have reciprocity (with the neighboring counties) for the first time," the chief said.

Additionally, the helicopter is equipped with a hoist which will be used to rescue victims

trapped on lakes, rivers or in inaccessible areas like state preserves, he said.

In the past, fire officials used the sheriff's helicopter to obtain an aerial view of a wild-fire. The Division of Forestry keeps a helicopter in Marion County, "but there is a alim chance to use it since it is usually committed to other missions," said the chief.

Schenk said that the county saved more than \$3 million by utilizing the surplus vehicle instead of buying a new one. The \$375,000 cost of the rehabilitation is for avionics, stretcher kits, radios and other technical upgrades. The work even includes a new coat of paint.

Explaining the source of funding the purchase, Schenck sald, "Years ago, before there were development impact fees, the county had a developer commitment fund." He said that the developers of Heathrow were recently asked to approve the use of the fund for the helicopter instead of its original intent, an aerial apparatus (ladder truck).

Resident fights excessive water bill

LONGWOOD - A Longwood resident may receive leniency from the City Commission for an \$820 February water bill that she claims to be the city's mistake.

Jayne Sims said there is no way she could have used 527,000 gallons of water for two people in her 1,400 square-foot Georgia Avenue home. She has spent \$4,000 in legal fees trying to fight the water bill.

"It's impossible to use that much water for two people," Sims said.

Willie Laura Cochran, 72, of

905 Orange Avenue, enjoys tending her garden and helping neighbors.

The mustard greens in Laura's garden have leaves that are more than 18 inches long. Laura's garden also has young collard greens, sugar cain, black berries, okra, black-eyed peas, and a variety of other vegetables.

"I just started this garden in February." Laura said. "I always keep something going."

Laura planted peanuts on Good Friday. She said that according to tradition, anything planted on Good Friday will grow fast and be more successful."

The collard greens in Laura's garden were planted on Valen-

tines Day. She said that by tradition, what is planted on Valentines Day won't go to

Laura said she has been planting gardens since she was about six years old.

"I've always had about four or five things growing," Laura said

The secret to a successful garden, Laura said, is to use leaves instead of fertilizer, and bury the leaves in dirt and said.

"When the leaves get damp and moist they will grow faster." Laura said. I bag my leaves up and make me a rut in the earth. When it rains and the leaves get rotten, the crops will grow fast."

Born in Camilla, Ga. on Aug. 26, 1926, Laura moved to Sanford in 1946 with her latehusband John Cochran.


Cochran served in World War II, then became a migrant farmer after moving to Sanford. He cut pine trees for pulpwood for a company in Please see Garden, Page 3A







Why a Lost City is lost no more

In the early afternoon Monday, Herbert Cherry watched a wondrous event happen on 13th Street in what some historians regard as the Lost City of Goldsboro.

Workmen wheeled a pair of mobile trailers into a freshly paved lot next to the 13th street property owned by Cherry and across the street from the shops of Cherry

Sheriff's deputies and San-ford officers will work from the trailers in community policing partnership. Later, a perma-nent service center may be

constructed at the site.

Cherry said Monday. "We
prayed about this. We're
proud that it has happened.

Cherry, who will be 79 on Friday, said he prayed about the Goldsboro community and the new police service center

at Easter Sunday services. Founded in 1891, Goldsboro would have been the third oldest black city in the nation if not for powerful Sanford leaders who in 1911 took away Goldsboro's charter and swallowed its borders. Herbert Cherry - one of 8 in his family

- was born 9 years later.
"I know the history," he said. I know of our heritage. Black laborers came here to work in the celery fields and for the railroads. Our families lived and died here."

Goldsboro once had its own police and fire departments and a town council. By 1904, there were three churches with rapidly growing membership rolls. There was a bakery and a drug store and other businesses. More than 300 blacks lived in the unique community two miles away

from Sanford. Zora Neale Hurston wrote in one of her books that. "The thriving city of Sanford looked with displeasure on the new town (Goldsboro), not because it was colored but because it was incorporated, and this would seem to block the westward expansion of Sanford.

Goldsboro residents came to the Sanford Herald, pleading their case: To swallow us up in the corporate limits of Sanford will add very little to Sanford and take a great deal from us." Untimately, Sanford persuaded its state senator to take away Goldsboro's charter.

In later years, Herbert Cherry and his neighbors have been saddened to see the Goldsboro community as it fell into disarray. The building stock in the community is of generally poor condition and those buildings with historic value are in desperate need of repairs.

Drug dealers invaded the area sometime ago - and the few whites that have been seen were wearing police uniforms. It was too much for the Sanford cops alone, sheriff's deputies were also called. Longtime residents feared for their lives and the future for their chil-

fairly resistant to breakage. The brittle wood of Weeping Bottlebrush may make it un-suitable for windy areas but this is usually not a problem in most locations. Surface roots

are usually not a problem.

Culture: Bottlebrush can grow

in almost any type of soil, slightly acidic and with good drainage. T he tree blooms best under full sun. Transplant only little trees from containers. After the tree is established in the landscape, it is quite drought tolerant. Fertilte regularly to maintain good flower color and dark green foliage. It is recommended that trees should be Fertilized two to three times per year. Suckers from the trunk need to be removed periodically to maintain tree form. Maintain a good control of the grass around the tree.

Use: Bottlebrush can be trained as a tree to 15 feet or espaliered as a quick wall cover, it makes a nice screen or tall unclipped hedge.
Pruning to develop several
trunks and removing some lower branches can create fine small specimen tree. It can also be used in containers or above-ground planters; es-palier; hedge; large parking lot islands: wide tree lawns; medium-sized parking lot islands; medium-sized tree lawns. It is also recommended for buffer strips around parking lots or for median strip plantings in the highway; near a deck or patio; screen; small parking lot islands; narrow tree lawns; specimen or residential street

Propagation: It is usually propagated from cuttings but it can also be grown from seeds and air layers.

Pests and diseases: Bottlebrush is not affected by spe-cific insect problems' but mites can affect the leaves. Root and crown fungal discases can become a problem under high soil moisture conditions. Twig galls and witches broom, two fungal diseases, can diafigure the tree. Chlorosis, of the new leaves can be corrected with treatment of the soil using fron sulfate or iron chelate. The tree is often short-lived due to disease problems.





The Angels set a club record by using the disabled list 23 times in 1998. Now Gary DiSarcina (.287, 73 runs), who plays shortstop for Anaheim, has to sit out for a couple of weeks with a broken arm.

Starters Chuck Finley (11-9, 3.39 ERA) and Jason Dickson (10-10, 6.05) led the club in wins. Tim Belcher (14-14, 4.27 in Kansas City) joins them. Closer Troy Percival (42 saves, 3.65) heads a solid bullpen (3.91 ERA).

2. TEXAS RANGERS: Manager Johnny Oates of Texas enjoys filling out the lineup card. This year's list contains some very big names.







WIN AT BRIDGE

The king didn't live in vain

We've all heard "The king is dead; long live the king." Well, that is a big hint on how to play today's four-spade contract. What would you do after a trump attack by West?

There seem to be 10 easy tricks via five spades, one heart, three clubs and a heart ruff in the dummy. However, if you just draw trumps and give up a heart trick, here East will win the trick and push the diamond 10 through your king. You will lose one heart and three diamonds for one down. The diamond king will have lived and died in vain.

You must fight to keep East off the lead. After extracting the trumps, you should overtake the club king with


dummy's ace. Then continue with the club jack. If East covers, ruff, play a spade to dummy's jack, and discard two diamonds on the 10-nine of clubs. Here, though, East cannot cover. So, pitch a diamond. West may switch to a heart, but you win, go into dummy with a trump, and jettison two more diamonds on the established clubs. In both cases, you concede a heart trick. both cases, you concede a heart trick before taking your heart ruff for the 10th trick. You lose only one heart, one diamond and one club.

Safety issues with microwaves

DEAR DR. GOTT: Are microwave ovens detrimental to health? DEAR READER: In certain situa-

tions, they can be.

The U.S. Government has set safety standards for microwave appliances. These standards define acceptable limits for microwave "leakage" from ovens at the time they are new and after five years of use. The release of microwave radiation (which is not release to Y saw) is the release to Y saw is the release related to X-rays) is theoretically pre-vented by special seals and safety interlocks on the doors, as well as metal screens on the door windows.

Ordinarily, microwave ovens pose no health hazards when they are new and consumers follow the manufacturer's directions about proper use. Problems may develop as the units age — and after servicing by technicians who may not be adequately trained. Dangerous leakage can occur in those situations. The results may be harmful. Microwave radiation can cause potentially life-threatening interruptions in the electrical process of cardiac pacemakers; it has caused burns from dermal medicine patches containing metallic elements; it has been recorted to cause catagories. been reported to cause cataracts.

Interestingly, Russia has set safety standards for industral exposure that are 100 times more stringent than the U.S. limits, because of studies showing that microwave radiation can adversely affect virtually every organ in the body.

With respect to private residential use, there is a practical concern. Because of the way microwaves heat, infant formula will be considerably hotter than its container when microwaved. There have been reports that babies have suffered burned mouths from over-heated formula. More important, when heated in a closed container (such as a bottle), water heats faster than the fat and protein in the formula, can turn to steam, and has exploded in some

instances, severely burning infants.

So, have your microwave oven checked periodically by a licensed professional and — if you are heating infant formula in the appliance — do what centuries of mothers have done: test the liquid on your wrist before administering it to a child.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Can a woman strengthen her vaginal muscles with exercises?

DEAR READER: Yes. Known by a variety of names, these exercises can be taught by an obstetrician, a nurse mid-wife, an obstetrical nurse or a physical therapist. Such exercises are often useful in toning up the pelvic floor and may help to improve certain types of incontinence.
