## EXECUTION OF KILLER STAYED BY HIGH COURT

LONDON, Feb. 8.—King George today opened parliament with a speech in which he announced it was necessary to dispatch armed forces to the far east to protect British residents in China, as a result of the recent rioting at Hankow and the anti-British agitation throughout China.

The king said it was the duty of the British government and people to place their future relations with China on a basis of friendship and good will. He declared for a policy of non-interference in the internal affairs of China.

The contentious civil war in China and the anti-foreign, and particularly the anti-British, atmosphere with which it has been accompanied by the execution of Charles Brown, who was to have been electrocuted at the state prison farm at Raiford this afternoon.

The writ was issued by the high court after Governor John W. Martin entered the prison officials to proceed with Brown's electrocution in the face of a writ of habeas corpus issued by Judge A. Z. Adkins of the Hillsborough county circuit court.

Walker appeared before the supreme court today very indignant at the governor's action in the case and declared that the state chief executive was ignoring the higher writ in the United States and that he was guilty of contempt of court.

"The writ of habeas corpus can only be suspended in cases of insurrection and I mean to file charges of contempt of court against Governor Martin," Walker stated.

"A writ of habeas corpus takes all matters out of the hands of the executive department and places the case in the hands of the court issuing the writ," he said. Walker last night appealed to the federal court at Jacksonville for a writ of habeas corpus but the court ruled it had no jurisdiction in the case, he said.

The Supreme Court granted the writ of habeas corpus on the ground that Brown was convicted in October of 1923 and that the penalty at the time was execution by hanging while he was sentenced to be electrocuted.

RAIFORD, Fla., Feb. 8.—(INS)—With all preparations completed to carry out the electrocution of the substitute and the International News Service poll indicated their prophecy was correct, it has been intimated, however, that President Coolidge will veto the bill when it reaches him.

The poll showed fifty senators favoring the McNary-Haugen bill, including 25 Republicans, 23 Democrats and one farmer-laborite. This number would insure passage of the bill under any circumstance. The opposition included 32 certain votes while eight senators were classed as "doubtful" and five were absent.

to marry a man who is a gambler. I want you to stand up. What would you think of the pastor of your church engaging in this gambling business?

Hillsborough county has driven the race track gamblers out of their midst. What's the matter with Seminole County? Here I hold in my hand a telegram from County Solicitor Chancy of Hillsboro:—"Instructed sheriff to arrest all officials on criminal charges and seize money wagered each day races were run and when the operators of course learn of these instructions they closed their tracks."

"I say, what's the matter with Seminole county? This deplorable business can't continue in this county unless somebody favors it. Do the citizens of Hillsborough county live under the same state laws which govern the citizens of Seminole County? What's the matter with Seminole County citizens, and Seminole County officers?

Here the pastor asked from a newspaper clipping:

"Racing is great 'sport' for the men behind! If you don't believe it, please make note of the fact that the four pari-mutuel race tracks in Maryland charged the public over \$3,000,000 for the more privilege of betting on these horse courses."

## William K. Vanderbilt Denies That He Will Seek Divorce in Paris Courts

HAVRE, France, Feb. 7.—"This divorce thing is an old chestnut. It started 15 years ago and I am tired of denying it," said William K. Vanderbilt, who disembarked from the S. S. France today, and was told of recent rumors in New York that he had come to France to secure a divorce, in order that he might marry Mrs. Rosamond Lancaster Warburton.

"My wife and I are not living together and haven't been for some time, but we are good friends," said Vanderbilt.

The story about an application having been made to the Royal Tribunal for annulment of our

marriage was untrue.

"I am not going to Paris to get a divorce. I am on my way to the south of France to see my mother, boarding my yacht within four days."

One New York paper had reported that Mrs. Vanderbilt was also a passenger on the France, but she succeeded in completely hiding her identity, for her name did not appear on the passenger list and none of the passengers had seen her during the voyage.

Vanderbilt landed alone and managed to Paris. Prior to his landing he attempted to avoid detection by asking the purser to inform reporters that he had landed at Plymouth.
