The outstanding man in the Roosevelt administration and the Truman cabinet has resigned. Secretary of State Byrnes, who might have been nominated for vice president in 1944 had been able to "clear" with Sidney Hillman and who might be nominated for President in 1948 if he were not so old, out not because he lacks public support but because he needs a rest.

Did you see where over half a billion dollars worth of property was destroyed by fires during the single year of 1945. The greatest death toll in the history of the country is expected to be revealed when the final count for the year is made when something like 27 persons perished every day of the year in fires throughout the country.

Who was the nation's No. 1 salary earner in 1944? Was it one of the generals or admirals who directed the great battles of the war? For a former New Dealer, a former chief of the NRA, a former leading labor attorney, the present words of Donald Riebel are significant. "Compulsory, punitive and drastic labor legislation is needed to curb irresponsible unions," he says, adding that these unions might even throw the United States into a civil war for the preservation of our free economy and our institutions of self-government.

One reason for the current country's shortage, according to Henry C. Round, is the fact that there has increased not only in this country but also in many other countries of the world. In Russia, Pearson says, the number who can read has jumped from about 25 percent of the population to about 75 percent. In South America the increase has been almost as great.

Marshall's Appointment

The appointment of General Marshall to succeed James F. Byrnes as Secretary of State is being hailed with unusual enthusiasm on all sides.

In his dealings with the foreign members of the Allied General Staff, Marshall is reported to have shown all the skill, tact, and firmness of the most astute diplomat.

Now that he has been thrown into politics, this unanimity of opinion may be altered somewhat, and whatever his course may be in the State Department he can count on incurring some opposition from the ranks of which will arise those who will call him names.

For, it cannot be assumed that in naming Marshall as Secretary of State President Truman was entirely innocent of the political implications of this move.

That Marshall is willing to run may be assumed from his acceptance of the number one cabinet position. Most Army men prefer to remain aloof from politics, and up to the present time General Marshall has not differed with this rule.

Angelo Patri, writing with his usual inspired common sense about children, advises parents not to worry if the adolescent states a desire for some impractical, out-of-the-ordinary occupation.

It may be added that only by working hard at several occupations, thus learning their advantages and drawbacks from his own standpoint, can any young person be sure of finally selecting a line he can successfully follow later.

Davis envisions an organization, supported by individual memberships that would be non-profit and non-political. It might be called "Share Florida's Future."

It is all well enough to simply invite folks to Florida, he says, but to develop the State's limitless resources and bring in permanent residents, you must go further than that and supply a way of a return on their investment.

The small business concern or individual needs the same kind of information but cannot afford to hire experts to make such a survey. If Florida had some independent, non-profit, non-political organization that could gather the same sort of information as to opportunities that exist in each area of the State for the small business man, the farmer or the individual and present it in the form of carefully prepared bulletins, it would meet this need.

existing organization. Davis believes that on the basis of a membership fee of \$5 or \$10 per year, enough Florida visitors could be found throughout the nation to create an organization of at least 100,000 members.

The money derived from such memberships would be used to engage experts to make similar surveys to those made by big industrial concerns. These surveys would show the needs of a given area and the opportunities for new businesses. One, for example, might cover agricultural opportunities, another small business opportunities and so on.

Davis emphasizes the thought that such an organization, if it is to serve the best interests of Florida, must concentrate its activity on the development of the State's untouched resources and not act as an agency for the promotion or sale of existing industries, attractions or enterprises.

It is a swell idea and no one will quarrel with Mr. Davis on that score, but the development of such an organization is a sizable chore, making surveys of the State area by area is a bigger

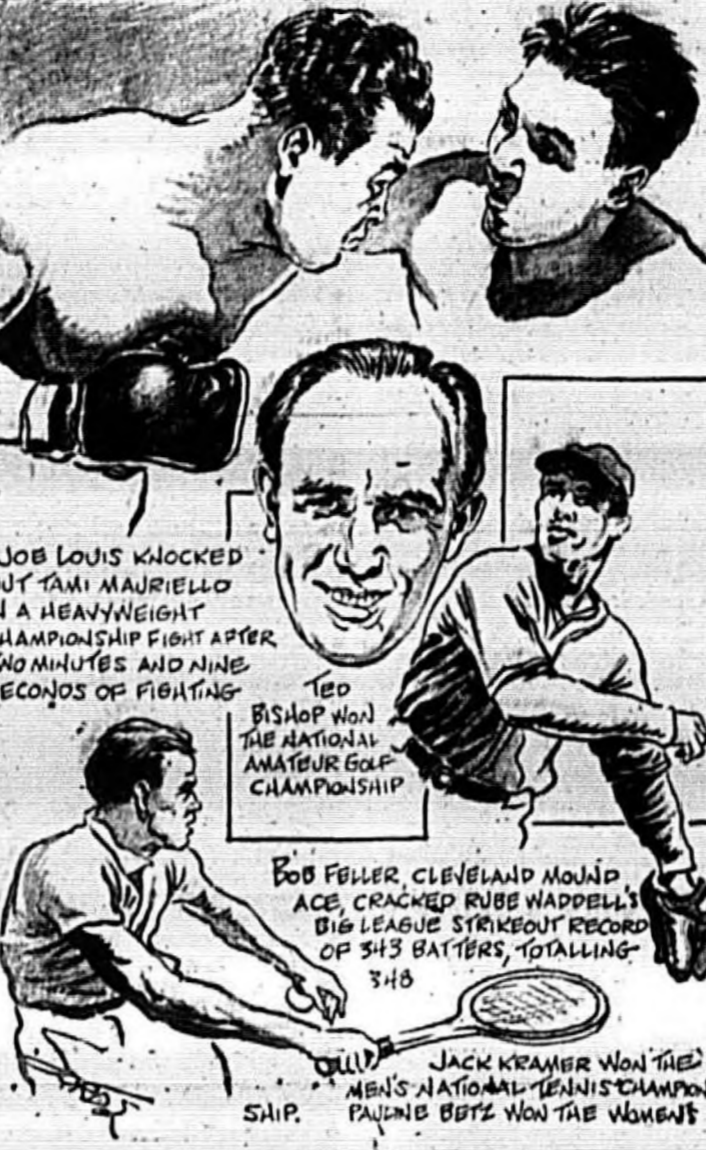

U. of F. Library, Graduate School Growing Rapidly

GAINESVILLE, Jan. 9. (Special)—Growing apace from modest beginnings the Library and the Graduate School of the University of Florida have come forward in the intervening years since its founding to take their places as two of the most rapidly growing components of the University.

From 2,000 books in 1907 the total of approximately 300,000 volumes, while the Graduate School has grown from an enrollment of seven students in 1909 to an enrollment of 255 in 1946.

From the outset, the record of the Library and the Graduate School has been one of mutual cooperation for the Graduate students make the Library their headquarters and on completion of their studies contribute a volume of the books already reposing in the Library.

The Library is housed in a four-story brick building in the northeast section of the campus. The Graduate School has no separate physical plant, but from its annual budget it contributes to the purchase of library books and periodicals and assist in purchasing equipment needed for research in various departments.

Each graduate student is required to complete either a master's thesis or a doctoral dissertation, both of which are based on research in a special field. The original copy of each of these, most of which exceed 150 pages in length, are bound and placed in the Library to form important contributions to language and literature, education, history, economics, science, agriculture, engineering, and many other fields.

Among the more than 700 master's theses and the 49 Ph.D. dissertations are many important pieces of research of value to the state.

Scholarship Loan Fund Of \$1,000 Is Given To U. of F.

GAINESVILLE, Jan. 9. (Special)—A \$1,000 scholarship loan fund has been made available to University of Florida students by the Verne E. Munich Educational Foundation, Dean R. C. Beatty announced today.

Administered by the University Committee on Scholarships and Loans, of which Dean Beatty is chairman, the loan fund provides that applicants who are graduates of an accredited Florida high school and bona fide residents of Florida, and who have completed at least two semesters of college work with an average of not less than "C" may borrow up to \$250 per year.

Applicants for these loans will be required to furnish a satisfactory endorsement to the note which will bear four per cent interest not to accrue until the borrower is graduated or for any other reason leaves the University. A schedule for repayment is provided whereby a borrower is allowed a period of three years after leaving the University to complete payment.

The Munich Foundation became interested in the University of Florida through Jack Thompson, Miami attorney, and former student, Dean Beatty said. The dean of students added that the \$1,000 fund, which the foundation is perhaps the beginning of contributions to this loan fund.
