#### NLRB Power?

The tonnage of publicity and news releases which comes into a newspaper office poses a weighty problem-how to call out the important and find the time to read it. One release we do inspect regularly is that of the National Small Business Association, perhaps because running a newspaper puts us in that small business category. The latest is an eye-opener.

In late April, the organization brought a labor lawyer to Washington to testify before the the Senate Judiciary Committee. The spokesman was a man who has devoted almost 30 years to representing businessmen in labor relations, Robert H. Jones, of Albany, New York. He told the Committee that the National Labor Relations Board is imposing upon small business enormous, unwarranted and unconscionable expense in exercising or defending legitimate employer rights" under the law. NLRB abuses the power, he said, "adverse-

ly affect the employer's opportunity to prepare and present his case. In direct contrast, they discriminatorily indulge unions in extensions of preparatory and presentation time or excuse their violations of filing time periods. . . . They deny the employer effective protection against unfair labor practice which, particularly in the secondary boycott area, has become standard operating procedure in many unions . . . they repeatedly offend the Act's and the Constitution's guarantees of employer free speech. . . . By violating settlement agreements for disposing of alleged unfair practice, Board procedures increasingly force the small businessman into litigation he cannot realistically afford."

he Commission advises sportsmen that proper planning can make the difference between a good day afield or a disappointing, troublesome experience. Here are some suggesions which will help insure proper preparation. 1. Dove hunters should locate promising dove fields ow - wandering simlessly in search of a place to hunt nce the season opens is seldom productive.

2. When hunting on private lands, always get advance ermission before you enter. Share your bag with the land 3. Make sure that each member of the hunting party knows and understands the rules of safe gun handling. 4. Have a physical checkup and condition yourself for he unusual activity involved in most hunting. Each year
