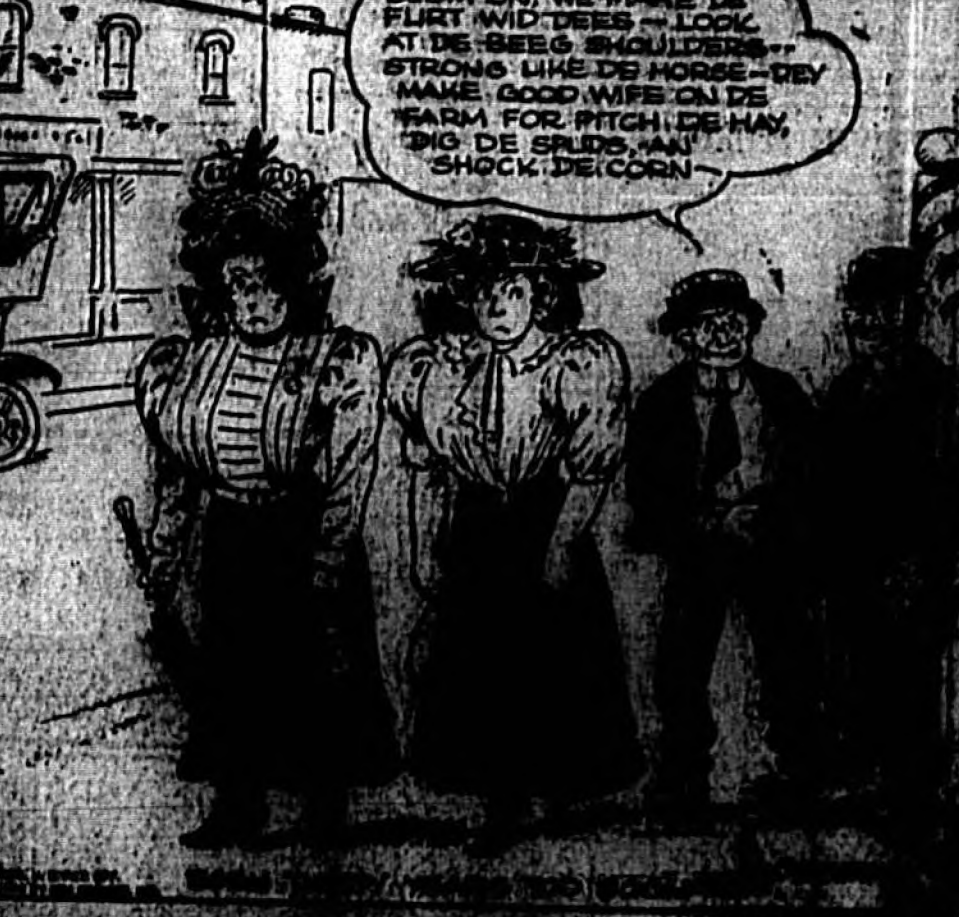
The national Housing Act authorized the FHA property improvement program in 1937. The program has since been expanded to include the repair and reconstruction of homes.

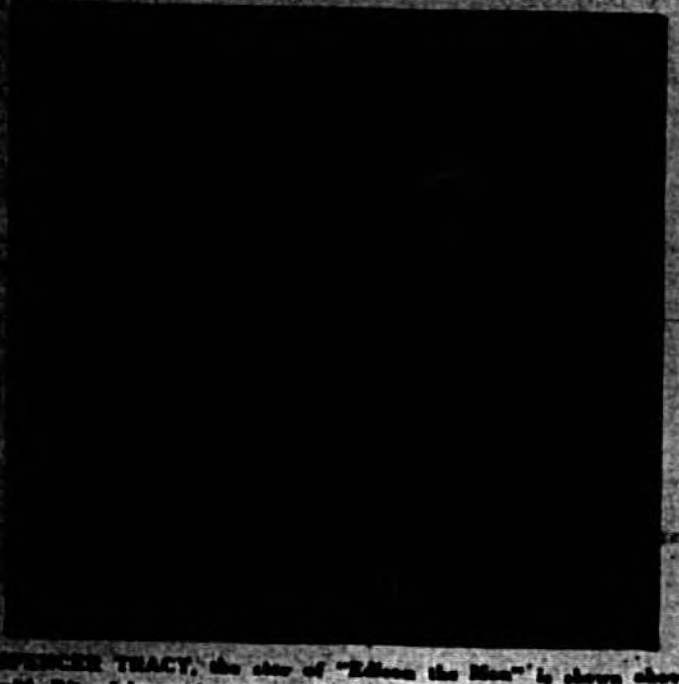

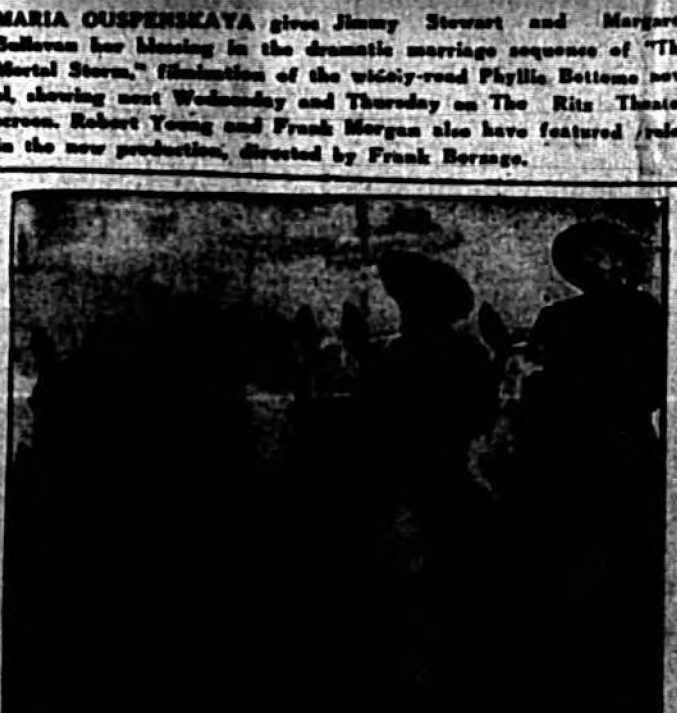
