



Changes Due NEW YORK (AP) - Mayor John V. Lindsay says changes in police operations will be insti-tuted during 1968 that will in crease the number of police on the beat by 40 per cent. Lindsay says the changes would not increase the total number of men on the 29,000man force, but "with the investment of a few thousand civilians, we're going to increase the effective uniformal patrol by 40 to 50 per cent within a year."
