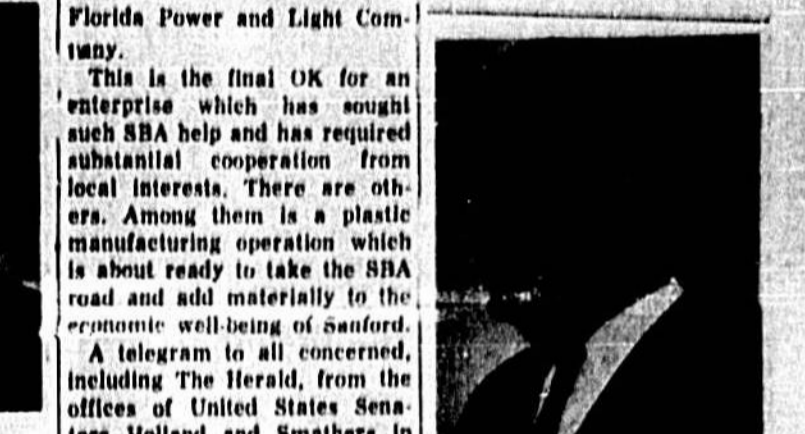


SBA Okays Financing For Sanford Firm

Aid Also Due Plastics Company

A happy sign that 1968 will bring many new industries to Sanford was shown today with the disclosure that the Small Business Administration had approved financing which will allow Miami Brick and Stone of Florida, Inc. to start construction of a plant on West First Street next to the sub-station of the Florida Power and Light Company.

This is the final OK for an enterprise which has sought such SBA help and has required substantial cooperation from local interests. There are others. Among them is a plastic manufacturing operation which is about ready to take the SBA road and add materially to the economic well-being of Sanford. A telegram to all concerned, including The Herald, from the office of United States Senators Holland and Smathers in Washington disclosed the details of the financing which provides a total of \$160,000.

County Must Regulate--PSC

"What does the Seminole County Commission want from us?" Howard Carraway, director of administrative services of the Public Service Commission asked this morning in an interview with The Herald.

"If they want to get regulating of public utilities off their backs and on to ours, they will not be successful," Carraway declared as he reiterated the PSC position that only the County Commission has the power to regulate in Seminole. "Our powers are represented by their local regulations. We can't help them. If they want to change the law, they will have to go to the Legislature. We'll be glad to advise them, but that is as far as we can go," the administrative director reported.

At present time today, the Commission was meeting with Prentis Pruitt, chief counsel for the PSC.

Some 30 utility companies are currently operating in Seminole under no regulatory authority. The County Commission, with the lone exception of Commissioner W. Lawrence Swofford, has declined to take action to implement legislation received in the late 1950's which gave it the power to regulate service and rates of the utilities.

One private utility in particular, Southern Gulf Utilities, recently gave the Board a verbal slap in the face when it refused to pay for a service which the Commission has ordered to be paid for.

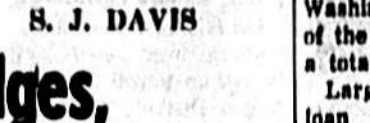
"They've had years to formulate regulations," the Southern Gulf official declared at the time. "Why should we wait any longer for them to act?"

New Proposed Rule On Judges, Prosecutors Is Called Ridiculous

Ethical guidelines published in a recent edition of the Florida Bar Journal which seem to forbid city judges, city attorneys and city prosecutors while taking criminal cases in private law practice have caused much consternation among members of the Seminole County Bar, which has expressed its disapproval by writing a letter to the Bar's ethics committee.

Planners Set Meet On FTU Rezoning Move

The Sanford-Bernard City Commission met tonight to establish a University Residential District on a one-quarter of a mile strip north of Florida Tech in Seminole County.

Some opposition is expected from property owners in the area who wish to keep some of the area for commercial purposes. Officials of the proposed new university requested the planners to restrict the zoning.

Zoning Director Robert Brown reported that only uses permitted in University Residential District are for single family, two-family and multiple family dwellings.

However, there are special exceptions for dormitories, fraternity houses; offices for professional services; schools with public, parochial and private with conventional academic curriculum; churches and kindergartens and nurseries for children.

If the planners approve the zoning change tonight a public hearing will be scheduled before the County Commission next Tuesday.



Gov. Claude Kirk Big News Of '67

MIAMI (AP)—The inauguration of Claude Kirk as the first Republican governor elected in Florida since 1922 and his style thereafter in every phase of his government was the biggest news story of 1967, Florida's voters said.

Using the technique Kirk developed in "renovating a dilapidated" Confederate Black Tower in St. Augustine, he brought new life to Florida in his political, economic and social life.

Kirk flew in his jet from coast to coast on speaking tours with political and social groups. He was frequently in Florida at his headquarters, the former home of the governor's office.

In the weeks of the year, on Jan. 15 at the Breakers in Palm Beach, the Governor married Shirley Bradford, a 28-year-old woman who came from Germany by way of Brazil. Kirk introduced Erickson at the inauguration ball at the Breakers. She was the daughter of a prominent businessman.

Kirk's first move was to appoint a commission on Quality Education which recommended a \$50-million increase in the state tax and move state financial aid to education.

The third story occurred inside the gates of Cape Kennedy. A report on Jan. 21, when Air Force Col. Virgil I. Griffin and Edward R. White II, the first man to land on the moon, were in the area for the U.S. launch.

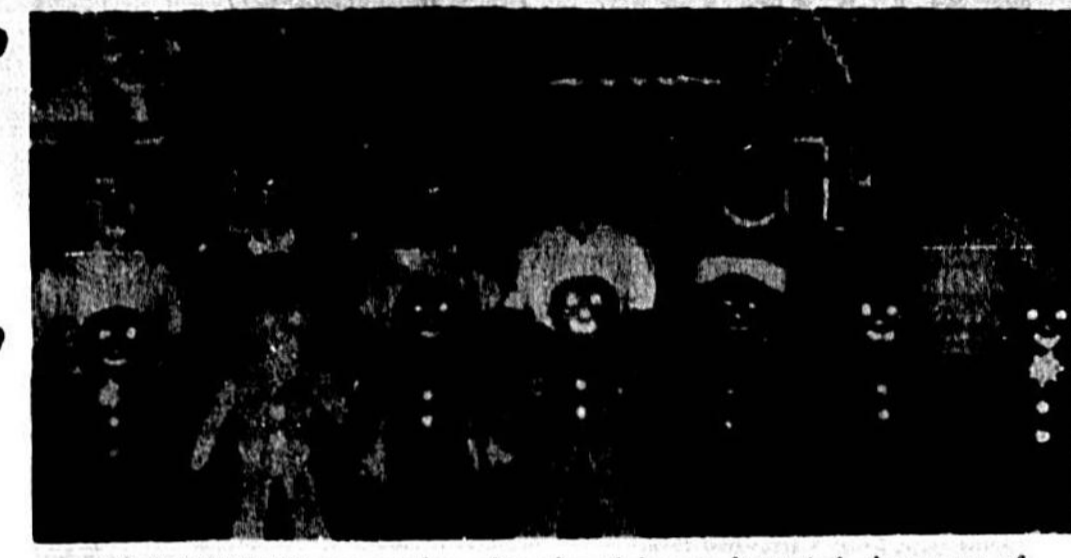

Late White House Chef Planned Chuluota Home

The famous White House baker, Clement Maggia, whose last major duty was to bake the wedding cake for Capt. Charles Robb and Miss Lydia Bird Johnson, planned to reside in Chuluota before he died Dec. 6, just three days before the wedding.

Maggia was executive pastry chef and instructor at the Greenbrier Hotel in Waterbury Springs, W. Va., when he made the five tiers for the six-foot high, 250-pound cake, plus all the decorations and additional cakes to be cut and placed in small heart-shaped boxes of white satin that were given out to each guest at the wedding. While in Washington, D.C., Maggia and his wife, Abby, stayed with one of her sisters in nearby Arlington, Va., where they formerly resided. He drove to the White House each morning in his Cadillac, put on his tall chef's cap, and went to work.

The Maggias were lifelong friends of Mr. and Mrs. Grant Abbott of Lake Drive, Chuluota, as the two couples resided in the Washington, D.C., area together for many years. Abbott died Nov. 2, approximately one month before Maggia's death.

The Maggias were guests of the Abbotts in February. Their intentions were to buy Florida land to lock for a suitable homestead, with landscaping complete, as they could relax here for a few months of the year. After visiting in the Sarasota area, they decided to return to Chuluota and purchase the home of Henry Willard, a most attractive location fronting Lake Catherine and backed by Spring Lake. In addition, it was next door to their dear and close friends, the Abbotts.

The Maggias planned to "snow birds" in Chuluota, spending at least the first three months each year here. In fact, their furniture was moved into the Lake Catherine home just one day before he died of a heart attack after attending a dinner with friends at the hotel.

Carol Jaques Heads Dimes March

The March of Dimes is fighting birth defects because each year there are more than a quarter million American children of baby birthright to enter the world healthy and grow normally.

Mrs. Carol Jaques made this statement Tuesday as she accepted the chairmanship of the 1956 Seminole County March of Dimes campaign.

"I think most of us would consider it alarming if we heard about an epidemic, in which a new case struck every other minute, which was the second greatest destroyer of life, and which caused half of all cases of mental retardation," declared Mrs. Jaques.

"Yet," she pointed out, "birth defects are responsible for all this, and for much more human damage. Many defects are not apparent at birth. They appear later in life, causing physical or mental disability.

"The March of Dimes is making the most important progress in birth defects, but we need increased public support to continue and to expand these programs."

Mrs. Jaques stated the growing number of March of Dimes supported centers where birth defect children receive superior treatment from teams of trained medical professionals. There are now 77 of these centers in operation.

In response, scientists supported by March of Dimes progress have developed ways of detecting several defects of body chemistry that can cause mental retardation and are studying the heredity and environmental factors which affect a baby's development before birth.

"In addition," said Mrs. Jaques, "the March of Dimes is conducting a national educational program to inform every expectant mother of the importance of prenatal care in maintaining health to the newborn child."

Here's an idea: make up a compote of rosy pears with fresh cranberries as a goalong for the meat. The pear and cranberry combination looks elegant and tastes good.

What else for the menu? Spoon bread baked in a big soufflé dish will look puffy, high and impressive. A salad and a particularly luscious dessert can complete the meal.

ROSY PEARS WITH SPICED CRANBERRIES

- 1/2 cup plus 1-3rd cup sugar
- 1/4 cup cider vinegar
- 1 cinnamon stick
- 8 whole cloves
- 2 cups cranberries, rinsed
- Red food coloring
- 6 medium firm-ripe Anjou or Bosk pears

Combine vinegar, onion, garlic, olive oil, salt, pepper, basil and bay leaf in saucepan; bring to boil. Remove from heat; cool to lukewarm. Slice in lamb cubes. Cover and refrigerate 3 to 4 hours, stirring occasionally. Remove lamb from marinade, drain thoroughly on absorbent paper. For each kabob, arrange lamb, tomatoes and mushrooms alternately on skewer. Broil for 10 to 15 minutes, or until lamb is done, basting with white, blend together butter and rosemary. Butter broiled kabob between bun halves, remove skewer and close. Serve hot.

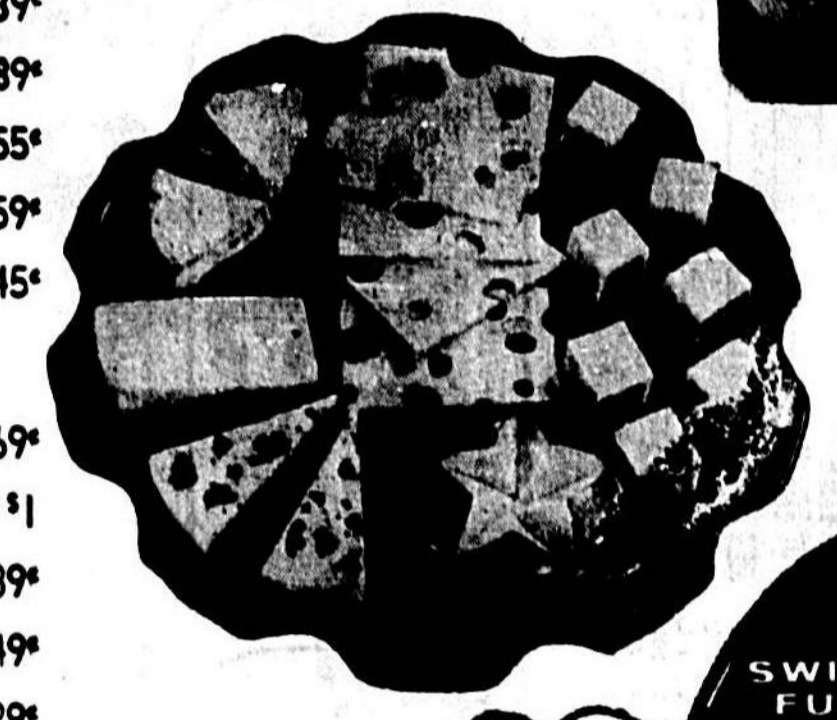

Here's Truth About Lane's Lane Cake

Here's where we set the record straight about the origin of one of the most famous cakes in American culinary history.

We're talking about Lane Cake, that layers deep, stacked with spiced filling and covered with soft white frosting.

Who really did invent Lane Cake and what is the original recipe? Emma Rylander Lane who lived in Clayton, Ala. wrote a cookbook called "A Few Good Things to Eat," published in 1912, which included "Mrs. Lane's 'Lane' cake."

We can attest to this—and to the correctness of the following recipe—because we have seen it in the files of the Lane family. Lane, Emma Lane has made her grandmother's cake at her home and, like it from us, it is worth eating. Just before serving, add the champagne. Mix gently. Makes about 16 champagne-glass servings. Increase amount as needed taking the size of the punch bowl into consideration for each batch made.

Emma Lane tells us that when she was growing up in the South, Lane Cake was served at holiday teas when guests came visiting. (It's a fine custom!) But make the tea worthy of the cake. Rinse the empty teapot with boiling water; use 2 teaspoons of loose tea or one heaping for each serving and pour the boiling water over the tea; brew 3 to 5 minutes—3 minutes if you want the lightest.

EMMA RYLANDER LANE'S LANE CAKE

3 1/2 cups sifted cake flour
2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder
1 1/2 cups sugar
1 cup butter, at room temperature
2 eggs
2 teaspoons vanilla
8 egg whites
1 cup milk
Lane Cake Filling
Boiled White Frosting (from a standard recipe)

On wax paper stir together the flour, baking powder and salt. In a large mixing bowl, cream the butter, sugar and vanilla. Add egg whites, in four additions, beating thoroughly after each addition.

Fold in flour mixture alternately with milk; begin and end with dry ingredients. Batter should be smooth but look slightly granular.

Turn into 4 ungreased 8-inch round layer-cake pans lined on the bottom with wax paper.

Bake in a 375-degree oven, upside of pans and tops spring 1/2 edges slightly from back when gently pressed with finger, or cake tester inserted in center comes out clean—about 20 minutes. Place pans on wire racks to cool for about 5 minutes.

Turn out on wire racks; remove wax paper; turn right side up; cool completely.

Put layers together (on a cake plate) with Lane Cake Filling, stacking carefully; do not spread filling over top. Cover top and sides with swirls of Boiled White Frosting.

Cover with a tent of foil or a cake cover; or cover lightly in a large deep bowl or tin box. Store in a cool place. If refrigerated, allow to stand at room temperature for half a day before serving because cake texture is best when cake is not served chilled.

As the originator of this cake said in her cookbook, "It is much better to be made a day or two before eating."

LANE CAKE FILLING

1 cup milk
1 cup sugar
1/4 cup butter, at room temperature
1 cup medium vanilla, finely chopped
1 1/2 cups hot water or brandy
1 teaspoon vanilla

In a 2-quart saucepan, heat the milk; pour into a bowl; add the egg whites; beat in sugar and butter. Cook over moderate heat, stirring constantly, until quite thick. Remove from heat; stir in vanilla, sugar and vanilla. Cool slightly; use as directed in Lane Cake recipe.

The record of 1888 commemorated at New York City, says Lane's recipe was first published in 1912. It is the only one of its kind that has survived.

Space Agencies To Aid Maine Lobster Supply

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Aided by ideas from space agencies, the State of Maine is laying scientific groundwork to turn the tide on Mother Nature and stem a declining lobster supply.

Experts claim a gradual drop in ocean temperature over the past few years has caused the annual Maine lobster catch to dwindle. They have chosen a first experimental site to see if shrimlike crabs can be reared artificially by discharge from power plant coolant systems.

If successful, other coasts along the northeastern United States coastline may be heated to improve the overall lobster crop.

"We propose to apply in the field information we have gained over the last 20 years," said Robert L. Dow, director of research for the Maine Department of Sea and Shore Fisheries. "We think we have enough background to develop information on how lobsters could be produced in greater number at reduced cost."

Ideally, the average annual temperature for Maine lobsters, Dow said in an interview, is between 47% and 49% degrees. For 1967, however, the average water temperature will be between 44% and 46 degrees, he predicted.

Scientists at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology blame the cooler offshore waters on a change in solar activity, which has shifted solar activity winds to lower latitudes. They claim it may be another 20 years until a warming trend begins.

"The cooler water has not only affected lobsters," Dow said, "but other shellfish—oysters, clams, shrimp and scallops. And it is not only peculiar to Maine. Other Northeastern states and Canada have had similar problems."

Statistics tell the story. In 1967, Maine's lobster catch totaled 24% million pounds. In 1966, it was down to 18 million pounds. Dow predicted the 1967 total will be about 15 million pounds.

The large marine crustacean grow by shedding their shells. But they "molt"—or grow—less when in colder water. As a result, there are fewer lobsters around of legal size. Dow explained.

In an experiment to see if the tide can be turned against Mother Nature and in favor of lobster fishermen, the Maine Department of Sea and Shore Fisheries is considering plans to raise the water temperature in a cove on Casco Island, Casco Bay, by discharging heated water discharged from the coolant system of a nearby power plant.

Heated water from the plant now runs to the surface of the cove, the director noted.
