

Gleason, chairman and chief executive officer of both the bank and its holding company, the Franklin New York Corp., said recently that since March 31 the bank's foreign currency exchange department has sustained losses in trading that could range from \$14 million to \$39 million before any of it is recovered

On Monday the Securities and Exchange Commission suspended trading in Franklin New York's common and preferred stocks at the holding company's request.

The bank's directors voted to oust Paul Luftig as president of aboth branches of the firm and temporarily replace him with Gleason, saying the firing had nothing to do with the losses. They also "accepted with regret" the resignation of Peter Shaddick as a director and vice chairman of the holding com-

Gleason had traced the losses to an employe in the currency exchange department, working for Shaddick, who was "operating beyond his authority and without the bank's knowledge." The unnamed employe has been fired, an official said. The directors said Shaddick was resigning because he

responsible for the currency losses "even though they had been concealed from him by a subordinate." The directors voted to omit upcoming common and preferred stock dividends and to proceed with two stock subscription offerings aimed at raising \$50 million in capital.


