AMERICA'S DAILY WASTE OF OIL IS MILLION BARRELS

A drastic curtailment program, perhaps with the assistance of congressional and state legislation, the nation faces a loss in natural resources which may approach a national disaster, Work declared. "During the past three years new fields have been developed, new discoveries made, and the entire petroleum situation must be viewed in a new light," said work. "At present overproduction is approximately a million barrels a day. If this immense surplus were permitted to remain in the earth, our future needs would be reassured, our national life more surely safeguarded."

American Crops Showing Considerable Improvement Over The Preceding Year

BOSTON, Mass., Aug. 29.—Practically all of the nation's crops, with the exception of corn and apples, are showing a decided improvement over last season, according to reports made public by the New England crop reporting service based on statistics furnished by the United States Department of Agriculture. Favorable crop reports have been received in most cases from various sections of the country. Probably one of the greatest sufferers this year throughout the United States is the apple crop. This applies especially to New England where the apple crop is reported for last month is the smallest commercial apple crop for New England since the poor crop of 1923.

Corn A Sufferer

Another heavy sufferer this season is the corn crop. Corn in the United States, according to a report issued recently, had an indicated production of 2,385,226,000 bushels, which would be the smallest crop but one (1924) in twenty-six years. During the past month, however, improvement in the corn crop was general in certain sections of the country. Conditions are very poor in Ohio, Indiana and Illinois but somewhat better in other important states.

Potato Prospects for the United States Have Improved in All Sections of the Country and in All Important Late States.

The outlook at the time of the last report is for a crop of 410,714,000 bushels compared with 356,123,000 bushels last year and 394,135,000 bushels the past five year average. The condition of hay and pastures continued to improve throughout the country. Frequent rains have delayed haying in most sections and have damaged the quality of the hay somewhat. Oil Stocks Decline

Reliable statistics indicate that oil company stocks sold on the New York stock exchange have declined in value \$500,000,000 since the peak of 1926, and some experts place the loss of the entire industry at nearly a billion dollars as a result of overproduction, he said. These losses, Work pointed out, have been sustained by 1,500,000 stockholders, bondholders and owners of royalties on oil production. Audition Will Be Staged Here Soon In Connection With Nation-Wide Contest

Plans for a local audition to be held in connection with a national radio audition to be conducted in December by the Atwater Kent Foundation of New York, are to be discussed at a meeting at 9:30 o'clock Wednesday morning at the Woman's Club where the several committees will gather to hear details of the contest. The general purpose of the audition is to provide a means of discovering, encouraging and developing unknown young women and men singers of exceptional talent and permitting them to sing over radio. The local audition will be part of an elimination contest that will be nationwide. Under present plans a local audition will be staged at an early date at which time two winners, one woman and one man, will be chosen by popular ballot. The winners will compete with the victors of similar contests conducted in other Florida counties. In the state audition to be held at Jacksonville two winners will be designated and these will take part in a district audition to be staged in Atlanta in November. The winners in the five districts, into which the U. S. has been divided, will take part in the national audition in New York. All 10 entrants in the national audition will receive some award, the prizes to be as follows: Two winners of first place, \$5,000 in cash and two years tuition in a leading conservatory; winners of second prize will receive \$2,000 in cash and one year's tuition; winners of third prize will receive \$1,000 and one year's tuition; winners of fourth place will receive \$500 and winners of fifth prize will get \$250. In addition winners of state auditions will receive silver medals and winners of district contests will be given gold medals. Atwater Kent Foundation will pay all expenses of the contestants in the district and national auditions.
